Our School Improvement Plan during the 2016-17 school year was ! focused on growth for every student in ELA (English Language Arts) ! and math. We set goals based on individual reading levels as well as ! state testing performance growth. The strategies and actions we ! took to support growth for our students at East Ridge included: !

- All teachers focused on giving students ample opportunity to read books independently at their appropriate level.
- Teachers used individual running record data and other reading assessment data to set goals for individual students and monitor progress.
- Teachers conducted regular individual reading conferences with students to support individual growth.

- Our LAP (Learning Assistance Program) paraeducator provided supplemental reading instruction to students with the greatest need of support.
- Teachers participated in professional development in the following topics: differentiating math instruction, math problem solving instructional strategies, small group instruction, and individual conferring for reading and writing.
