Northshore School District administers Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) in English/Language Arts (ELA) and math in grades 3-8, SBA ELA in grade 10 and SBA Math in grade 11; Measurements of Student Progress (MSP) in Science for grades 5 and 8; End-of-Course (EOC) in math for grades 9 and 10; and EOC in Biology in grade 10 to students annually in compliance with state and federal laws.

School Improvement Plan

- Our School Improvement Plan aligned with the Northshore School Board goals of increasing the percentage of students reading at standard by the end of grade three and the number of students meeting standard in math by the end of grade five. We began with a comprehensive assessment program that included an Individual Reading Record (IRR) of each student, math probes throughout the year, standardized state assessments, and an on-going analysis of students' work to inform instruction and to address students' needs.
- In mathematics, we continued to focus on teaching the Math Expressions program at grades K-5. We developed job embedded opportunities for comparing formative assessment strategies. This work led to differentiated planning to meet needs of diverse learners. Services and activities for highly capable students were developed to provide an appropriate challenge for all learners. We supported instruction with intervention and extension strategies.





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School Improvement Plan cont.

- In literacy, we shared data frequently within professional learning community teams. Grade band conversations were focused on instruction within a balanced literacy program using Words Their Way, Benchmark Literacy and Benchmark Writing. We targeted shared reading with whole group instruction and supported student needs with small group instruction.
- As a staff, we set goals to grow professionally and to improve teaching and learning through the development of a robust professional learning community. Teachers sought opportunities to collaborate together to expand their knowledge of literacy, mathematics, science and the Common Core State Standards.
- As a school we continue to grow our PBIS and Equity practices for sustaining a positive culture throughout the school and community. In addition, student leadership activities support improved relationships and authentic student led projects that benefit our entire school.

Facilities

Lockwood opened its doors to students in November 1962. Our school grounds connect with Kenmore Junior High School fields. We have had many facility improvements including new energy efficient windows, blinds and up grades to the heating and ventilation systems. The technology levy supported sound speakers installed in every classroom. Facility use includes community baseball, soccer and basketball teams, district track and field and cross country meets, chess club, Math Olympiad competitions, Boeing science club, after-school drama club, before-school district orchestra programs and many other events.



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About Northshore:

Northshore is the 10th largest school district in Washington with more than 20,000 students in 20 elementary schools, six junior high schools, four comprehensive high schools, an alternative high school, a preschool program and an independent contract program grades 1-12. The district encompasses over 60 square miles and includes the cities of Bothell, Kenmore and Woodinville as well as part of unincorporated King County.
