A MESSAGE From the President

Dear Alumni and Friends of Central Catholic,

In September, I was fortunate to venture up to Camp Marist in Ossipee, NH. There, I joined Br. Jim Halliday, FMS, a group of faculty and an excited cadre of upperclass students whose job it was to welcome the Central Catholic Class of 2022. The activities of this special day, which is a long-standing tradition at Central, are designed to build community and welcome freshman to the Central Family. For me, the day is emblematic of what I love about our School. It blends the foundations of Marist spirituality and the principles upon which Central was founded, 83 years ago by Brother Florentius, with a recognition of the transformative power of a Central Catholic education today.

The Class of 2022 comes from 62 different towns throughout Massachusetts, New Hampshire and Maine. MAKING HISTORY

The Hallmark of the Class of 2018.

Celebratory group of 2018 Classmates at the Baccalaureate Mass, St. Mary Church, May 22, 2018

These 320 young men and women

hailed from 61 different cities and towns, as well the nations of Korea and China. The class earned more athletic achievements and championships than any class in recent memory, raised more dollars through the annual Walk-a-thon student fundraiser, are now attending over 124 different colleges and universities in 26 states and were awarded and accepted over \$34 million in scholarships alone for their four years of college studies.

99% of the Class of 2018 went on to higher education with 94.5% matriculating to four-year colleges and universities, including Tufts University, Holy Cross, Reed College, Rensselaer, Boston College, Brown, Vanderbilt, Georgetown, University of Notre Dame, Cornell University, Carnegie-Mellon, Dartmouth, Case Western University and many, many more. These achievements and more do not happen without hours upon hours of dedicated effort year-in and year-out.

Academically, the Class of 2018 was fearless in challenging themselves in rigorous curricula. 63% of the members of the Class of 2018 were engaged in the College' Board's Advanced Placement subjects offered at CCHS. 78% of the 2018 class outdistanced both Massachusetts and US National scores on the AP Exams by over 10-17 percentage points. 84 members of the Class of 2018 were named AP Scholars for outstanding performance on three or more AP Exams, and the excellence of eight 2018 grads earned them recognition as "National AP Scholars" for top performances on eight or more AP Exams. On the fields of play, the leadership and talents of student-athletes in the Class of 2018 led the Raiders to an outstanding year with MVC Championships in Girls Cross Country, Varsity Football, MVC Golf Tournament, Boys Varsity Soccer, Girls Varsity Basketball, Boys Ice Hockey, Boys Indoor Track, Wrestling and Varsity Baseball.

In Fall 2017 the energies and talents of the Class of 2018 graced the Allan B. Rogers Theatre with the original production of "Superstar," written by CCHS faculty member, Sharman Merrill '89SM. The Spring of 2018, saw seniors earn top-billing in the sold-out musical comedy of "Sister Act." The CCHS Bands, Choir, and A Capella Singers performed seasonal concerts, while art students, writers, photographers and poets converged their talents in the Visions literary magazine, open-mike nights and coffeehouses.


Serving the needs of others held a special chamber in the hearts of the Class of 2018. The Class of 2018 put months of preparation into the Catwalk4Cancer Fashion Show, Project Rebuild-Habitat For Humanity in Newburgh, NY, the Christmas Project, Missions Collections and gave over 12,000 hours of community service to over 100 local organizations "serving the least favored."

The Class of 2018 celebrated their Baccalaureate Mass on May 22, 2018 at St. Mary Church, Lawrence and "capped" off their CCHS student years at the 80th Commencement on May 24. Members of the Class of 1968, celebrating their 50th Golden Anniversary, led the commencement procession into the CCHS Memorial Gymnasium in front of nearly 2,800 family and friends.

DOING IT UNIQUELY HER WAY

"Everyone at Central Catholic wants you to succeed, so if you put in the effort to get good grades, make friends, pay close attention in class, and when confused get extra help from teachers, and get involved in school life – you will definitely succeed beyond what you ever thought possible. That was certainly the case for me."

Catherine was named the Valedictorian for the Class of 2018 – the same honor her sister, Margaret earned in the Class of 2016 - a CCHS first for siblings. Entering Central Catholic, my mantra was *"don't compare yourself to your sister"*. Instead of recreating her sister's CCHS path, Catherine set her own course to success.

"I took Honors and AP courses in the Social Sciences and Physical Sciences that I genuinely enjoyed and worked hard in them; there was so much to choose from in every area of study." Consistently a Distinguished Honors student, Catherine earned a variety of Gold and Silver medals in curricular fields, membership in National Honor Society and was named an AP Scholar with Distinction by the College Board. By the end of senior year, she accomplished that which she was most sure she would not seek or attain – earning the honor of Valedictorian of the Class of 2018.

Catherine's passions caused her to blaze her own path as an actor in the CCHS Theatre Guild for four years, as a leader in spiritual retreats, Freshman Orientation, the Catwalk4Cancer Fashion Show, Student Ambassadors and Student Alumni Association, and the list goes on. "No matter how hard anyone tries, no one can be absolutely perfect at everything. I think accepting your failures and moving on is a great asset for achieving success. I always tried to not let my shortcomings discourage me but kept moving forward and remain determined."

Joe put forth tremendous effort while at CCHS which is reflected in his honor as Salutatorian of the Class of 2018. He earned academic awards in seven different subjects, in addition to being named a National Merit Commended Scholar, a National AP Scholar and achieving a perfect score on the ACT. Beyond academics, Joe challenged himself to take part in a myriad of activities including, but certainly not limited to: National Honor Society, Student Alumni Association, Student Ambassadors, Bowling Club, and Indoor and Outdoor Track.

"I recommend putting yourself in situations outside of your comfort zone. In my case, I took AP courses in English and Social Sciences - two subjects that are far outside my math and science comfort zone, and joined the track team even though I don't consider myself particularly athletic. Each was totally worth the effort and the risk."

Joe's determination to succeed will serve him well as he works toward his dream of creating "the next big thing" as an innovator in a technology field that contributes something important, meaningful and helpful to people and to the world. "I will always appreciate any new experience and remain committed to try my hardest in whatever I do." *

RELISHING THE CHALLENGE

"Thinking about my future goals has always been my best and most powerful motivator. I keep my goals at the forefront of my mind. I tried to put my head, first and foremost, into academics and work to be the best student I could be. That was the hard work for me. Sports for me was where the fun was."

Bret made it a top priority to succeed in the classroom. "Starting at CCHS, I had doubts about myself academically, but I had set a goal to earn Honor Roll every term and that helped my classroom focus stay sharp." Achieving Honor Roll grades in each term at CCHS is a real challenge for a year-round three-sport athlete, but Bret succeeded in doing so in the majority of academic terms.

Bret shined brightly as a student-athlete while at Central. In football, he was named MVC All Conference as quarterback for three years; MVP of the Merrimack Valley Conference in football as a senior; and honored as a Boston Globe and Boston Herald All Scholastic quarterback for three years. Bret's football career at CCHS led him to be named to the Massachusetts "Super 26 Team". Additionally, Bret captained the Raiders in basketball and earned MVC All Conference honors both as a junior and senior. In the spring Outdoor Track season, once again he earned MVC All Conference recognition as a junior and served as the track team's captain as a senior. Bret's combined athletic and academic career at CCHS led him to be presented with the Michael Garvey Award at commencement as the outstanding student-athlete in the Class of 2018.

Now at UNH, Bret maintains the goal of performing to the best of his ability in the classroom and on the field, always keeping the lessons learned from his teachers and coaches at heart. *"The three 'secrets to success' in education and in life are: do the right thing all the time, work hard at your education and be good to others."* *****

In addition to a full academic schedule at CCHS, Chris was also a member and senior captain of the Boys' Swim & Dive team, where he was named MVC All Star and All Conference for his talents and performances. He used those same interests to give back to his community through "Sunday Swim" – a program where he volunteered weekly with younger *"swim buddies"* with special needs, teaching them water skills and safety. Diversely talented, Chris, as lead trumpet, was the President of the CCHS Concert and Jazz Bands, member of the Liturgical Band, the Theatre Guild Pit Band and found time to earn a black belt in the martial arts.

"I highly recommend CCHS students to develop good relationships with your teachers, find responsible friends in your classes, a good support network of peers and teachers, while getting involved with things you're passionate about. Your dreams and ambitions will all come together if you do, as mine are." *

BEING IN BALANCE

"Central made it easy for me to achieve a lot of my goals because it is such a supportive environment filled with encouraging faculty who readily share, not only their knowledge, but also their wisdom."

As a student, athlete and community service volunteer, Connor was totally involved in so many aspects of Central Catholic life. While earning Honor Roll grades in a rigorous academic college prep curriculum, which included AP and Honors courses over the years, Connor was a four-year student-athlete committed to varsity Lacrosse, Raider Football team, running Outdoor Track and captaining the Raider Wrestling team.

"One of my greatest challenges at CCHS was balancing my academic life and sports. Sometimes I found myself hyper-focusing on academics while deeply involved in a game, and sometimes thinking about sports when I should have been more present in the classroom. It took me some time and wise advice from faculty and coaches for me to find the perfect balance. But I did! Finding that perfect balance between academics, activities and service is the secret to success at CCHS."

Aside from athletics, Connor dedicated himself to serving CCHS and the larger community as a Student Ambassador, Project Rebuild with Habitat for Humanity, the Marist Mentors program, Campus Ministry activities, and as a faithful volunteer at Cor Unum Meal Center, Lawrence, MA.

To this day in an illustrious 35-year U.S. Naval career that has taken him to over 100 countries and entailed serving in command of destroyers and aircraft carrier strike groups, **Vice Admiral Michael Gilday '80** clearly asserts the foremost ingredient in the completion of a successful mission: "No one sits on the bench, each member of the 'team' has a role to play in guaranteeing a successful mission or goal. An effective leader must appreciate, value and teach this tenet."

The Ballast Years

Working class Lowell, MA parents, Gerald and Frances Gilday desired the best education possible for their five children. Looking for strong academics, a values-laden culture and a strong reputation with colleges, they chose CCHS for their boys, **Michael '80, Mark '82, David '83** and **Brian '87**. Their sister, Mary Joy, attended Academy of Notre Dame, Tyngsboro, MA - before CCHS became co-educational.

Tracing the roots of his personal and professional philosophy, leadership and success, Vice Admiral Michael Gilday points to strong influences implanted in his years at Central Catholic High School. Michael attributes his leadership acumen largely to the late **Peter O'Sullivan '67**, his math teacher and cross country track coach, for whom Michael ran for five seasons. "Coach was easy to relate to. He had a practicality about working with kids. Coach O. was genuine about 'Do your best for yourself and the team'. He got the best out of all of us by his example and his words. He became a role model for me. He made me the runner I never saw myself to be. I cherish the personal lessons and values I learned from running for Coach O."


Additionally, Michael speaks sincerely of owing gratitude to CCHS English teachers, *Warren Hayes '54* and *Br. Ernest Beland, FMS* for giving him the foundation and skill to articulate ideas in written expression so valuable to him in his leadership career, and to **David DeFillippo '66**, his guidance counselor, for encouraging him to follow his heart and persist in his goal of attending the U.S. Naval Academy.

"The Ethics and Morality class in my junior year at CCHS strengthened my faith, enabling me to handle challenging issues at Annapolis and in my command responsibilities. Central's overarching message has stayed with me - that we are called to serve a purpose greater than ourselves. This energizes my passion every day." Michael's character and practicality earned him the respect of his superior officers almost immediately as evidenced by being named to the Academy's Honor Board all four years, at Annapolis.

Leading & Serving at Sea

Graduating with his commission from the Naval Academy in 1985, Michael began an eight-year career at sea. In his service at sea, Michael served on cruisers, destroyers and aircraft carriers with deployments in the Mediterranean and Arabian Seas and in the Western and South Pacific. Prior to his elevation to a ship's command, his sea tours as an officer included deployments in 1991 on the USS Chandler during the Iran-Iraq War; the USS Princeton during Operation Desert Storm & Desert Shield in 1992, and also in 1998 on the USS Gettysburg during Operation Desert Fox.

Michael's exemplary service led him to be promoted to command of the destroyer, USS Higgins, during the 2003 combat operations of Iraqi Freedom, the 2nd Gulf War, and later commanded the USS Benfold. Michael's successful commands once again merited promotion. In 2013-14 as Commander of Destroyer Squadron 7, Michael was Sea Combat Commander for the Ronald Reagan Carrier Strike Group. In 2015, Michael assumed command of Carrier Strike Group 8, his aircraft carrier flagship, the USS Dwight D. Eisenhower.

Leading & Serving on Shore

Michael's naval and leadership acumen garnered him subsequent shore assignments which included earning a Master's Degree from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University, appointment to the Bureau of Naval Personnel, later to the Executive Staff of Chief of Naval Operations and eventually as Executive Assistant to the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

His notable expertise in naval operations and governmental policy made him a natural for advisory positions at the highest level of the U.S. government. His joint Navy and government assignments include serving the White House as Naval Aide to Presidents Clinton and George W. Bush from 1998-2003. Gilday traveled with the Presidents day and night on Air Force One and Marine One with the responsibility of securely carrying the thermonuclear launch codes known as "nuclear football." After his service in the 2nd Gulf War, Michael served as Director of Operations at NATO's Joint Force Command in Lisbon, Portugal and as Chief of Staff for Naval Striking and Support Forces NATO.

Commanding the Newest Fleet

In 2016, he was promoted to Vice Admiral (three stars) in command of the U.S. Fleet Cyber Command/U.S. 10th Fleet located at Fort Meade, MD. Its joint mission with the National Security Administration (NSA) is to collect signals and intelligence in cyberspace in order to protect ships in foreign environments, manage the Navy's global telecommunications, defend the Navy's networks from interference, and when authorized by the President, to take deterrent or retaliatory offensive actions in cyberspace. Vice Admiral Gilday was called to testify before Congress on the nation's cyber security and the activities of the Navy's Cyber Command.

Echoing his Central Catholic experiences, Michael humbly states, "The sailors, men and women, now serving under my command are young, bright, creative and extremely innovative. They have taught me a great deal about how to defend our nation's networks. My role, learned all those years ago from **Coach O'Sullivan**, is to get the best from each one of them for the benefit of the team, the Navy and the nation."

Through Michael's distinguished service over the years, he has earned various personal, unit and command awards including three Defense Superior Service Medals, three Legion of Merit Medals, the Bronze Star, and Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal with Combat "V" and the Combat Action Ribbon. Vice Admiral Gilday now serves as the Director of Operations for the Joint Chief of Staff.

Michael and his wife, Linda, are blessed with two high school age sons who run track. They make their home outside Washington, DC. 🖨

CHASING THE CLOUDS Chasing The Dream

For U.S. Air Force 2nd Lieutenant **Colleen Slein**, **CCHS Class of 2013**, June 29, 2018 marked a very big step on a challenging and intrepid path. Air Force Lt. Slein, age 23, Salem, NH, a 2017 United States Air Force Academy graduate, stepped onto the flight-line at Sheppard Air Force Base in Wichita Falls, TX, to start training as a U.S. Air Force pilot. Fewer than 5% of Air Force pilots are women. This reality has not deterred Colleen's dream – a dream which she had firmly set for herself since her earliest years at Central Catholic.

Ground School

Unbeknownst to her, this Air Force officer-to-be, once at Central Catholic had begun training physically, intellectually and motivationally for leadership and daunting challenges. Colleen, daughter of Bob and Debra Slein of Salem NH, witnessed the CCHS success of her two older brothers, **Brendan '08** and **Connor '10**, and set out to emulate their example of academic and extracurricular dedication. Always highly conscientious in her studies, including completing 13 Honors and AP level courses, Colleen, term after term, achieved grades which earned her place on the Distinguished and High Honor Roll.

"Everything I learned in my years at Central Catholic has had an impact on who I am and what I'm doing today," asserts Colleen. "**Mr. (Joseph) Welch '90**, in my Honors English 3 class, and as my track coach, made me understand daily that hard work can bring you so far in this world. **Mr. (Robert) Jowett '80** in Honors Anatomy & Physiology class, showed me how to bring focused intensity and detail to my study efforts. In my senior year Calculus class, the depth of the material and the patience taken by my teacher, **Mr. (Jarrod) Brown '00**, helped me understand the concepts and applications despite mathematics not being my strength. Mr. Brown truly saved my calculus career at the Air Force Academy. Over and above all this, being mentored by **Mr.** (Christopher) Sullivan '81 in Central's Campus Ministry activities, helped me to reflect on the personal importance of a strong faith and the time-tested values which lead to a meaningful life."

A four-year member and captain of both the Raider Varsity Girls' Lacrosse team and Girls' Indoor Track teams, Colleen possessed a burning desire, in practice and games, to push herself to perform at her best, and through her competitive spirit, helped to infuse both toughness and unity in teammates.

Leadership was a natural outcome through the example Colleen set by her personal character, integrity and work ethic in areas other than athletics. In each extracurricular activity, leadership found Colleen: National Honor Society officer, Freshman Orientation Coordinator, Retreat and Encounter rector, Peer Leader, Director of Camp Champagnat Leadership Camp and as Editor of the Yearbook. She demonstrated the ideals of a Marist student as a "Servant-Leader" with humility and earned distinction as the 2013 recipient of the **Brother Florentius, FMS Memorial Award**.

Flight Path

Colleen was inspired to consider a military academy program rather than civilian collegiate programs through family friends. Colleen's father, Bob, had a friend who attended the U.S. Air Force Academy, and another family friend had a daughter who was studying at the Air Force Academy. *"When I took the opportunity to visit the Academy and see all that it offered in every way, it sealed the deal for me,"* she happily explained.

To no one's surprise at Central Catholic, nor to her family and friends, Colleen's capabilities, perseverance and character enabled her to adapt and succeed within the rigor and challenges of the daily academic and military demands at the Air Force Academy. An important question was posed to Colleen by her superior officers at the Academy - that question – "What do you want to do in the Air Force?" Colleen would answer, *"I want to be an Air Force pilot."*

As with most everything Colleen has set her sights on, this answer was well-thought out. One of Colleen's commanding officers was a female pilot who became a mentor and role model. Colleen also spoke with a number of pilots which led to this decision. *"I found all the pilots I met and got to know, unlike their movie stereotype, to be the hardest-working officers, very humble about their leadership, quietly confident in completing any mission assigned, knowing they were the best for the job because of their intense training and tireless work ethic. Everything they said felt so right and true inside me."*

Cleared for Take-Off

Air Force 2nd Lieutenant Colleen Slein can be found training in the classrooms and on the flight-line at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas. The first phase of training included 5 weeks of intensive academic study, 12 hours a day, studying aerospace physiology, aircraft systems, aerodynamics, flying fundamentals, instrumentation and weather, followed by hours in flight simulators and 13 exams required to be passed before being allowed to move on. Phase 2 includes 200 more hours of ground training, 34 simulator flights, 78 flights with instructors practicing practiced take-offs and landings and check-rides with instructor-pilots in a T-6 prop aircraft.

On October 1st, Lt. Colleen Slein was cleared through all these stages and took her first solo flight in the T-6 aircraft. *"I was humbled by and grateful for the opportunity to solo in this aircraft, and I'm looking forward to many more hours, days, months and years of chasing the clouds and my dream."*

Phase 3 of Colleen's pilot training involves learning to fly the T-38, a much faster aircraft which performs just as an operational fighter jet. This training requires 24 more weeks with 134 hours of ground training, 36 simulator flights and 79 practice flights and check-rides. At the conclusion of Phase 3, if successful with all aspects of this training, Lt. Slein will earn her wings as a T-38 pilot. The Air Force will then assign Lt. Slein with an operational aircraft based on US Air Force demands. Future training will involve learning to fly in formation and then advancing to specialized aircraft flown by the Air Force.

Academy trained Air Force pilots go on to serve a minimum 10-years in the Air Force. *"I'm excited to be on my Air Force path. It's a humbling experience to be where I am today. Central Catholic set the foundation and prepared me well in time and stress management, the science and engineering mindset, the depth of subject matter as well as the leadership experience that is necessary for pilot training. I would encourage Central Catholic students to chase their dreams, no matter how challenging the dream. The tools you need to accomplish your dreams are at CCHS every day."*

N.B. : Adam Morris '17, sharing Salem NH as hometown, had the opportunity as a CCHS senior to visit with fellow Raider alum, 2nd Lt. Slein. The experience convinced him more than ever that he could reach his dream. Adam is in his 2nd year as a cadet at the U.S. Air Force Academy.





Challenging Students to Reach Their Highest Potential

108 Students Honored as AP Scholars

As the CCHS student body prepares for the 2019 Advanced Placement Exams in May, they have no further to look for a trustworthy prediction for their upcoming AP success than to look to the extraordinary performance of the Class of 2018.

In May 2018, 108 Central Catholic High School students achieved AP Scholar status or higher by scoring an average of 3.96 or more on a wide array of subject exams.

In total, 341 CCHS students took 721 AP Exams from among 26 subject fields taught at CCHS. AP Exam scores are graded on a scale of 1 (lowest score) to 5 (highest score).

HIGHLIGHTS:

- 78% of CCHS students earned competency scores of three (3) or better, exceeding both MA (69%) and US (61.3%) averages
- 63% of CCHS seniors took at least one AP Exam
- 8 members of the Class of 2018 were named National AP Scholars
- 31 students honored as AP Scholars with Distinction
- 27 students honored as AP Scholars with Honor
- 41 students honored as AP Scholars

Designation is granted to students who earn an average score of at least four (4) on all AP Exams taken, and scores of four (4) or higher on eight (8) AP Exams.



I was able to find the time to explore the many academic and extracurricular opportunities Central offers."* A four-year recipient of the Dr. George LeMaitre '51 Scholarship for math and science, Margaret did not rest on this academic laurel, but proved to be deserving by going on to earn National Merit Commendation, Gold and Silver Medals in English, Sciences and Religious Studies, along with the Harvard Book Prize, National Honor Society induction and recognition from the College Board as a prestigious AP Scholar with Distinction.

Margaret's "explorations" included the CCHS Science Olympiad and Math League competitions, the Anime Club, Amnesty International, Passport Club and Mock Trial team. Delving into her interests in both life and health sciences, Margaret was a consistent volunteer and shadow student in various departments at Lawrence General Hospital. Her advice to younger students, "Explore everything - you'll get the most out of life if you're not afraid to explore. I looked at my CCHS career as an orange and squeezed as much juice out of it as I could."

"As a Northeastern University student majoring in chemical engineering and biochemistry, I realize Central Catholic's teachers gave us a lot of guidance on how to study independently. They taught time management skills and how to break long-term projects into smaller pieces - a skill invaluable for college success. College life is much less structured. I'm grateful that CCHS faculty taught us to decide what to do with your time and still be able to explore all the possibilities which college offers." *

CCHS ignites the process of this self-discovery and creates valuable habits encouraging reflection and growth which help students become thoughtful and impactful human beings." Sally's self-discoveries continue to guide her to a celestial level of achievement and maturity. "I take great pride in performing to the best of my abilities in challenging academic coursework, sacrificing lots of time and sleep balancing my class demands and school activities."

The results of Sally's efforts at CCHS were plain to see. Numerous Gold and Silver Medals in Social Studies, Mathematics and English over the years, stellar marks in 21 AP and Honors classes, accompanied by term after term on Distinguished Honor Roll, earning the honor of being named a National AP Scholar by the College Board, the Harvard Book Award, Vice President of National Honor Society and Co-Valedictorian of the Class of 2017. Caitlin Klauer is a humble, intelligent young woman with diverse abilities and interests, a strong sense of purpose, and incredible time management skills. Few students could find the success she has had inside and outside CCHS with such a demanding schedule. Along with being awarded a Harvard Book Prize, Cailtin achieved consistent Distinguished Honors grades in a curriculum which included 16 AP and Honors level courses. Caitlin's academic dedication and diverse interests earned Gold and Silver medals for her in Mathematics, English, Sciences and Visual Arts as well as membership in the National Honor Society. Her achievements academically led her to earn the prestigious recognition as a National Merit Scholar.

Outside of CCHS, Caitlin trained 20 hours a week with her club team, Optima Synchro. 




