Our Focus on Equity

Bothell's Equity Team goal is to increase communication channels with Latino families at Bothell HS. Specific actions our school will take toward this goal include:

- Hold Latino FAFSA night for Spanish speaking families hosted by Natural Helpers.
- Develop school correspondence in Spanish in addition to English via Blackboard system.
- Engage staff in professional development regarding academic achievement of Latino students at Bothell HS.
- Use Paws Time to track Ds/Fs of Latino students throughout year. Implement Check and Connect with identified Latino students and families.

Our Instructional Strategies

- Utilize collaborative groups and encourage students to work with their peers on schoolwork.
- Develop academic contracts with students. Provide students with timely formative feedback to students regarding academic progress.
- Use the Check and Connect system with identified students.

Facilities

Bothell High School was completely rebuilt over an eight-year period between 2000 and 2008. The 1950's facility was replaced with a state of the art 248,000 square foot facility that enhances student learning.

One of the unique features of the campus is a 600-seat theater that was enhanced by the participation of the Northshore Performing Arts Foundation. The Performing Arts Center is used regularly by school and community groups.

Northshore is the 10th largest school district in Washington with more than 20,000 students in 20 elementary schools, six junior high schools, four comprehensive high schools, an alternative high school, a preschool program and an independent contract program grades 1-12. The district encompasses over 60 square miles and includes the cities of Bothell, Kenmore and Woodinville as well as part of unincorporated King County.
