GOAL 2: Responsible, Resilient, Empathetic Learners

In the 2018-19 school year teachers will create community building opportunities in their classrooms so that students can build strong, positive relationships in school leading to higher engagement, more ready to learn behaviors, and feelings of belonging. We will be able to measure success when we see at least a 10% decrease in office referrals, absenteeism, and health room visits and at least a 10% increase in the percentage of students reporting positively on selected indicators on the student climate survey.

To work on this goal, we have chosen the following instructional strategies that are culturally responsive, high leverage, and adhere to universal design for learning. These strategies will be used in Frank Love's classrooms and throughout all learning environments. These strategies we have chosen are based on best practices and have been shown to make a positive impact on student learning.

- 16 Proactive Classroom Management Strategies
- PBIS Tier 1 Strategies
- PBIS Tier 2 Strategies
- PBIS Tier 3 Strategies

GOAL 3: Growth for Every Student, Elimination of Outcome & Opportunity Gaps

In the 2018-19 school year, teachers will focus on using collaborative learning structures to increase active engagement in learning math concepts and skills. We will measure progress by utilizing Math SBA Interim Assessments, Assessment Pilot measures (STAR and IReady) and Pre and Post Unit assessments. We will know that we have had success when 2018-19 Math SBA scores increase by 13% for an average of 70% of students at or above standard as well as an increase of 10% or more of students achieving a score of 3 or above in key areas of mathematics on their report card.

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Strategies from Visible Learning for Mathematics, by Douglas Fisher, Nancy Frey and John Hattie:

- Math Talk:
 - questioning
 - classroom discussion
 - self questioning
- Math Tasks:
 - space vs. mass practice
 - problem-solving teaching
 - metacognitive strategies





- Clarity:
 - teacher clarity
 - self-reported grades/student expectations
 - classroom cohesion

Facilities

Frank Love Elementary School opened in the fall of 1990. The school was constructed around a central courtyard design with 20 classrooms organized into pods. We have fourteen portable classrooms behind the school that house third through fifth grade classrooms.

The school is used extensively in the evenings and on weekends to support various community organizations and sports leagues. The playground is always open for community use. Our PTA worked hard to raise the remaining funds required to purchase and install a brand new playground in the spring of 2012.

Northshore is the 10th largest school district in Washington with almost 23,000 students in 20 elementary schools, six junior high schools, four comprehensive high schools, an alternative high school, a preschool program and an independent contract program grades 1-12.
