



To work on this goal, we have chosen the following instructional strategies that are culturally responsive, high leverage, and adhere to universal design for learning. These strategies will be used in Lockwood's classrooms and throughout all learning environments. The strategies we have chosen are based on best practices and have been shown to make a positive impact on student learning.

- Review PAWS and identify attributes for each PAWS that are measurable
- Post PAWS in the classrooms, cafeteria, gym, hallways and other places where students can see them
- Identify the reward system in consultation with the PBIS team
- Use the Second Step program and/or The Zones of Regulation to reinforce positive actions and improve student self-regulation
- Reinforce positive actions wherever there is an opportunity (Gym, Cafeteria, Playground, etc.)

GOAL 3: Growth for Every Student, Elimination of Outcome & Opportunity Gaps


Between September of 2018 and April of 2019, all Lockwood students will demonstrate growth in a specific grade level math strand/concept as identified by multiple data points.

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Facilities

Lockwood opened its doors to students in November 1962. Our school grounds connect with Kenmore Middle School fields. We have had many facility improvements including new energy efficient windows, blinds and upgrades to the heating and ventilation systems. The technology levy supported sound speakers installed in every classroom. Facility use includes community baseball, soccer and basketball teams, district track and field and cross country meets, chess club, Math Olympiad competitions, Boeing science club, after-school drama club, before-school district orchestra programs and many other events.
