School Strategic Action Plan

The mission of North Creek High School is to inspire and develop students and staff to become *stewards of innovation*, *collaborative problem solvers*, *creative thinkers*, *caring and compassionate citizens*, *environmental champions*, *servant leaders* and *social justice activists* in service toward making a positive impact on our local and global community.

Our goals the 2018-19 school year and their related measures for success are listed below. These goals and measures are aligned with Northshore's Strategic Plan.

Goal 3: Growth for Every Student, Elimination of Outcome and Opportunity Gaps

Between September 2018 and June 2019, North Creek High School will reduce the overall number of discipline incidents and will reduce the disproportionality in discipline between different sub-groups of students. Additionally, the number of students passing all core classes will increase (this connects to Goal 5 as well)





School Strategic Action Plan continued

To work on this goal, we have chosen the following instructional strategies that are culturally responsive, high leverage, inclusive and adhere to universal design for learning. These strategies will be used in North Creek High School's classrooms and throughout all learning environments. These strategies we have chosen are based on best practices and have been shown to make a positive impact on student learning. These research-based strategies are based on the work of Dr. Clay Cook (taken from his list called "The Sweet 16").

Relationship Strategies:

- 5 to 1 ratio of positive to negative interactions (Magic ratio)
- Smiling and being nice
- Positive greetings at the door to pre-correct and establish a positive climate

Procedural Strategies:

- Organizing a productive classroom
- Teacher proximity and mobility
- Transitions are managed well

GOAL 5: Ready for Lifelong Success after Graduation

Between September 2018 and June 2019, each and every student not currently on track to graduate will access one or more interventions designed to help them get back on track. Additionally, all staff will engage in Professional Development designed to help them keep all students on track.

To work on this goal, we have chosen the following instructional strategies that are culturally responsive, high leverage, inclusive and adhere to universal design for learning. These strategies will be used in North Creek High School's classrooms and throughout all learning environments. These strategies we have chosen are based on best practices and have been shown to make a positive impact on student learning.

- Knowing students' academic and cultural backgrounds
- Using a variety of teacher-led (e.g., choral responding and response cards)
- Peer-assisted (e.g., cooperative learning and peer tutoring)
- Student-regulated (e.g., self-management, student choice, student voice)
- Technology-supported strategies shown empirically to increase student engagement
- Monitoring student engagement and provide positive and constructive feedback to sustain performance





Facilities

North Creek High School opened in the fall of 2017 with the mission of serving the expanding population of the north end of the district. North Creek is built on a 61 acre campus and facility is comprised of three buildings with a total of 225,000 square feet.

Funded through the 2014 capital bond, North Creek was designed for 21st century learning, ensuring that spaces accommodate evolving technology as well as both teacher and student collaboration. Deep green design was a significant component of the project with a very high level of sustainability as a goal.

Learning Outside

Highlights of outside learning spaces include: protected wetlands with interpretive boardwalk, rain sculptures and gardens, accessible green roof, sustainable landscaping and much more to explore.

<u>Learning Inside</u>

Highlights of inside learning spaces include: open, flexible teaching spaces, collaborative spaces including collaboration cubes, LED screens and wireless for bring-your-own-device capability, flexible maker spaces to accommodate forward-thinking course design such as engineering, biomedical science and much more.

Built Green

North Creek High School incorporates geothermal heating and cooling, solar power, storm water retention and recycled, recyclable and reclaimed materials. Multiple interpretive boards are located throughout the school's campus. Organized into four major themes (energy, life, water, materials), these boards indicate sustainable features and who the buildings and site function as a critical educational tool.

Northshore is the 10th largest school district in Washington with almost 23,000 students in 20 elementary schools, six junior high schools, four comprehensive high schools, an alternative high school, a preschool program and an independent contract program grades 1-12. The district encompasses over 60 square miles and includes the cities of Bothell, Kenmore and Woodinville as well as part of unincorporated King County.
