

Wow, what an amazing beginning to the school year we had on August 19th at Linda Vista. 3rd graders and teachers would like to thank our parents and guardians for their great support during this time of transition into remote learning. Technology is always a challenge, but we met the challenge and overcame many difficulties. We are now smoothly enjoying our time together in our virtual classroom.

We have been busy getting to know each other and learning about one another. Developing good habits and organizing our work has been a focus of our first few weeks. The students are currently studying American Symbols and Government in Social Studies. Science will begin with our Amplify Science unit on Balancing Forces.

Our Math studies involves using number sense: addition and subtraction, using place value to add and subtract, and addition and subtraction of whole numbers. Students have taken the concepts further by completing topics such as rounding, using number lines, and problem solving. They enjoy using whiteboards and manipulatives to reinforce concepts, as well as computer programs.

Language Arts lessons have explored fantasy and realistic fiction, and the life lessons learned by reading them. They are also studying narrative non-fiction, autobiographies, and biographies. Students work on weekly focus projects that explore grammar rules, writing genres, and various comprehension strategies.

We have begun our personal writing narrative by starting with a 'brain dump' of the activities we did over summer break, organized our ideas into a color coded tree map, and then created an outline of our rough draft. We spent time revising our draft, looking for ways to elaborate and expand on our ideas, and students began typing their final copies using a Google Doc. We started reading our first novel of the year, <u>Earthquake Terror</u>. Fifth graders are excited as they follow along with a hard copy of their own. We continuously discuss reading comprehension



strategies such as character conflict, plot structure, sequence of events, and figurative language.

In math, we started out the year reviewing the 4th grade skill of decimal place value. We have been practicing saying and writing the decimals, comparing them, and finding patterns. Fifth graders have also been practicing math concepts using the online iReady math program.

Social studies has kept us busy reviewing mapping skills, directions, and regions of North America. Students are getting the hang of navigating our Google Classroom and becoming very familiar with all the tools on their OUSD Dashboard. We are looking forward to an exciting school year!

Public libraries now have curbside pickup. Go to their site and reserve a few. Book reports have become a great way to earn Reading Counts points if the book does not have a quiz. This opens endless opportunities to read books you have at home that are at your reading level and write a short report. Then email it to me at lmccaus@orangeusd.org I will read them, assign a point value, and send them back to the student and to the teacher. Your teacher can give you more info on the length and expectations of the reports. It's easy and it has been fun for me to see what the kids are reading. Remember: When searching for a quiz, try looking under the author's last name and the title, dropping The or A from the title. Some are tricky to find.

Second grade is off to a great start and we are looking forward to a great school year!




It was so nice to meet our new First graders for the 2020-2021 school year.
