BROTHERS ON THE FRONT LINE: Garrett Bomba, MD '92 and Randall Bomba, RN '94



Central's COVID-19 RESPONSE

As CCHS continues to respond to the ongoing pandemic, we remain awe-inspired by the ingenuity, creativity and selflessness of our campus community. From remote learning to virtual student life, our faculty, students and staff have gathered as "Central Together" – embracing innovation and acclimating to a constantly evolving health climate.

Since March 2020, Central Catholic's administration, faculty, and staff have been working tirelessly to bring about a safer and healthier "Return to Campus" experience. Dedicated task forces were quickly formed and thorough health guidelines and safety protocols were established, in addition to three comprehensive learning models (On Campus, Hybrid Live, and Remote Live) – each option is a synchronous learning experience with live, real-time instruction.

Also, a detailed "Return to Campus" guide was developed as the "go to" document for students, faculty, and staff to safely come back to the CCHS campus. This fall, CCHS was able to commence the academic year in the hybrid model thanks to the commitment and dedication of our entire CCHS community. We continue to navigate these evolving circumstances in the best way we know how – as "Central Together."



COVID-19 RESPONSE

REMOTE LEARNING via Zoom Technology


CCHS faculty, staff, and administration collaborated to rapidly develop and launch (mid-March) a comprehensive remote learning program for our students to maintain the continuation of education. Though many high schools transitioned to a pass/ fail grading model, Central maintained its traditional grading model based on the level of instruction still being provided through remote learning. The four-day remote learning model allowed for students and faculty to have a mid-week break (Wednesday) for decompressing, or in the faculty's case, organizing for the remainder of the week. This fall, CCHS started the academic year in a Hybrid Live Instruction model.

RAIDER ReConnect

Knowing how difficult time away from campus has been on our students, CCHS developed Raider ReConnect – a way to virtually provide student life experiences for students to stay connected to campus and to each other throughout the pandemic. Whether it is a virtual coffeehouse, film festival, cooking lessons, trick shot competition or faculty check-ins from home, every program is aimed to comfort and support our students during this trying time.





BeWELL! A COVID-19 Web Resource

At the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, our **BeWell** website was developed to provide up-to-date COVID-related information. Our entire CCHS community had access to tips on staying healthy, important information from federal and state agencies, remote learning schedules, and much more. Since June, our "Return to Campus" website (centralcatholic.net/returntocampus) has served as the main informational resource for families.



DAILY Communication

From mid-March through late April, CCHS students, parents, faculty, and staff received daily updates sharing important COVID-related information including new federal or state guidelines, announcements on CCHS event postponements, remote learning schedules, and information on upcoming virtual events such as Town Halls via Zoom, wellness webinars, and school and college counseling support. The CCHS administration continues to update students and their families through regular communications and our Return to Campus website.

VOLUNTEERING at Grace Food Pantry (Everett, MA)

While donning a mask and gloves amid the COVID-19 pandemic, CCHS senior **Nicholas Mazzie '21**, a student-athlete (football, track, and lacrosse) and member of the National Honor Society, volunteered at the Grace Food Pantry in Everett, MA. Nick typically volunteers at the food pantry every month with his father, Steven, and sister, Gabriella, and they didn't let the virus stop their dedication to the "least favored."

"At Central Catholic we always talk about taking care of those who are the least favored and in need," said Nick. "I love the feeling of helping people and I genuinely care about those in need. I am lucky enough to be in a place where I do not have to worry about my next meal. The people we are serving were already struggling enough and now this health crisis has put people out of work and now many of them have no income."

Usually the food pantry is once a month, but due to the pandemic, the pantry increased its hours to serve as many people as possible.

3D MASK MAKING for Our Medical Heroes

CCHS student, **Caleb Scotch '23**, used his 3D printer at home for more than making models. He and his family decided to make plastic masks with his specialized printer to help those who needed supplies amid the peak of the COVID-19 crisis.

"My parents and I saw that we could make 3D print masks to help people, and so we started to do so with the 3D printer I have in my workshop," said Caleb. "We knew we could help people using a special piece of technology that not many people have access to."

Another CCHS 3D model maker, **Molly Teece '17**, started an initiative that provided hundreds of items of protective equipment, including masks, face shields, and "ear-savers," to COVID-19 first responders.

Molly is the co-founder and co-president of the 3D Printing Club at UMass Lowell, where she is a polymer/plastics engineering major.

Under Molly's leadership, the 3D Printing Club has donated materials to Boston Children's Hospital, Lowell General Hospital, Mass. General Hospital, and St. Joseph Hospital.



Welcome to the new Raider Café

Located in the Memorial Gymnasium, Raider Café offers students, faculty, and staff the opportunity to purchase hot and iced coffee, hot chocolate, snacks, and more before and after school.

The transformation of the Raider Pub into the Raider Café is part of a continuous effort for Central Catholic to enhance the student-experience on campus. The students themselves raised the funds to renovate this space through the annual Walkathon.

Raider Café Enhancements included:

Modern exterior entrance with glass doors and CCHS branded signage

Completely remodeled interior that now resembles a contemporary café environment with a marble-topped service area, bistrostyle tables, chairs, and booths

New appliances such as a refrigerator, freezer, popcorn machine, a large capacity coffee maker, hot chocolate machine, and more

Payment can be made using Square technology, allowing patrons to use credit and debit cards


