

### North Middle School's 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Black History Showcase Café






# Junior Mechanic Club Sparks Great Interest

For 2020, our theme is "Communication at Work."








Congratulations Diana! Diana Gallo plans to attend college in the fall to become a professional aesthetician and makeup artist.




