Founded in 1824, **KENTS HILL SCHOOL** is one of the oldest independent, co-educational boarding and day schools in the United States and provides transformative experiences rooted in the power of community, character, and core values. Kents Hill students are empowered to shape their own path and take advantage of learning opportunities that extend far beyond the classroom. They learn to navigate through difficult situations, take responsibility, and use their voice for good. They leave Kents Hill prepared for the best colleges and universities. Even more importantly, for the world.

Kents Hill has renewed its institutional commitment to **diversity, equity, and belonging** by continuously striving to become an anti-racist community. Our Diversity, Equity, and Belonging Committee dedicates time and resources to foster equity through inclusive policies, practices, and teaching methodologies, and to create a sense of belonging through programming and activities. All members of the Kents Hill community participate in our signature **PEAK Program (Principles, Ethics, and Action at Kents Hill)** each week to explore their own values, engage with people who think and behave differently, and begin to positively impact their immediate and larger community.

Kents Hill's **4D Academic Curriculum** ensures that each student builds a strong foundation of knowledge, skills, character, and reflection. A variety of **new academic offerings** allow students to engage with today's world in all of its complexity. Several new Science classes explore issues connected to public health and the global environment, while a pair of Social Studies classes, Comparative Government and Politics and A Global History of the UN, give students the conceptual frameworks with which to imagine solutions to these and other challenges. A number of new courses also add range to our Visual and Performing Arts options, allowing aspiring artists, actors, and musicians to practice their craft in a supportive environment.

Challenging academics and extracurricular offerings include Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual-Enrollment college classes, curriculum-based tutoring through the Akin Learning Center, English Language Support for non-native speakers, competitive interscholastic and intramural athletics, and fine arts. Students participate in a team sport or afternoon activity every afternoon, with options including varsity sports, Outing Club, theater, community engagement, and internships. Global Programming opportunities include academic exchanges, linguistic excursions, and domestic travel opportunities. Note: Global Programming and other travel opportunities are subject to change pending COVID-19-related policies.

All academic course offerings are college preparatory.

THE POSTGRADUATE (PG) PROGRAM provides high school graduates with opportunities to broaden their horizons, nurture their personal growth, and evaluate their personal and professional goals before college. All PG students take at least five academic classes while fulfilling extracurricular and internship opportunities and earn a Certificate of Attendance at the successful completion of their year at Kents Hill.

TRANSCRIPTS include work completed at Kents Hill School (grades 9-PG). While academic work completed at other schools is used to meet Kents Hill diploma requirements, it is not factored into the cumulative weighted GPA. Standardized testing is under the student's control and not included on the school transcript. **Kents Hill does not rank its students.** Please see our transcript key for more information.

HONORS AND AWARDS Kents Hill inducts students in Grade 11 into the National Honor Society each spring. Cum Laude recognition is bestowed upon students in Grade 12 at year's end. Kents Hill confers class and department awards each year. These recognitions are not noted on the transcript but students are encouraged to include them on their college applications.

GRADING SYSTEM Grades are expressed on the transcript as letters with the following numerical and GPA equivalents:

WEIGHTING Kents Hill School weights Honors, AP, and Dual-Enrollment courses to reward students who challenge themselves academically. For each Honors course, 0.5 points are added to the student's GPA; that number is then multiplied by the number of credits earned and divided by the number of credits attempted. The same weighting formula is used for AP and Dual-Enrollment courses, except that students earn 0.75 additional points for AP classes and 1 additional point for Dual-Enrollment classes.
