College Applications

The two application websites that most seniors will use to apply to college are Common App and Black College Common App.

The Common App (<u>www.commonapp.org</u>) is used by more than 900 colleges and universities. This year, all 12 public universities in Illinois will be using the Common App. In addition, all Big 10 and Ivy League universities use the Common App. Here are some of the other colleges and universities that use the Common App - DePaul, Hampton, Howard, Illinois Wesleyan, Lewis, Loyola, Morehouse, Saint Xavier, Spellman, St. Mary's (IN), U of Chicago, and U of Notre Dame.

The Black College Common App (<u>www.commonblackcollegeapp.com</u>) is accepted by 65 of the HBCUs, including Clark-Atlanta, Fisk, Grambling State, Morgan State, and Tuskegee. Students may apply to all 65 for an application fee of \$20.

College Programs

Scholarships

For the first semester of senior year, the primary source for scholarships will be to submit applications by the university's deadline. The importance of knowing and meeting the deadline was stressed to the seniors when the college counselors met with them in the first week of school.

Most outside / private scholarships will have deadlines in second semester. Three websites that may be used to complete an online scholarships search for the scholarships are: <u>Fastweb</u>, <u>Sallie</u> <u>Mae</u>, <u>College Covered</u>. In addition to having a scholarship search, all three websites have lots of additional information, covering topics such as college planning, financial aid, student loans, and student life in college.
