COVID-19 Important Update

We are excited to welcome all students and staff back to school tomorrow, January 3. As a reminder, if a student or staff member tested positive for COVID-19 over break, please be sure to let your school know promptly today or tomorrow morning, especially if they are enrolled in our weekly pooled testing program. We want to make sure that anyone who has recently tested positive is not included in our testing program for 90 days from their positive test, per the CDC and Concentric protocols.

You may have also heard that the state of Maine released an update on December 30th to the Standard Operating Protocol for schools as related to responding to positive cases. Changes will be made accordingly, which will be communicated to you in detail later this week.

Scarborough Public Schools continues to be committed to maintaining a safe environment for all. Please know that we will continue to utilize a variety of mitigation strategies, including universal masking, frequent hand washing and sanitizing, distancing, and pooled testing across all of our schools. If a student or staff member is displaying any COVID related symptoms on the daily self assessment, we continue to ask that these individuals stay home, monitor for symptoms, and get tested as needed.
