## A HISTORICAL OVERVIEW OF THE BOYS' LATIN SCHOOL OF MARYLAND

Founded in 1844 by Evert Marsh Topping, a professor of Classics at Princeton University, The Boys' Latin School of Maryland is the oldest non-sectarian school in the state of Maryland. From 1844 until 1960, the School was located in downtown Baltimore and was operated by a succession of headmasters as a business. In 1960, Boys' Latin almost ceased to exist, as the School's Brevard Street location was scheduled by the city for demolition as part of urban renewal. The School's owners at the time decided to cease operations rather than undertake the rigors of relocation.

The three owners had, however, underestimated the impact Boys' Latin had made on Baltimore's educational and professional landscapes. Boys' Latin Alumni were leaders in the private and civic sectors of the Greater Baltimore metropolitan area and beyond. A movement began spearheaded by then-President of the Alumni Association, Jack H. Williams '38, to preserve the tradition of Boys' Latin. A lengthy search for a new campus site was undertaken, monies were hastily solicited and collected, a Board of Trustees was named, and the School was incorporated as a non-profit institution. Thirteen acres in Roland Park, the Cooper Estate, were purchased. Without missing a single semester, Boys' Latin opened in the fall of 1960 at its present location on West Lake Avenue.

In the last 62 years, the school has grown tremendously in terms of population, campus and curricular offerings. In September 2022 the school opened with 625 boys in grades K-12, a marked increase over the September 1960 enrollment of 120 in grades 1-12. Boys' Latin's campus has grown in that time from one building to encompassing both sides of Lake Avenue that includes a new 28-acre property that is home to our boarding school which launched in the fall of 2021.

As steady as the BL growth was, no single event put the school on "Baltimore's map" more so than the 1964 Championship Lacrosse season, when our little 'David' of a school took on the 'Goliaths' of the MSA (the present MIAA) and emerged as victors! Boys' Latin had indeed arrived and has worked hard on staying there ever since. Boys' Latin began playing varsity lacrosse in 1929 so this year marks the 93<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of Laker Lacrosse. Championship victories in 1932 and 1934 were not followed with another crown until 1964. The Lakers again won Championships in 1966, 1985, 1988, 1997, 2002, 2006, 2014 and 2021. Since relocating to Lake Avenue, Boys' Latin has reached the "A" Conference Championship game more than any other league opponent - 25 times! While it is virtually impossible to predict the season outcome when competing in the country's most competitive conference, one thing is for certain: The Lakers will play hard with a confidence that comes from a program that demonstrates excellence and sportsmanship time and time again.

Boys' Latin School has grown dramatically in its 178-year history. Though its face may be different – no longer at its downtown location or one-building school of the early 1960's – BL remains the same. The School led the way in building its overall program on the precept that individual attention can benefit boys of differing economic, social and intellectual backgrounds. The success of our students and the accomplishments of our graduates offer eloquent testimony to the continued merit of this philosophy.

# NEW BOARDING PROGRAM AT THE BOYS' LATIN SCHOOL OF MARYLAND

The new boarding program's credo at The Boys' Latin School of Maryland is that no boy ever stands alone – especially our boarding students.

Boys' Latin now offers an immersive seven-day boarding experience. In the fall of 2021 BL welcomed boys from all over the country and around the world into our school, our homes, and our hearts.

In 2020, the school purchased 28 acres of property contiguous to our campus from the Josephite Order. The property included a state-of-the-art housing facility which BL has converted into 20-bedroom suites capable of housing 40 students – two students per room. Each room is nearly 300 square feet and includes a bathroom with shower.

Boarding fits seamlessly into BL's mission and represents a bold new chapter in our storied history. And, because it's designed from the ground up, our curriculum incorporates the latest innovations in both residential and all-boys education – helping us raise boys who thrive in a time when it has never been more challenging or more important.

The program builds in weekly dorm meetings, group dinners, and the opportunity to mentor our youngest Lakers, ensuring that our boarders are part of our BL community. The weekends are a busy time for boarders. The campus often bustles with athletic competitions, and numerous other BL events and activities. A plethora of activities are planned for each weekend, including everything from going out for breakfast to visiting museums in Washington D.C. to a ski or tubing trip in the nearby Pocono Mountains. Each of our boarding students is paired with a day student family for a home-cooked meal, a movie night, or a game at Camden Yards. This is just one more way of integrating boarders into our BL family.

At Boys' Latin, each and every one of our students is known -- for who he is today, and all he will be tomorrow.



# CELEBRATING THE MAGICAL RUN OF 2021

In the MIAA semi-finals, Boys' Latin defeated McDonogh, 13-12, and Archbishop Spalding defeated Calvert Hall 9-8 in the nightcap setting up a BL-Spalding championship match. This was the first time for the Cavaliers as an "A" Conference contender and Coach Farrell's third and BL's 25<sup>th</sup> overall trip to the title game.

Navy's Marine Corps Stadium had a big crowd of 7,200 to watch the title bout. Coach Farrell spoke all season long that the team would go as far as the senior leadership would take them. He needed one more big game from his leaders and BL could claim its 11th overall "A" Conference Championship. With the injured AJ Hernandez from the bench, and field leaders Garrett Glatz, Ben Smith, and Eddie Loyd, Farrell's seniors came through one final time.



Just like the previous playoff games against Loyola and McDonogh, the Lakers found themselves trailing 6-4 early in the third quarter. And just like before, the Lakers went on a five-goal run giving them a 9-6 lead with just minutes to play in regulation.

The Cavaliers, playoff contenders for the first time ever, cut the lead to 9-8 with 11.4 seconds remaining. However, face-off star Mac Moreland won possession of the final draw, setting off a wild Laker victory celebration.

"A lot of emotion right now for sure," coach Brian Farrell told *The Baltimore Sun*. "We're really proud of our lacrosse tradition at Boys' Latin. To be able to pull out a win like this one tonight — and they gave me gray hairs just like they've done all season long — it's just special. There was a lot of work that went into it and I'm just overly proud of everybody."

Ben Smith again led all scorers with three goals and two assists. Riar Schell scored twice and Gavin McClernan continued his excellent play during the playoffs with two assists. Other Laker scorers were Hopper Zappitello, Jackson Walsh, Garrett Glatz, and Jacob Pacheco. Zappitello's goal was the game's first.

BL's defense again was stout and led by Eddie Loyd. Cardin Stoller had another great game with ten saves.

BL finished as the number one team in the Baltimore region and ranked 5<sup>th</sup> nationally in the Nike/USA Lacrosse Top 25 rankings. The Maryland State Lacrosse Coaches Association named Ben Smith and Dom Pietramala All-State first team at attack and Eddie Loyd second team All-State on defense.



*Varsitysportsnetwork.com* named Ben Smith its Offensive Player of the Year and Coach Farrell as Co-Coach of the Year along with his close friend, Brian Phipps, of Archbishop Spalding.



## CELEBRATING THE 1997 CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

The number one ranked Lakers were now 16-0 and in the championship game against Loyola, who beat Gilman 8-6 in the other semi-final game. Loyola was on a roll having won ten games in a row and this was the school's first trip to the finals since 1993. After the Loyola semi-final win Don's coach Joe McFadden was quoted in the papers saying "Come on BL!" His team finished the season with only two losses. One loss was to Gilman, which they already avenged, and one was to BL. He eagerly wanted to end BL's dream of an undefeated season and win the championship.

The Lakers were eager to get the championship game started, and according to *The Baltimore Sun*, they collectively knew that past teammate Patrick Radebaugh was smiling on them. The unbeaten, topranked Lakers out-finessed, out-hustled and, in the end, out-gunned the Loyola Dons and won the game 13-8 in front of 6,000 Homewood Field spectators.



Greg Patchak, who scored the first goal of the game 30 seconds into the game finished with four goals on the night. Tom Glatzel, with three goals, Ian Shure, with two goals, and Ryan Mollett, with two goals aided the Maroon and White charge, giving Coach Shriver his third title in his 18-year tenure.

The Lakers' season-long inspiration was Patrick Radebaugh, and *The Baltimore Sun* quoted Aaron Vercollone's tearful salute to his former teammate after the game: "This is the greatest bunch of guys I've ever played with in my life, but we're missing one of them."

The 17-0 dream was now a reality. ESPN profiled BL's championship run and the team picture was to grace Cheerio boxes later in the fall. Now the talk was on whether this was the greatest high school lacrosse team of all time. Many believed it was – and still is.

Ian Shure ended the season as the team's leading scorer with 30 goals and 44 assists but it was Patchak who broke BL's all-time scoring record with his 49 goals and 20 assists to end his career with 166 total points one point ahead of BL great John Ciccarone.

Patchak, Shure, Mollett, John Glatzel and defenseman David Rose all were honored as first team All-Metropolitan players. John Glatzel was also selected as the area's player of the year. Tom

Glatzel and David Ulrich were second team selections. Bob Shriver also won post-season accolades when *The Baltimore Sun* named him Coach of the Year.

Shriver's Lakers outscored league opponents 14.2-to-4.5 goals per game and assisted on nearly 80 percent of their goals. Shriver told *The Baltimore Sun*, "This team is like family in every sense. They did a wonderful job of emphasizing us as a group and a team, and the team captains never let them waver from that."

The United States National Lacrosse Association designated the Lakers number one in the entire country, giving those who believed the 1997 BL ten as the best team ever, all the backing they would need.



## CELEBRATING THE 2002 CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

For the seventh time since the MIAA and its predecessor, the MSA, played championship games, BL was to play the Loyola Dons. A large crowd came out to see the game at Johns Hopkins University's Homewood Field. The Lakers came out on fire and built a commanding 8-2 lead. Loyola, led by head coach John Tucker, was a tough team and they battled back. They came roaring back in the third period scoring three quick goals making the score 8-5. At this point, Bobby Griebe decided to take over. Griebe picked up a loose ball in front of the Loyola cage and


fired it past the Don goalie. The goal seemed to take the steam out of the Loyola comeback and the Lakers outscored the Dons 2-0 in the final stanza to win the game rather easily, 12-7. Drew Peace had the game of a lifetime scoring four goals. Griebe and Brian Read each scored three goals. Alex Smith scored BL's seventh goal, just five seconds after the team's sixth goal, when he won a face-off and raced down the field and fired a rocket into the back of the Dons' net. Third midfield member Zenno Zennaro also scored a goal in the game. Trey Sheain finished his outstanding career in the BL cage with 12 stops.




BL finished the year with a 14-game winning streak and an overall record of 20-2. The Lakers were number one in the region and number three in the *Lax Power* national rankings. The Laker defense led the league, allowing less than seven goals per contest. *The Baltimore Sun* selected Bob Shriver its coach of the year for leading Boys' Latin to his fifth title as head coach. Bobby Griebe, *The Baltimore Sun's* City/County Player of the Year, led the team in scoring with 81 total points and named to the All-Metro first team along, with teammates JR Stahl and goalie Trey Sheain. Griebe was also a High School All-American selection.

Drew Peace became the second son of a Laker, Tom Peace in 1964, to also win an "A"

Conference lacrosse title wearing maroon and white.





#### BOYS' LATIN VARSITY COACHES AND STAFF



A 2006 Boys' Latin graduate, **Brian Farrell** enters his seventh year at the helm of the Lakers. Brian entered Boys' Latin as a 6<sup>th</sup> grader in the fall of 1999 and had an outstanding career both academically and athletically at BL. A member of the National Honor Society, Brian was a three-sport star who was captain of his football, basketball, and lacrosse teams his senior year. The 2006 Boys' Latin lacrosse team was undefeated, 21-0, and the consensus #1 High School team in the United States. That year Brian was named a High School All-American Defensemen and was a 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Metro Player in *The Baltimore Sun*. Brian continued his lacrosse career at

the University of Maryland following in the footsteps of his father Mike, Maryland class of '76 and a National Lacrosse Hall of Famer. Brian had an outstanding career at Maryland with many accomplishments: he was a two-time United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) Scholar Athlete, a three-time USILA All-American, an ACC Tournament Champion, and winner of the prestigious Charles P. McCormick Award as the Baltimore Area Athlete who contributed the most to athletics at the University of Maryland. Brian also had a solid career playing in the MLL (he retired from the Ohio Machine in 2015 to concentrate on coaching the Lakers). Brian's coaching career began at the Bridgeton Academy in Maine. He returned to his alma mater in 2013 serving as Maryland's Volunteer Assistant Coach and spent 2013-2015 coaching football and lacrosse at the Salisbury School in Connecticut. Brian brings a wealth of athletic acumen and experience to his new job and has had the benefit of learning the game of lacrosse from some of the most respected teachers/coaches in the country: his father Mike, Bob Shriver, Steve Dubin, Dave Cottle, John Tillman and Bobby Wynne (Salisbury School Head Coach). In addition to coaching lacrosse, Brian works in the school's Admission's Office concentrating on the Upper School.

**Tano Arrogancia** is starting his 17<sup>th</sup> year on the varsity staff. Tano is as accomplished and knowledgeable a lacrosse coach as our area has. The former Head Coach at Pikesville (Pikesville won the '99 state "B" title) and former assistant at Hereford and St. Paul's, Tano has extensive experience working with goalies and face-off men. Tano has established a reputation as one of the most sought-after goalie tutors in the Baltimore area, and is a tireless

worker as a member of the Maryland State Lacrosse Coaches Association (MLSCA). Additionally, Tano previously was on the staff of perennial MLL powerhouse the Chesapeake Bayhawks. Tano will once again work with our goalies and face-off personnel.



A Baltimore native, **Myles Cohen '15** returns this spring for his third season with the team. Myles was a member of the 2014 National Championship team. As a senior, he was named "Most Improved Player," totaling 52 wins and just six losses in his career. Myles was also a starting defensive back and wide receiver on the varsity football team. During his time on Lake Avenue he was named to the honor roll and won the Jack H. Williams Award, honoring the student that is most caring and shows the most benevolence. Myles continued his lacrosse career at Furman

University where he was a four-year starter and is currently third all-time in career ground balls for the program. Myles graduated in 2019 with a Business Communications degree. Myles will help coach the overall defense, man-down defense and run the box for our team.









We are excited to have **Cole Erickson** join our staff this season. Cole was a 2020 graduate and five-year member of the Boys' Latin community. He was a very active member of our school, named a Williams Scholar and was a member of the National Honors Society. Nick is entering his fourth year as a member of the Laker coaching staff and his second year as the head coach of the JV program. He was fortunate to be offered an athletic scholarship to play SEC football at the University of Georgia. Greg started forty games and was an All-American Offensive Lineman. Earning his degree in Human Development and Family Science reinforced his interest to work with children in a coaching and mentoring capacity. #### BOYS' LATIN LAKERS IN THE LACROSSE HALL OF FAME

#### CLAXTON J. "OKEY" O'CONNOR

Claxton J. "Okey" O'Connor was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1964. He coached the Boys' Latin lacrosse teams from 1931-1960. His BL lacrosse teams won MSA "A" Conference championships in 1932 and 1934 and annually were always near the top of the standings. Okey played lacrosse for Baltimore Poly and later played on the 1930 St. John's College National Championship team. O'Connor was a mathematics teacher, football and basketball coach and part owner of Boys' Latin School until its reorganization and move to Lake Avenue in the fall of 1960. Okey was inducted into the Boys' Latin Athletic Hall of fame in 2006.

## JOHN F. KELLY

John 'Jack' Kelly graduated from Boys' Latin in 1933 and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1969. He was the goaltender for the first Boys' Latin Championship team (1932) and was an All-Maryland selection at his position. Kelly took his skills to the University of Maryland, and the Terps lost only one game during his three years in the goal. He was a 1st Team All-American selection in 1936 and 1937. Jack was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of fame in 2006.

#### HOWARD "HOWDY" MYERS, Jr.

'Howdy' Myers, a 1929 graduate of Boys' Latin, was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1971. An outstanding football and basketball player at Boys' Latin and the University of Virginia, Howdy is best known for his legendary coaching abilities, and is credited for the rise of lacrosse on Long Island. In his 46 years as a coach (1933-1979), his teams compiled a lacrosse record of 379-141-6. Myers is responsible for establishing the St. Paul's (1936-46) lacrosse program – under his leadership the Crusaders had a 135-18-2 record. In 1946, Howdy took his skills to Johns Hopkins, where from 1947-49 the Blue Jays went undefeated, and winning three national titles. In 1950, Howdy became the athletic director, head football and lacrosse coach at Hofstra, where his lacrosse teams had a 180-115-3 record. Howdy was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

### JAMES McC. WEBSTER

James 'Mickey' Webster, a 1955 graduate of Boys' Latin, was the first Laker to be honored with his induction into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 1977. While at Boys' Latin, Mickey earned All-Maryland honors three years ('53, '54. '55) at attack and won the C. Markland Kelly Award his senior year. Upon graduation, he continued his education at The Johns Hopkins University, where he was a three time All-American ('57, '58, '59). His sons John '88 and Ned '94 have added much to our lacrosse program. Mick was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

#### DONALD P. HAHN

Don Hahn was a 1947 graduate of The Boys' Latin School and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1981. Donny was also one of BL's greatest athletes of all-time. As a Laker, Don was selected to the first team All-Maryland lacrosse squad in 1945 and the only unanimous choice in 1947. He broke his ankle in the spring of 1946 but still was selected to play in the 1946 MSA Lacrosse All-Star game. Don was captain of the 1947 Division II championship lacrosse team that lost to Gilman in a thrilling title game 7-6. Later that spring he received the Maryland Officials' Association Award as the best lacrosse player in the MSA. Don went on to attend Princeton University. In the spring of 1951 he finished his remarkable college lacrosse career at Princeton and was named first team All-American at attack for the second straight year leading the Tigers to the national title. In 2006 he was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame.

#### JOSEPH S. SOLLERS

Joe Sollers, a 1947 graduate of Boys' Latin, was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1987. A High School All-Maryland selection ('44, '45, '47) in the goal, Joe was also the first recipient of the C. Markland Kelly Award in 1945. Joe continued his education at The Johns Hopkins University, where he was a three time All-American ('49, '50, '51). Joe won the C. Markland Kelly Award in 1951, given annually to the best college goaltender in the nation. Joe was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

#### MILTON E. HILLIARD, Jr.

'Butch' Hilliard graduated from The Boys' Latin School in 1964 and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1988. At Boys' Latin, he was a three-year varsity member and was selected to the 1st Team All-Maryland squad in 1964, for his efforts in the goal. Butch took his skills to Cornell University, where he became a two time All-American ('67, '68) for the Big Red, and was a perennial "Club Lacrosse" All-Star from 1969-1979. Butch earned the Kelly Award in 1968. He was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

### MICHAEL S. FEDERICO

Michael 'Piggy' Federico, a 1976 graduate of Boys' Latin, became the latest Laker to join the Lacrosse Hall of Fame with his induction in October 1999. At Boys' Latin, Mike was a three-year member of our varsity Lacrosse team, honored as a 1st Team All-Metropolitan player (1976) and was selected a High-School All-American his senior year. Continuing his education at The Johns Hopkins University, Mike started in the goal for the Blue Jays three seasons ('78, '79, '80), winning the National Championship each year, while compiling a 40-2 record. Mike completed his collegiate career as a three-time 1st Team All-American and a three-time recipient of the Kelly Award, given to the nation's finest goalkeeper. He was inducted into the BL Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012.

### **SIFFORD PEARRE.** a 1901 graduate of Boys' Latin, and **WILLIAM H.**

**HUDGINS**, a 1902 graduate of Boys' Latin are both members of the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame. Both played at Johns Hopkins University and attended Boys' Latin before we began our inter-scholastic lacrosse program in 1929.
