


Summer Reading Adventure 2022

Why Should I Read Over The Summer?


- It is important to read over the summer...

- Select and download the activities you like and write your answers/reflections in a notebook.
- Try to complete 5 activities in a row or diagonally. Make it fun and challenging for yourself.
- Over the next several weeks, try to accomplish as many as you can.
- Remember, you select the activities to complete. Try something new! For example, read a new recipe and make it for the family or friend. Take a picture of your masterpiece and write about it in your notebook. Have fun!!!

To Access Raz-Kids follow these simple steps:

- Go to <u>www.bufsd.org/myapps</u>
- Under Digital Subscription, select Raz-Kidz.




- It may ask you to enter your District Microsoft Office Login. Remember to use your *district username + bufsd.org* and your *district password*.
- For students who are in grades K-2, you will have the primary homepage. Remember, to access your books click in the Reading Planet.
- Select with the Level Up! Planet or the Reading Room Planet. The Level Up Planet are books selected just for you. The Reading Room is like visiting the library. You can choose books on all subjects and all levels.







- For students who are in grades 3-5, you will have the intermediate homepage. Remember, to access your books click on the word Reading in the upper left-hand. Level Up! Is the best place to visit. These books are selected just for you!!! The Reading Room is like visiting the library. You can choose books on all subjects and all levels.
- Remember you can listen to the stories, read the stories and take the quizzes. Each time you complete an activity you receive stars.

Story Elements For Kids: What Is a Character?

Choose a book of your choice to read and answer the following questions about the characters in your story. Use your Reading Notebook or Reading Journal to copy and answer the questions.

Who is the main character(s) in the story?

How do the characters change from the beginning to the end of the story?

What choices would you have made if you were the main character?

Challenge Question: Describe or draw a picture of your character. Identify and label inside and outside traits.

Story Elements for Kids: What Is a Setting?

Choose a book of your choice to read and answer the following questions about the setting in your story.

Use your Reading Notebook or Reading Journal to copy and answer the questions.

Where does this story take place?

When does the story take place?

How does knowing the setting help us understand the story?

Challenge: Could this story take place anywhere else, why or why not?

Setting

An element of fiction that tells WHEN and WHERE a story takes place.

- The setting helps the reader to VISUALIZE the events.
- Good readers use clues to determine whether the setting stays the same or changes throughout the story.
- Good readers ask themselves why the setting is important and how it affects the plot.



NewsELA

Are you interested in keeping up to date with the world around you? Or maybe you enjoy reading interesting articles about a variety of topics, then NewsELA is the place explore!!!

To Access NewsELA:

- Go to www.bufsd.org/myapps
- From District Subscriptions, select NewsELA
- It may ask you to enter your District Microsoft Office Login.
- Once you are on the site, you will see Latest News on your screen. These are the most updated current events.
- Select one by clicking onto the title. Remember you can also change the Lexile to match your most recent RI score.
- If those topics are not speaking to your interest, you can search the different articles within topic areas along the left side.
- When you are done, take the quiz. Use the Choice board on the side to dive deeper into the text. Answer a few question in your notebook.


