Math Pathways

GHC has 3 Math Pathways for students in the Middle Grades

Standards and content in Extended Math courses are not skipped but are "compacted".

If appropriate, students will be placed on the Extended Math Pathway during the Spring Semester of 6th Grade.

Multiple objective academic measures of student performance are taken into consideration including:

- MAP/NWEA mathematics assessment scores
- Achievement scores (assessment average) in mathematics class- average of 85% or higher
- "Outstanding" Work Habits on Fall Semester Report Card
- Smarter Balanced (SBAC) assessments scores if available

Grading Policy

Your final grade in each class is a reflection of your performance in three categories

- **Progress/Practice** (classwork, homework, formative assessments)--40% of grade
- Achievement (final projects, tests, writing assessments)--40% of grade
- **Approaches to Learning** (work habits, participation, organization, effort)--20% of grade

Homework is a key part of your progress in class

- Expect to have homework every night, including Fridays
- Will include nightly assignments, studying and work on long term projects

Latework

- 10% deduction per day for all progress/practice assignments up to 3 days past due date
- 10% total deduction for all achievement assignments up to 3 days late
- All assignments turned in 3 days past due date will not be counted and will be logged as a 0 in gradebook



School Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

DROP OFF

There is no car line for drop off. At drop-off, students may use the gates on Devonshire or Amestoy. All TK-8 parents must complete the Parent Locker Health Screener daily BUT DO NOT NEED to show the screener at drop off.

PICK UP

Middle Grades students with no siblings may walk off campus using the east gate on Devonshire (near the basketball courts). Middle grades students with siblings may use either the Devonshire or Amestoy gates.
