

# The Year in Review 2023 Annual Report

### The Year in Review

Our Long Beach Unified School District community continued to persevere through many challenges last school year to keep student achievement and wellbeing at the forefront, with a persistent focus on excellence and equity. Despite the lasting impact of a global pandemic upon our nation's schools, in LBUSD our students are showing encouraging progress.

Through our carefully designed Learning Acceleration and Support Plan, we made further, significant investments in student support. These investments will continue in the form of additional literacy and math specialists, collaboration and planning time for teachers, expanded tutoring, summer programming and enhanced early learning opportunities, and new ways of monitoring student progress using data. We're also continuing to implement a Black Student Achievement Initiative and a courageous Excellence and Equity Policy approved by our Board of Education, so that skin color is not a determining factor for student outcomes. We're focusing on the longer term, with a comprehensive strategic planning effort called Vision 2035. This effort has provided time and space for students, families, staff and community partners to help us create a vision of how LBUSD – and our students – can thrive for years to come.

We also continue to invest millions of dollars in school facility upgrades to provide a safe and comfortable learning environment, using school bond funds that local voters have graciously approved. We've accelerated our planned installation of heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) systems at several schools. All schools that are not yet fully air conditioned will have new air conditioning within the next four years (with the exception of Poly High School, where HVAC will be completed in 2028 as part of a multi-year, major campus renovation beginning in 2024-25). New athletic facilities, technology updates and additional green spaces are in the works at many campuses. A complete timeline of projects is available at lbschoolbonds.net.

Our students' progress is a testament to our dedicated team of professionals, and to everyone in our school communities who supports our important work. I deeply appreciate these collective efforts to give our students brighter futures.




#### 2022-23 Reading and Math Progress (Increase in % of Students at or Above Grade Level)


All grade levels 1 to 8 showed an increase in the percent of students scoring at or above grade level on reading and math i-Ready assessments from September 2022 to June 2023.

#### Accelerated Math 6 Placement (%)






#### **Social-Emotional Wellness**

Pulse survey results show LBUSD students in grades 6 to 12 continue to report consistent levels of positive student experiences.


