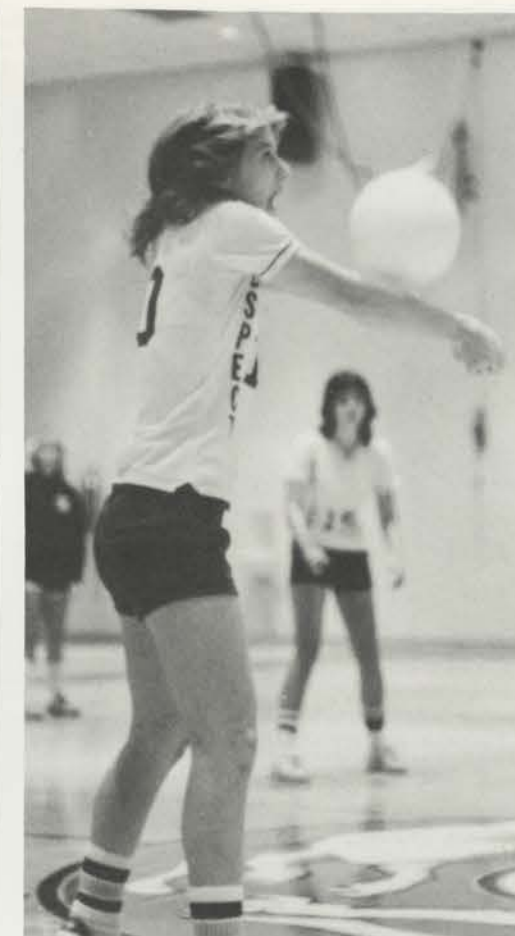

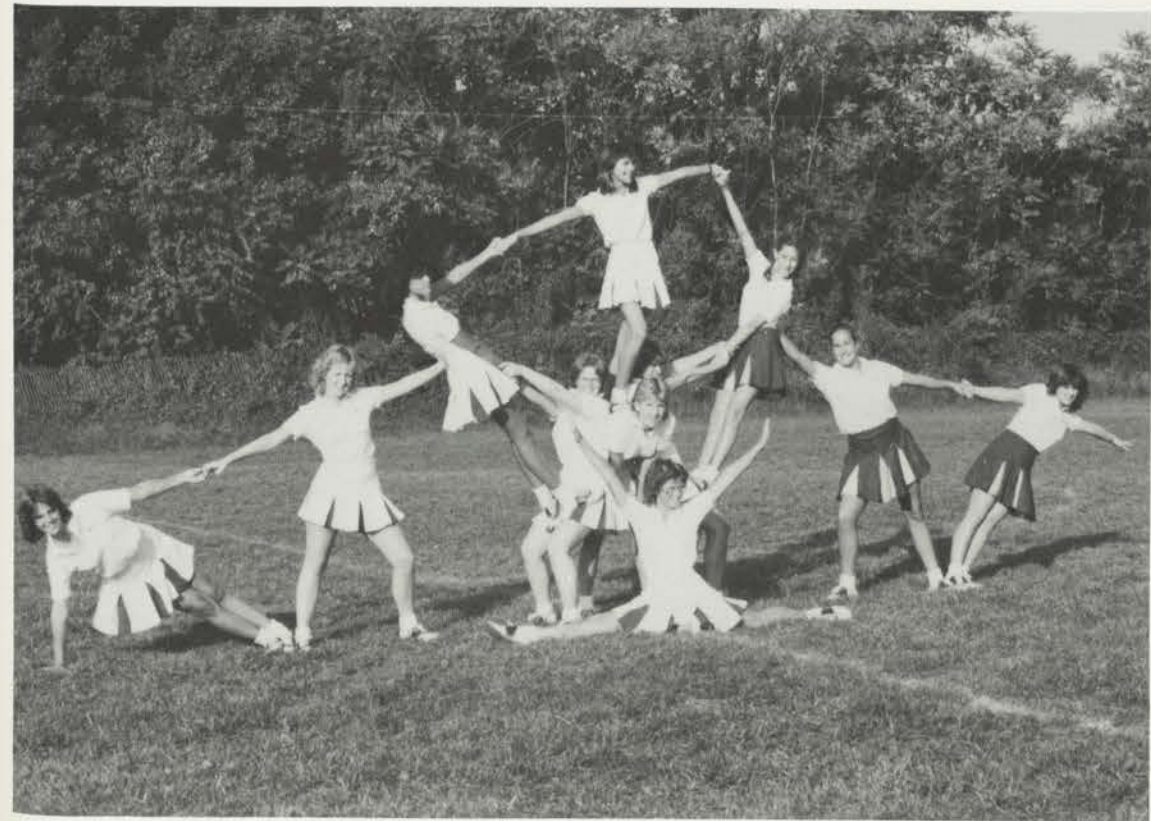

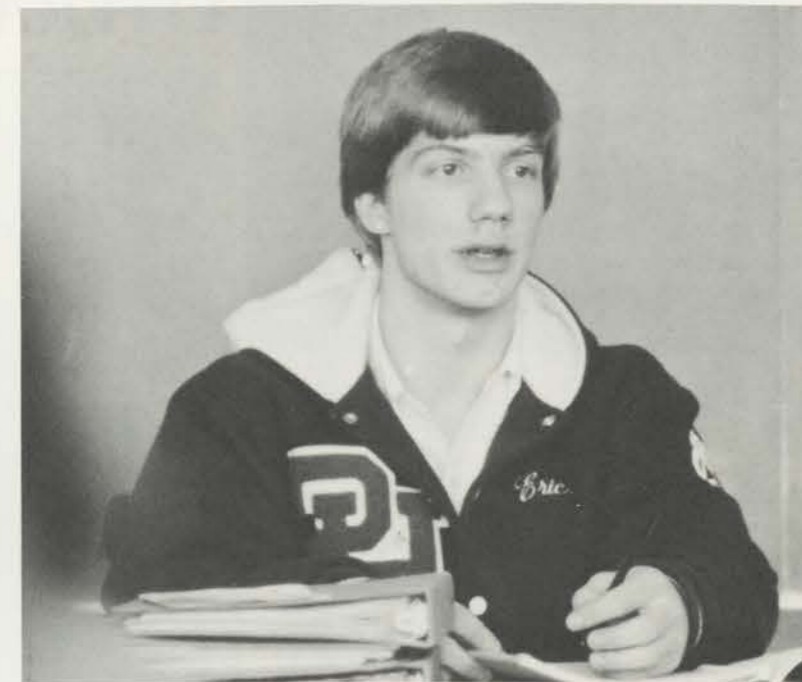


Above: Student Council's President, Theresa Ghorzi, and its Vice-President, Michael O'Connor, preside over a meeting.

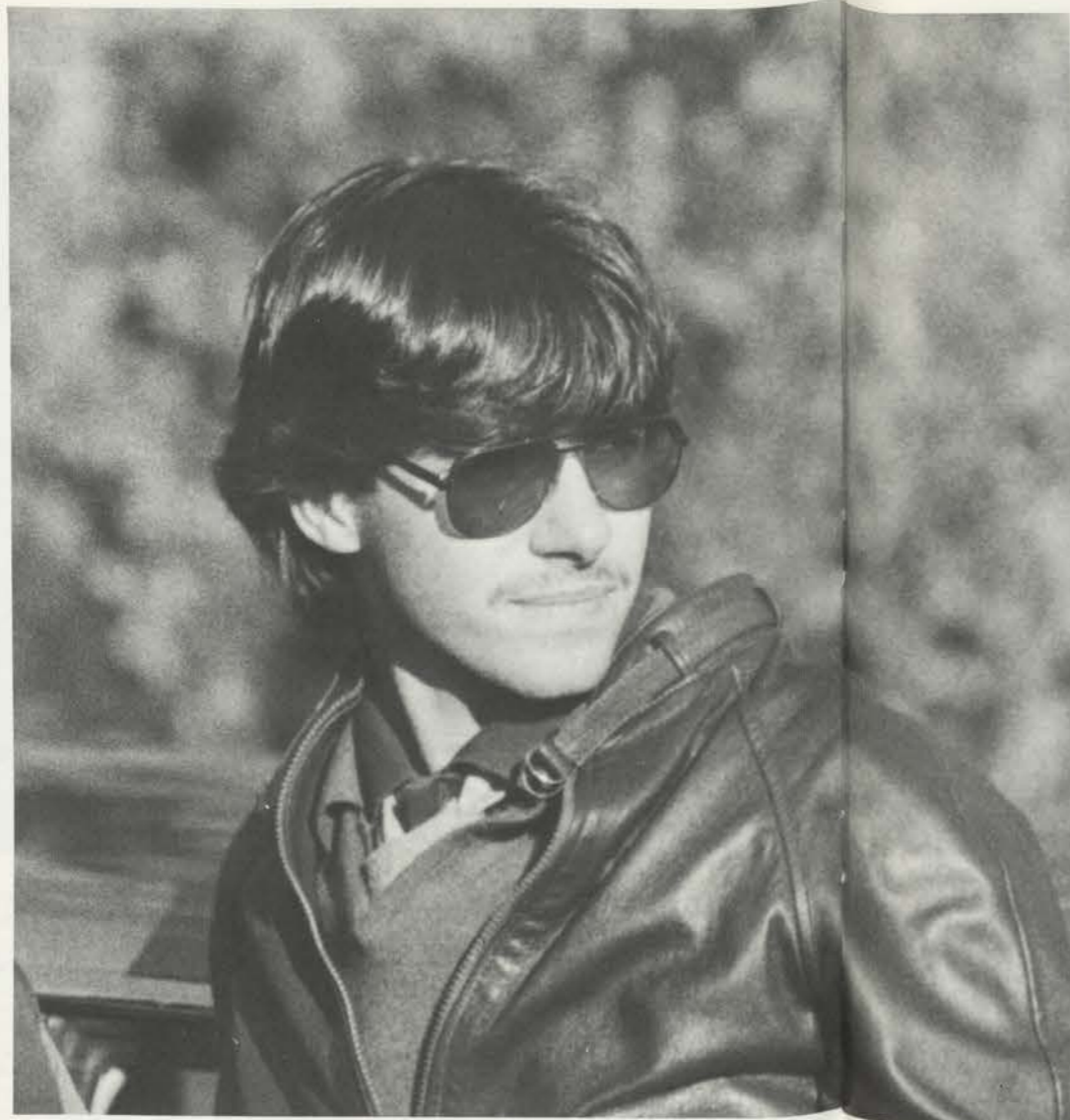
