Characteristics of Psychologist Intern

The School Psychologist Intern works with a supervising School Psychologist and is responsible for the identification, placement, and follow-up of students referred for special education assessment. The School Psychologist Intern will also provide guidance and consultation to teachers, staff, and parents and will provide counseling to special education and general education students under the supervision of the supervising School Psychologist. The School Psychologist Intern will provide written reports documenting assessment results and observations. The School Psychologist Intern will attend IEP meetings and team meetings at supervisor discretion. This position is restricted to individuals who are currently enrolled in a Master's or higher-level degree program leading to a Pupil Personnel Service Credential in School Psychology and who are required to perform field work prior to receiving their credential. The length of the assignment is limited to the time the individuals are in the training program.

Examples of Duties and Responsibilities

- Conduct psychoeducational assessments, which includes but is not limited to administering cognitive, adaptive, social-emotional, visual motor, auditory, and academic tasks
- Observe and conduct alternative assessments
- Participate in IEP meetings
- Participate in SST meetings
- Conduct initial and triennial evaluations, write reports, and present assessment results at IEP meetings
- Observe students in a variety of settings
- Consult with teachers, administrators, parents, and community resources regarding students in special education as well as students in regular education
- Plan for and provide individual, family, and group counseling services to the school community under the supervision of the school psychologist
