From Earth to Beyond -Raiders are OUR MORLD

Central Catholic takes great pride in knowing that a multitude of alumni have chosen to become professional engineers and in turn, continue to impact the functionality and safety of our world in a variety of ways.

Students graduate from CCHS with advanced math and science courses that provide a solid base to build a strong knowledge of robotics, computer science, physics, chemistry, biology, environmental science, and calculus.

Specifically, juniors and seniors can enroll in "Engineer Your World" – a six-unit multifaceted engineering course that introduces students to careers in engineering and computer science, with a focus on problem-solving.

Students move on from CCHS well-equipped to further their engineering expertise at prestigious technology institutions including Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Georgia Institute of Technology, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Worcester Polytechnic Institute, University of Massachusetts, and many more.

The following feature introduces just a sampling of some CCHS graduates who have chosen to share their professional engineering skills with the world. We look forward to witnessing what the next generation of Raider engineers has in store to improve and advance our lives.



ALBERT C. PETERSON '50 Life-Long Defense Industry Engineer

An incredibly loyal Raider – **Albert C. Peterson '50** – spent his professional years as a talented Mechanical Engineer, working on a variety of important government projects that ultimately supported the United States Military.

After graduating from Central Catholic in 1950, Al headed to Lowell Technological Institute (now UMass Lowell) and graduated with a degree in Mechanical Engineering, specializing in manufacturing engineering.

"CCHS taught me how to be very ethical and trustworthy in all my endeavors," said Al. "This made me well respected with my dealings at work and in life. In the classroom, I was fortunate to have had excellent math teachers in Br. George Camille and Br. Philip Bernard and the Engineering Drawing class I took convinced me I should pursue an engineering career."

Al's first professional engineering position was as a Design Engineer at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard where he designed hydraulic, ventilation air conditioning systems and conducted stress analysis calculations for submarine components.

"One of my professional highlights was as a one-time volunteer conducting sound tests in a submarine 200 feet below the surface of the ocean," said Al.

After his time at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, Al fulfilled his military duty at the U.S. Army Aberdeen Proving Ground in Maryland. "As I was critically employed in the defense industry, I spent six months of active duty and six years of on-call reserve duty."

Through his previous professional and military experience, he knew for certain that he wanted to pursue a hands-on engineering career.

Al learned that Raytheon Technologies was establishing a major manufacturing facility in Andover, MA and that's exactly where he wanted to be."I interviewed and was hired as a Manufacturing Engineer responsible for the assembly and test of the hydraulic power supply unit, various hydraulic servo-valves, and several electromechanical devices," said Al. "I was also responsible for the test area's hydraulic and high-pressure pneumatic setup and operating systems."

Based on Al's impressive performance, he was appointed to overall plant responsibility including the coordination of field return projects and several other important assignments surrounding a newly designed pressure vessel.

After about five years, he was promoted to Group Supervisor of 20 engineers who were responsible for the manufacturing methodology for several electromechanical assemblies used in the Hawk Missile and Hawk Ground Support radar and communication equipment.

Al's impressive mechanical knowledge led him to coordinating the rebuild of several Missile Guidance Systems damaged by water during the Cuban Missile Crisis.

After a few years as a supervisor, there was a need for an engineering group to plan the manufacturing of new products to be built at Raytheon's Andover plant.

"I was selected and promoted to Department Manager of Manufacturing Engineering Advanced Planning leading a group responsible for planning the equipment, tooling, cost estimates, produceability studies, and manufacturing methodology for hundreds of devices that made up AT&T's Missile Site Radar and the Patriot Missile and Ground Support Systems. After over 20 years in this role, Al completed his career at Raytheon as a Department Project Manager.

Al spent a total of 34 years at Raytheon Technologies (Andover, MA) and is now enjoying his well-earned retirement.

NASA Senior Launch **Applications Engineer**

Kennedy Space Center, Cape Canaveral, FL

Raider Nation found its way to the Kennedy Space Center in Florida thanks to Edwin Corporan '97, who serves as a contractor for NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration), an independent agency of the U.S. Government responsible for the civil space program, aeronautics and space research.

Edwin was selected as one of seven Systems Engineers tasked with the effort of upgrading the Kennedy Space Center Launch Control System (LCS) in preparation for the Artemis I mission (EM-I). The Artemis I mission marked the return to lunar exploration since the conclusion of the Apollo program five decades ago. The mission also showcased the SLS rocket, the most powerful launch vehicle ever built in the history of NASA.

"It was truly a dream come true being part of such a historic event as SLS launched successfully on Nov 16, 2022 from the Kennedy Space Center's Launch Complex 39B in Florida," said Edwin. "I'm very thankful to God for the unforgettable experience. I know it will make a great story to tell my grandchildren someday."

Working as a Launch Control Systems Engineer (Launch Applications Thread Lead) for the Artemis I Mission, Edwin was in charge of performing engineering analysis tasks and managing requirements to prepare the Kennedy Space Center Launch Control System Launch Applications for the Artemis I mission.

"Launch Applications are the heart and soul of the Kennedy Space Center Launch Control System," said Edwin."They deal primarily with the Command and Control (C&C) of the various systems that heavily interact with the KSC Launch Control System, as well as performing diagnostics and receiving telemetry before and during launch from various systems. These include the SLS rocket, the Orion Capsule, the Mobile Launcher, among many others."





Edwin's fascination with space exploration started at a very young age.

"When I was a little boy in the Dominican Republic watching shows like Lost in Space (Perdidos en El Espacio), I was dreaming what it would be like to be in space," said Edwin. "I remember clearly after migrating to the U.S. (Lawrence, MA) at the age of ten (I did not speak English) and seeing a soft drink tv commercial that showed the Space Shuttle launching from Cape Canaveral FL, with this mesmerizing song (Space Oddity) playing in the background. It was after watching these iconic unforgettable images for the first time on tv that I begin dreaming that someday I would have the opportunity to work at NASA and be part of the space program."

Edwin's dreams were ignited as a student at Central Catholic! From his math, science and english classes that prepared him to succeed as an engineering student in college, all the way to Religious Studies that encouraged Edwin's faith in God when he had to navigate through life's challenges.

"I was very blessed with all the teachers and coaches I had at Central, they were all very helpful," said Edwin. "**Mr. Christopher Sullivan '81** (current CCHS President) was a great mentor to me in my time at Central, and **Mrs. Kriner's** (**Mrs. Jodi Linnehan Kriner**, Dir. of Innovation and Academic Technologies at CCHS) Computer Applications class was what sparked my curiosity and inspired me to learn more about computers since I was not familiar with them at all." "I'm very thankful to God for the unforgettable experience. I know it will make a great story to tell my grandchildren someday."

After graduating from CCHS in 1997, Edwin earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering with a concentration in Computer Science from the University of Massachusetts (Lowell, MA).

"For me, I really enjoyed that Central fosters an atmosphere of excellence and faith," said Edwin. "I love challenging myself and doing everything to the best of my ability, and at Central, I was always reminded by my teachers and coaches to live up to those standards. Everything I learned at Central has helped contribute to where I am today."

ROSA R. REYNOSO '16

Component Test Engineer, GE Aviation

Rosa Reynoso Cruz '16 has a future that is taking off... and she can actually design the engine propelling her success!

Rosa recently graduated from GE Aerospace's Edison Engineering Development Program (EEDP), which is the oldest of all GE's early career rotational programs.

As part of the program, she completed an intense Advanced Course in Engineering and multiple additional foundational trainings, all while working full-time through rotational assignments in Life and Mission Analysis, Mechanical Systems Design, and Test Engineering.

"Throughout the program, I was integrated into GE's team of engineers, and worked to deliver solutions to real problems that have a big impact on GE's businesses and customers," said Rosa. "EEDP gave me such a great technical background and exposure to a wide range of the engineering spectrum including hardware development, design, testing, and manufacturing."

Rosa now works at GE Aerospace (Lynn, MA) as a Component Test Engineer, specially focusing on fluid dynamics.

"I love working at GE and hope to gain lots of technical expertise with this new role," said Rosa. "I have always been fascinated by the aviation industry and its ability to connect people and cultures across the globe. I hope to be a part of the future of this industry and push forward innovation specifically within fluid dynamics." Rosa's interest in learning the mechanics behind how systems work began at Central Catholic. During her sophomore year, Rosa was awarded the Society of Women Engineers Merit Award for High Honors in Math & Science.

"I would not be here today if not for the help of my CCHS community."

"My science teacher, **Mr. King (Mr. Dennis King, Science Teacher)**, motivated and inspired me to think about a career in engineering," said Rosa. "He constantly reassured me that I earned my spot at the table. I am so proud to be from Lawrence and a CCHS alum. I would not be here today if not for the help of my CCHS community."

After graduating from Central Catholic in 2016 (she was named the Br. Florentius Memorial Award recipient), Rosa attended Worcester Polytechnic Institute (WPI) and graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering (2020).

While at WPI – Rosa made quite the impression, earning her place on the Dean's List every semester, and participating in the Mechanical Engineering Honor Society (Pi Tau Sigma) and the Engineering Honor Society (Tau Beta Pi) - both nationally-recognized organizations.

During the summer of 2019, Rosa participated in a tenweek Research Experience for Undergraduates (REU) Program at the Princeton Institute for the Science and Technology of Materials (PRISM)/Princeton Center for Complex Materials (PCCM). She worked within the Aerospace Department researching ThermoFluids and lived on the Princeton University campus throughout the internship.

During her junior year, she was one of five students to receive the Marietta E. Anderson Award - WPI's Outstanding Women's Awards, recognizing female students for their academic excellence, professional goals, and contributions to the WPI community.

Throughout her college experience, Rosa traveled three times to Cuenca, Ecuador with WPI's Engineers Without Borders, working with a small community called El Cisne de Conchan. "What I love most about Engineers Without Borders is that both the technical and social part of the project are considered equally important – it really gives the community a sense of ownership and pride." "Ever since I can remember, I have always felt the need to give back to those facing many of the same adversities I had struggled to overcome growing up as a Dominican immigrant in Lawrence," said Rosa. "This desire and longing to give back to my home is what ultimately motivated me to become an engineer – so I could use my technical knowledge to help build communities through infrastructure, technology, and innovation. I want to empower communities that are often overlooked and forgotten."

Rosa is projected to complete her Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering from Boston University in the Spring of 2024. She also still volunteers at "her second home" the Boys and Girls Club of Lawrence.

A Window into the Lives of Professional Engineers

Beyond math and science courses, juniors and seniors at Central Catholic can gain a broad-stroke view of the engineering profession through the innovative course **Engineering Your World**, taught by seasoned CCHS science teacher **Mr.Timothy Vaughan**.

Licensed through the University of Texas, the course offers a hands-on high school engineering design curriculum for students who want to learn about engineering as a profession and its role in shaping our world.

Students engage in authentic engineering practices in a project-based environment and complete a series of socially relevant design challenges to develop engineering design skills and habits of mind.

"I try to impress upon my students throughout the year that the skills they learn in this course will benefit them regardless of their future profession," said Mr.Vaughan. "It has been very rewarding to have former students from this class reach out to me and let me know they used some of the skill sets and techniques they learned in this course to help them on a team project in a college setting, and even in a professional setting."

Engineering Your World focuses more on the habits and mindsets of an engineer as they go through the engineering design process.

"It's wonderful when a student who had no interest in pursuing engineering in college tells me they changed their mind after taking the course and now wants to become an engineer," said Mr.Vaughan.

Welcome to the G. THOMAS '50 & MARIE CATALANO MEMORIAL LIBRARY

Several members of the Catalano family and Central Catholic faculty, staff, alumni and students gathered on May 18, 2023 to celebrate two beloved and selfless Raiders – the late **G.Thomas '50** and his wife **Marie (Galvagna) Catalano**.

The event marked the dedication, blessing and official renaming of the library to the **G.Thomas '50 & Marie Catalano Memorial Library** – a location honoring the incredible philanthropic support provided by the Catalanos, who were instrumental in responding to the critical needs of Central Catholic multiple times over the years.

Tom and Marie are Central Catholic's most generous philanthropists in the history of the school, giving over \$1.4 million dollars to support a multitude of CCHS initiatives, including an endowed scholarship - the **G.Thomas ('50)** & Marie Catalano Fund.

Their generosity ensured that hundreds of Central Catholic students have - and will continue to make - incredible advances in the arts, technology and sciences. Tom was also willing and able to take on leadership roles on Central's Board of Directors several times. The couple also included Central Catholic in their estate plans.

The library dedication ceremony was kicked off by **Mr. David Erwin P'24**, Chief Advancement Officer as he welcomed those in attendance and described Tom and Marie Catalano as "kind, considerate and philanthropic individuals."

After **Br. Rene Roy '59**, President Emeritus and Campus Minister, gave the blessing for the renaming ceremony, Board Chair **Mr. Peter J. Rayno '78** commented on Tom Catalano serving as one of the first lay Chairs of the Board and being "taken aback by his passion and commitment to Central Catholic."

The highlight of the event was when Tom and Marie Catalano's grandson **Andrew Scott '09** spoke about how important Central Catholic was to his grandfather.



"Central Catholic was an integral part of my grandfather's life – it was in his blood, flesh and bones and he had immense pride in his roots," said Andrew. "Central was the foundation of how my grandfather's dreams were built, and his generosity continues to help countless others call CCHS home."

G.Thomas Catalano '50 served as one of Central Catholic's earliest Board members and Board Chairs. He and his wife Marie were incredibly generous to Central Catholic throughout their lives, providing significant support for growth in STEM, expansion of programs, and physical campus growth and improvements.

Upon their passing, they remembered Central Catholic in a meaningful way, and we celebrate them and their legacy with this special re-naming of our library.

Introducing the G. Thomas '50 & Marie Catalano Memorial Library, and the Allan B. Rogers Memorial Theater

Two important locations on the Central Catholic campus now proudly hold the names of generous individuals who kept Central's mission close to their hearts and gave of themselves for the betterment of our school.

Welcome to the ALLAN B. ROGERS MEMORIAL THEATER

For over 50 years, the Rogers Memorial Theater - which lies geographically and functionally at the heart of Central Catholic's programs on the CCHS campus - has been home to over 100 plays and musicals, and over 400 performances by a variety of student performers.

On June 3, 2023, members of the CCHS community and Rogers family gathered to officially rededicate the newly renovated theater to **Allan B. Rogers Memorial Theater**, in honor of Allan B. Rogers, the late son of Irving E. Rogers (*deceased*), former publisher of the Eagle-Tribune newspaper.

The Rogers Family Foundation, whose generous grant of \$100,000 combined with the \$60,000 CCHS students raised in Walk 2021, launched the full-scale recent renovation of the Allan B. Rogers Memorial Theater. The new features include surround sound speakers, handheld and Lavalier theatrical microphones, digital touchscreen controls for all systems, 32-channel sound and lighting control boards, a variety of high-level lighting fixtures, refinishing all theater walls, theater carpeting and refinished floors, and aisle lighting.

The rededication ceremony was kicked off by **Mr. David DeFillippo '66, CCHS Advancement Associate**, who touched upon the history of the theater and the strong connection to the Rogers Family.

"The Allan B. Rogers Memorial Theater provides a beautiful venue for a host of guest speakers, school prayer services, classroom-related films, student grade-level assemblies, choral concerts, rehearsals, academic club activities, and so much more," said David. "Generations of the Rogers family have and continue to play a visionary and supportive role in strengthening the educational experience and mission of Central Catholic."

Central Catholic President Christopher Sullivan '81 also spoke of his years as a paperboy for the Eagle-Tribune and his memorable days in the Theatre Guild as a CCHS student performing in the theater. Br. Kenneth V. Hogan,



FMS, member of the CCHS Board of Directors, offered a rededication prayer and blessing.

Amy Rogers Dittrich, daughter of the late Allan B. Rogers and granddaughter of Irving E. Rogers, spoke proudly of the strong historical bonds that have existed between CCHS and generations of her family.

Rogers Dittrich, who established the Rogers Family Foundation and serves as the Managing Trustee, addressed the foundation's goal of "supporting non-profit, cultural, artistic and educational organizations, such as Central Catholic, who bring vitality to the life of communities in Essex County."

The Foundation has also invested consistently and generously in the Montagne Scholars initiative at Central Catholic, permitting scores of students from low-income families to be able to attend Central Catholic High School.

Those who attended the rededication event enjoyed lively performances by students in the CCHS Jazz Band, Theatre Guild, Concert Choir and the Studebops Rock Band to help demonstrate the technical capabilities of the recently renovated Allan B. Rogers Memorial Theater.

The evening was capped off with a celebratory reception honoring Amy Rogers Dittrich and the Rogers Family Foundation.
