The 25,000+ strong alumni body of Central Catholic, Presentation of Mary Academy, and Saint Mary High School is bursting at the seams with successful business owners, executives, and various leaders in the world of business and entrepreneurship.

Their interest in leading business - a competitive arena requiring honed skills and a defined acumen to rise to the top - began at 300 Hampshire Street.

The Business & Technology Department at Central Catholic has become somewhat of an incubator for budding entrepreneurs and future executives.

Beyond the standard business courses, CCHS students interested in expanding their business knowledge can do so through a variety of courses and unique competitions.

One such course is Honors Introduction to Entrepreneurship, taught by Mr. Matthew Sansoucie '06, Chair of the Business & Technology Department. Students build a solid foundation on entrepreneurship, introducing them to vital roles played by entrepreneurs and entrepreneurship in the 21st century global economy. The course also offers dual enrollment (college credit) with Syracuse University.

Throughout the course, students assess, explore, critique, and celebrate the phenomenon of entrepreneurship, with an emphasis placed on entrepreneurship as a manageable process that can be applied in virtually any organizational setting.

Particular focus is placed on the creation of new ventures, the way they become into being, and factors associated with their success.

"What I love about the course is that we cover a variety of topics including marketing, advertising, finance, accounting and general business knowledge," said Matthew Sansoucie. "Students can figure out what they like and dislike about business and entrepreneurship and continue to pursue their interests at CCHS and beyond."

The course integrates theory with practice, and students are challenged to immerse themselves in the principles, concepts, and framework of real world situations.

Students in Honors Introduction to Entrepreneurship apply what they learn in exciting and unique ways such as a competition which started on campus in 2022 modeled after the popular television show "Shark Tank."

Where the actual television show has three judges or "sharks" watch entrepreneurs pitch products or services and ask for a percentage of investment, the CCHS Shark Tank has student-entrepreneurs pitch their best ideas and compete against each other for a faux "\$25,000" investment from three real life entrepreneurs – our very own "sharks." In addition to Intro to Honors Entrepreneurship, CCHS offers a variety of business courses taught by skilled educators including Personal Finance, Investments (stocks & bonds), and Economics, to name just a few.

Outside of the classroom, students also have the opportunity to spread their business wings through the incredibly successful club DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America), moderated by teachers Mr. Matthew Sansoucie '06 and Mrs. Laura Reid, School & College Counseling.

DECA prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs in marketing, finance, hospitality, and management in high schools and colleges around the globe.

Over 100 students participate in this club to compete against other schools in a number of business-related areas including hospitality, tourism, finance, marketing, business management, entrepreneurship, apparel and accessories and much more.

This year, an unprecedented 46 Raiders qualified for the State DECA Conference in Boston, MA based on their

performance at the **DECA District 3 Career** Development Conference. Several CCHS DECA participants also qualify for nationals and international almost every year.

There is truly no limit to what our students can accomplish on and off campus through participating in business-focused education and activities at Central Catholic.





Leadership (Development & Empowerment) - Strive to build confidence and leadership skills within our female students and student-athletes. Seminars and workshops will empower students to succeed personally and to make an impact on the world while embracing the Marist ideals of humility, kindness, and integrity.

Equity (A Level Playing Field) - Strive to provide equal opportunities for our female student-athletes and put them in a situation to compete and excel on a level playing field. Guided by a sense of fair play and equity, we will reinforce the self-worth and significant potential of each student by recognizing their efforts and providing the resources they need to succeed.

"Through this initiative, I hope to make the experience for female student-athletes even better than my own experience," said Olivia. "I was fortunate to have great coaches at CCHS and I want to help current female student-athletes become great leaders, have the ability to focus on mental and physical health, and be the best teammates, and best (leaders/employees) in the future."

An additional program through the Imprescia Center is the "SHE WILL" Fund, which through a series of workshops, seminars and networking events, will help provide CCHS female student-athletes the qualities and skills needed to succeed in sport and life as they develop into strong, female leaders.

The Fund has already brought a special presentation to campus focusing on life coaching approaches for female student-athletes.

The Center also aims to support a more active young alumni connection, where current female student-athletes can interact with those who have recently gone on to be successful in a variety of sports and professional fields.

"We are so very grateful to Olivia (Imprescia '14) Burger, who has lent her generous support to help Central Catholic launch the Imprescia Center for Female Sports Leadership," said Mr. Christopher Sullivan '81, CCHS President. 
