**Recommendation:** Approval of one new policy, and approval of recommendation to eliminate two existing policies. These policies were previously presented for board consideration and discussion at the Board of Education Meeting on February 23, 2026.

**Background:** The Board of Education and the District adhere to a regular policy review process to ensure: timely and appropriate updates to existing policies; the implementation of new policies as warranted; the elimination of outdated / conflicting policies; and grammatical / language revisions as needed.

#7115 - Denial of Access to School Premises or Activities (Community Relations) - This proposed new policy is from KSB's policy book. The District already issues "ban-and-bar" notices as we are allowed to do by law. This policy would: 1) provide notice to the public that we can and will ban people from our property under appropriate circumstances; and 2) provide a policy basis for us to do so.

#7140 - Request to Contact Students - Propose elimination of this policy; subject matter is covered in policy #5315 (Access to Students by Law Enforcement and other Agencies).

#7180 - Visits to the Schools - Propose elimination of this policy; subject matter is covered in policy #6320 (Review of / Access to Educational Materials) and the Student / Parent Handbook.

**TITLE: DENIAL OF ACCESS TO SCHOOL PREMISES OR ACTIVITIES**  
**NUMBER: 7115**

The District shall provide access to the District's buildings, grounds and activities to students, parents or guardians of students, and other persons who have legitimate reasons for being on District property. The Superintendent, or his or her designee (referred to herein as the "Administrator"), may limit or deny access to District buildings, grounds, and activities to any person who:

1. Disrupts the educational environment;
2. Repeatedly fails or refuses to comply with the visitor protocol adopted by each building;
3. Is unreasonably boisterous;
4. Engages in violence, force, coercion, threats, intimidation, or similar conduct;
5. Causes or attempts to cause damage to District property or to the property of any student or District employee;
6. Causes or attempts to cause personal injury to any student, District employee or other person on school grounds or at a District activity on or off school grounds;
7. Uses vulgar, profane, or demeaning language; or
8. Uses fighting words;
9. Poses a danger to the safety and well-being of students.

Upon determining that a person has engaged in, or is engaging in, conduct that constitutes grounds for exclusion under this Policy, the Administrator shall take such action as he or she determines appropriate, including directing the person to cease engaging in the conduct or to leave the premises or activity immediately. The Administrator may request assistance from law enforcement authorities to remove an offending person from the District grounds.

The Administrator shall have the authority to fix the time when, and the conditions under which, the offending person may return to District premises. A person who enters District premises in violation of these conditions shall be deemed to be trespassing. The Administrator may summon law enforcement authorities to remove the person and request that criminal proceedings be initiated.

~~Parents and others in the community are urged to visit the schools in order to participate in activities and gain a greater understanding of the operation of the school and school system.~~

~~The following guidelines should be met:~~

- ~~● Parents or guardians of school children and other authorized persons may visit in the schools any school day. All visitors will report to the school office before visiting in the building.~~
- ~~● Parents may schedule meetings with principals or teachers at any time mutually acceptable to those involved. Staff members will be available for parent and student conferences at least forty-five minutes after school dismissal.~~
- ~~● All children below school age who are visiting in the school building shall be accompanied by a parent or guardian.~~
- ~~● Students from other buildings are welcome to visit schools as long as the visit has been approved, generally in advance, by the building principal.~~
