Recommendation(s): The purpose of this presentation is to share an overview of the district's efforts to expand in-district capacity and strengthen behavioral support for students. This includes increasing the capacity of the elementary i66 program, establishing a new program for K-6 complex learners, creating an Alternative to Suspension Program (ASP), and piloting a new alternative program for middle school students at West Campus, all aimed at fostering a safe and effective learning environment.

Background: The district identified the importance of expanding in-district capacity to better serve students with behavioral challenges, with the goal of protecting the safety, belonging, and learning environment for all students. The district continues to prioritize and take additional steps that strengthen our ability to respond to challenging behavior earlier and more effectively, ensuring staff have the support they need to keep student learning on track.
