As such, I will continue to actively contribute to the school and help us move boldly into the future. What I know for sure is that Benchmark will continue to soar, regardless of my position at the school. Benchmark is filled with extraordinary people who are transforming students' lives every day, and nothing about that will change. The drive to excel has been part of the DNA of this community for the past 50 years, and I know it will continue to be a fundamental component of this school long into the future.
