#### **Position Summary**

Lunchroom & playground monitors manage the flow of students in and out of the cafeteria during lunch hours, supervise children at play during recess, monitor student behavior, assist children as needed, and assist the administrator on duty.

#### Primary Job Responsibilities

- Be on campus at 11 am, ready to supervise, and stay until all students are finished with lunch and off the playground.
- Manage the flow of students during lunch hours
- Circulate in designated areas while monitoring students' behavior
- Help children problem solve
- Try to anticipate problem situations and student needs
- Greet children, help them find what they need, and follow behavior expectations

- Help with the organized dismissal of the children
- Set up lunch tray disposal areas with a cart, tub of soapy water, and hot water
- Wipe off/sanitize tables after departing students, readying tables for next grade level
- Make yourself available to and follow the lead of the administrator on duty.
- Inform teachers and administrators of problems and accidents
- If an accident occurs, fill out an Accident Report Form and submit it to the Assistant Principal
- Read and become familiar with the Playground Monitor's Handbook and RH Policy and Procedure Manual
- Other duties as assigned
