TASB Policy

This information is provided for educational purposes only to facilitate a general understanding of the law or other regulatory matter. 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Update 111 focuses on updating (LEGAL) policies that were affected by changes in law from the 85th Legislative Session and recent administrative rule changes. Several (LOCAL) policies have been updated to better align with changes in law or administrative rules or for organizational and restructuring purposes.

InnovationPolicy AF(LEGAL) has been updated to include provisions from revised Ad-
ministrative Code rules that address the laws from which an innovation dis-
trict may not be exempted and clarify a district's posting and notification re-
sponsibilities regarding an innovation plan.

Accountability Additional provisions from the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) have been included in AID(LEGAL) to address the requirements for the district's plan that must be in place to receive certain Title I funds, the identification of schools needing support and improvement, and the district's required actions when schools in the district are identified for support and improvement.

DistrictSignificant changes have been made at BBD(LEGAL) to reflect revised Ad-Governanceministrative Code rules, including:

Board Training

- Information addressing the State Board of Education (SBOE) commendations for board-superintendent teams that effectively implement the commissioner's trustee improvement and evaluation tool or any other tool approved by the commissioner;
 - Clarification that team building must be at least three hours in length and that the local orientation can occur one year before or 120 days after the board member's election or appointment; and
 - Stemming from Senate Bill 1566 (85th Legislative Session), the new requirement that each board member must complete a three-hour continuing education training every two years on evaluating student performance.

The administrative rules also specify that the report on board members' continuing education must occur at the last regular board meeting before the board election and that this information must be reflected in the board meeting minutes. If a board member is deficient in continuing education credit as of the anniversary of his or her joining the board, in addition to the deficiency being announced during the board meeting, the deficiency must be posted on the district's website within ten business days of the meeting and must remain posted until the trustee meets the requirements.

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BBD(LOCAL) POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The changes in the administrative rules have also been addressed at BBD(LOCAL). As a best practice to promote transparency, the recommended text provides that the board president will annually announce the status of a board member's continuing education credit at the last regular board meeting before the district's regular uniform election date, even if an election is not scheduled or held. If the district will have a different practice, a policy adjustment will be needed.

Superintendent Revisions have been made to several policies addressing the superintendent's employment, including BJCE(LEGAL) to remove a reference to an outdated Fifth Circuit court case and BJCG(LEGAL) to align the policy text with statute. The text now included in BJC(LEGAL) is existing statutory text permitting the board to amend the terms of a superintendent contract on the basis of a declared financial exigency.

Similar to the revision at BJCE(LEGAL), references to the outdated court case have been deleted from DCE(LEGAL) and DFBA(LEGAL).

ReportsThe list of reports at BR(LEGAL) has been updated to include the report on
board member continuing education training and to remove the requirement
for a district not participating in TRS ActiveCare to file a compliance report
with TRS, although the district must still prepare a compliance report.

FinancesPolicy CBB(LEGAL) has been significantly reworked to provide more thor-
ough coverage of the relevant laws on retirement and insurance contributions
and the Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR).

FinancialRevisions to CFA(LEGAL), the policy on financial reports and statements, in-
corporate new administrative rules that address the district's annual local
debt report.

Investments The definition of "business organization" has been moved in CDA(LEGAL) to clarify that it only applies to the provisions on sellers of investments, which require a district to provide a written copy of its investment policy to any business organization offering to engage in an investment with the district.

Financial Ethics

CAA(LOCAL) POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

CAA(LOCAL) addresses fraud and financial impropriety. Local policy language is recommended to clarify that fraud reports may be made to any person with authority to investigate the alleged activity, including to any of the other individuals currently listed in the policy. This aligns the policy text with state law, which prohibits a district from requiring an employee to report only to certain persons a crime witnessed at the school.

Safety and Security

Criminal History

Effective November 29, 2017, Administrative Code rules addressing criminal history of service contractors were repealed, which prompted revisions throughout CJA(LEGAL). Provisions have been reorganized for consistency with the criminal history requirements for certain public contractors, and existing statutory provisions were added to address the district's authority to obtain Department of Public Safety (DPS) criminal history record information.

CJA(LOCAL) POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Policy CJA(LOCAL) includes provisions as permitted by state law that authorize the district employee in charge of a facility to determine whether an employee of a contracting or subcontracting entity, who does not have the required criminal history review or who has a disqualifying conviction, will be permitted to enter a district facility in an emergency accompanied by district staff.

Regarding employees, DBAA(LEGAL) has been revised to include amended administrative rules specifying that the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) may sanction an educator who hires an applicant even if the educator knew that applicant had been adjudicated for or convicted of having an inappropriate relationship with a minor.

Security Personnel Revisions at CKE(LEGAL), addressing security personnel, include a reference to a court case regarding complaints against district peace officers. Additional details from administrative rules on the school marshal program were added, which permit the district to pay for required marshal training and address required reports to the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE).

Firearms

DH(LOCAL) AND GKA(LOCAL) POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Most districts' policies at DH(LOCAL) and GKA(LOCAL) provide that the district's prohibition against firearms on district property is not violated when a Texas handgun license holder, whether an employee or a non-employee, stores a handgun or other firearm in a locked vehicle in a district parking area, provided the handgun or other firearm is not loaded and is not in plain view. However, the interplay of state and federal law would permit a district to revise this policy to allow such a person to have a loaded handgun or firearm under these circumstances. If the board would

like to revise these policies to permit loaded firearms, have your superintendent contact the district's policy consultant.

District Operations Pest Management	The integrated pest management program (IPM) provisions have been up- dated in CLB(LEGAL) as a result of new administrative rules effective Janu- ary 9, 2018. The revisions include new definitions, more details on the re- quired parental notifications regarding application of pesticides [also added at FD(LEGAL)], and new provisions to address emergency exceptions to the no- tice requirements and potential waivers from inspections.		
Facility Standards	Significant revisions have been made to CS(LEGAL), the policy on facility standards, to provide more complete coverage of relevant laws, to include a recent attorney general opinion regarding application of the International Er ergy Conservation Code to public school buildings, and to better match stat tory wording.		
Other District Operations	Other legally referenced policies addressing district operations have also been updated, including:		
	The deletion of outdated administrative rules in CQA(LEGAL) that re- quired the district to post locally determined performance ratings and compliance status on the district's website.		
	 Minor revisions to CNB(LEGAL) to better reflect statute regarding dis- trict vehicles. 		
	The removal of a state law provision in CO(LEGAL), regarding food services, that was no longer aligned with federal law.		
Curriculum and Instruction	EHAD(LEGAL) has been revised to include current administrative require- ments for a driver education course.		
Instruction	Provisions addressing dual credit programs have been revised in EHDD(LEGAL) to reflect amended administrative rules, which require dual- credit partnership agreements to address defined sequences of courses where applicable.		
Instructional Materials	Policy EFB(LEGAL) has been updated to include the revised standards for school library programs adopted by the Texas State Library and Archives Commission. A district must consider the standards in developing, implement- ing, or expanding its library services.		
	The changes at CMD(LEGAL) regarding instructional materials have been made to more closely match statutory provisions.		

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Campus Charters	ELA(LEGAL) is a new legally referenced policy that includes material on part- nership charters. The new administrative rules provide significant guidance for districts that choose to contract with a partner to operate a district campus to receive accountability and financial benefits in accordance with state law. With the addition of this new legally referenced policy, all provisions address- ing partnership charters have been removed from EL(LEGAL).
School Calendar	Effective with the 2018–19 school year, House Bill 2442 (85th Legislative Session) impacted two legally referenced policies, EB(LEGAL) and EC(LEGAL).
	Policy EB(LEGAL) has been revised to clarify that the required 75,600 minutes are for operation, not just instruction. Provisions also permit the commissioner to reduce funding to a district providing fewer than 75,600 minutes of operation. New provisions also allow exemptions from the minimum minutes of operation for certain instructional programs.
	Removed from EC(LEGAL) is the provision requiring a school day to be at least seven hours long and a day of instruction to include 420 minutes of instruction, since this requirement has been deleted from statute.
	A similar revision has been made at FOCA(LEGAL) to remove the require- ment that a school day at a disciplinary alternative education placement (DAEP) program be between seven and ten hours long.
State Assessments	At EKB(LEGAL), the policy addressing state assessments, the list of conduct that violates the security and confidentiality of a state assessment has been updated to match the <i>2018 Test Security Supplement</i> . The list of penalties has also been updated to permit the imposition of additional conditions or re- strictions upon an SBEC certificate to aid in the rehabilitation and profes- sional development of the educator who violated test security or confidential- ity or to protect students, parents, school officials, or personnel. EKBA(LEGAL) has been revised to remove outdated provisions associated with the repeal of administrative rules and the removal of inapplicable lan- guage related to the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS).
Special Education	Legally referenced policies addressing special education services have been updated to reflect:
	 Current Administrative Code rules on transition planning [see EHBAB(LEGAL) and EHBAD(LEGAL)]; and
	 Appropriate legal citations and additional details in existing law re- garding the transfer of rights to adult students [see EHBAE(LEGAL)].

 Special
 Outdated provisions that capped the percentage of compensatory education

 Programs
 funds that could be used for DAEP expenditures and that addressed the development of college preparatory courses for the 2014–15 school year have been removed from EHBC(LEGAL).

EHBD(LEGAL), addressing Title I funds, has been revised to include additional provisions on fiscal requirements, including maintenance of effort, the use of funds to supplement state and local funds, and prohibited uses of funds.

Graduation Provisions regarding notification about automatic admission requirements have been added to EIC(LEGAL) in response to administrative rule changes.

At EIF(LEGAL), in addition to adjusting the school years for applicable provision and including references to relevant Administrative Code provisions, we have added new administrative rules implementing Senate Bill 463 (85th Legislative Session). The new rules permit a district to award a diploma to an individual who entered grade 9 before the 2011–12 school year and who has completed the applicable curriculum requirements, but who has not successfully passed the relevant exit-level assessment required for graduation after at least three tries. To graduate, the student must meet the alternative requirements for graduation in the Administrative Code or the local alternative requirements approved by the board. Information to assist districts in developing these requirements for board approval was e-mailed to superintendents, administrative assistants, and policy contacts on April 30, 2018.

Employment

Amended administrative rules are reflected at DF(LEGAL), the policy that addresses termination of an employee. The new rules specify that SBEC can sanction an educator who does not discharge an employee if the educator knew that the employee had been adjudicated for or convicted of having an inappropriate relationship with a minor. [See also DBAA for information on sanctions against an educator who does not refuse to hire an applicant with the same criminal history described here.]

Policy DC(LEGAL), addressing employment of retirees, has been revised based on amended administrative rules to describe additional employment relationships with retirees that are considered "employment relationships" for purposes of the limits on employment after retirement. Additional revisions have been made regarding the required monthly certified statement of employment.

A minor change at DBA(LEGAL) is from amended administrative rules and permits an employee to verify rather than sign his or her original service record.

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Insurance

CRG(LEGAL), addressing annuities, has been revised to align with amended administrative rules and reorganized for a more appropriate flow. The revisions at CRD(LEGAL) have been made to incorporate other changes to administrative rules and to better match statute.

Compensation

DEA(LOCAL) POLICY CONSIDERATIONS*

*The changes to this policy will only be applicable to districts that currently have language in their policy authorizing pay to employees during emergency closings or that have text addressing premium pay for employees required to work during an emergency closure.

We have revised this local policy to clarify the district's current policy provision on compensation payments to employees during emergency closings. The revised text creates a default for the board to pay employees for their regular duty schedule during a closing, but provides the board flexibility to decide otherwise through board action. In addition, the text requires the board, following a closure, to adopt a resolution or take other board action to establish the purpose and parameters for such payments.

For those districts with policies permitting premium pay during disasters, the text has been aligned with the current Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Public Assistance Program and Policy Guide (PAPPG). The PAPPG provides that FEMA determines eligibility for public assistance funding for overtime, premium pay, and compensatory time costs based on the district's written policy in place before the disaster, provided the local policy:

- Does not make the wage payments contingent on federal funding;
- Is applied uniformly regardless of whether there has been a presidential declaration of a disaster; and
- Has nondiscretionary criteria for when the district activates various pay types.

Based on that guidance, the policy revisions recommended in this update replace text limiting premium pay to a federally declared disaster and instead authorize premium pay during an emergency closing for a broader set of disasters, to include a disaster declared by a federal, state, or local official or the board.

Please note that the availability of funds for reimbursement after a disaster includes a case-by-case determination by FEMA based on all of the eligibility requirements in the PAPPG and law.

Employee Conduct Additional provisions from the federal Drug-Free Workplace Act were included at DH(LEGAL) to provide a more complete explanation of the requirements.

DI(LOCAL) POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

With the changes at DH(LEGAL) described above and those made to DH(LOCAL) in Update 109, we recommend the deletion of DI(LOCAL), which addresses the drug-free awareness program.

DHE(LOCAL) POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The recommended revisions in DHE(LOCAL), which addresses searches and alcohol/drug testing of employees, are to clarify that a district may remove from duty and require testing of an employee if there is reasonable suspicion that the employee is under the influence of alcohol or drugs used in violation of district policy. The new text also addresses consequences for an employee's refusal to comply with testing and for violation of the district's drug and alcohol policy.

Recent changes to SBEC rules prompted revisions to DHB(LEGAL) to clarify reportable employee misconduct and to require the report to address current employment status, including pending actions and whether law enforcement or another agency is involved.

Counseling /Provisions on academic counseling have been moved from EJ(LEGAL) toAcademicFFEA(LEGAL), which will now result in all counselor-related duties beingGuidancehoused in one code. Provisions on transcript and diploma notations that were
previously at EJ(LEGAL) have been moved to EI(LEGAL).

Certification Provisions on principal certification have been updated to provide a more complete explanation of the requirements.

Student Issues

Attendance

FEA(LOCAL) POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

A recommended revision to this local policy on compulsory attendance requires the district to excuse a student who is 17 years of age or older for up to four days during the student's enrollment in high school in order for the student to pursue enlistment in the armed services.

At FEB(LEGAL), the policy on attendance accounting, revisions have been made to better align the text with statute and to add appropriate cross-references.

FOF(LEGAL) includes additional information on requirements when expelling a student with a disability.

TERMINATION AND RELEASE OF SCHOOL SUPPORT AGREEMENT (New Landscape Maintenance Services Agreement)

THIS TERMINATION AND RELEASE OF SCHOOL SUPPORT AGREEMENT (this "<u>Agreement</u>") is made as of ______, 2018 ("<u>Effective Date</u>"), by and between LITTLE ELM INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT ("<u>LEISD</u>") and THE TRIBUTE OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC. ("<u>HOA</u>").

RECITALS:

- A. LEISD and HOA executed the School Support Agreement ("Original SSA") dated June 18, 2012, as amended by that certain First Amendment to School Support Agreement ("First Amendment") dated November 3, 2014 (the Original SSA, as amended by the First Amendment, the "SSA").
- B. WHEREAS, pursuant to the SSA, the Association agreed to pay LEISD seven (7) annual installments, of \$250,000 each, on or before August 31 of each year from 2017-2023, inclusive.
- C. WHEREAS, HOA has separately made the payments of \$250,000 due in 2017 and 2018, and the parties desire that HOA prepay the remaining five (5) payments through a single payment of \$1,150,000, representing a \$100,000 discount from the aggregate payments of \$1,250,000 that would otherwise be due in 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023.
- D. The parties desire to enter into this Agreement to terminate the SSA, thereby releasing HOA from all of its obligations under the SSA as more particularly set forth herein.

AGREEMENT:

NOW, THEREFORE, and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreement set forth in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, LEISD and HOA hereby agree as follows.

- Lump Sum Payment. HOA shall pay or caused to be paid to LEISD a single, lump sum payment of \$1,150,000, (the "Lump Sum Payment"), after September 1, 2018, and before September 30, 2018. The Lump Sum Payment is in lieu of, and a \$100,000 discount from the five (5) remaining annual installments that would otherwise be due from 2019 through 2023, each in the amount of \$250,000, the total of which is \$1,250,000.
- <u>SSA Termination</u>. LEISD and HOA hereby terminate the SSA, and release each other from all further obligations and liabilities under the SSA, including any and all HOA payment obligations and liabilities to LEISD under the SSA. Provided, however, the obligations and liabilities of HOA and LEISD under this Agreement (the "<u>Surviving</u> <u>Obligations</u>") are not released, including the obligation of HOA to make the Lump Sum Payment of \$1,150,000 and to provide future Landscape Maintenance Services as described in this Agreement.

- 3. Landscape Maintenance Services.
 - a. "Landscape Maintenance Services" means landscape maintenance services that benefit the LEISD school site's frontage on Lebanon Road and onsite storm water storage area, each as depicted on <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto.
 - b. HOA will provide, or cause to be provided, Landscape Maintenance Services (in the areas depicted on <u>Exhibit A</u>) with an estimated value of \$15,000 per year, beginning with the 2018-2019 school year and ending with the 2023-2024 school year.

4. Mutual Releases.

- a. Upon LEISD's receipt of the Lump Sum Payment, LEISD, on behalf of itself and any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns, and its and each of their respective former, current and future trustees, officers, employees, agents and other representatives (collectively, the "LEISD Releasing Parties"), for good and sufficient consideration, the receipt of which is acknowledged, release absolutely and forever discharge HOA and its subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns, and each of its and their respective former, current and future directors, officers, employees, agents and other representatives (collectively, the "HOA Released Parties"), from any and all actual or possible claims, charges, damages, demands, debts, liabilities, losses, accounts, reckonings, obligations, suits, actions and causes of action of every kind and nature whatsoever, including but not limited to, those arising under contract, statute or common law, whether or not known or suspected at this time, which the LEISD Releasing Parties have or ever had, owned or held, or hereafter can, shall or may have against any or all of the HOA Released Parties, based upon, arising out of, related to, or by reason of any cause, occurrence, event, act, fact, circumstance, thing, statement or omission, occurring or existing before the Effective Date and relating to, arising from or in connection with the SSA. Provided, however, the Surviving Obligations are not released.
- b. Upon LEISD's receipt of the Lump Sum Payment, HOA, on behalf of itself and any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns, and its and each of their respective former, current and future directors, officers, employees, agents and other representatives (collectively, the "HOA Releasing Parties"), for good and sufficient consideration, the receipt of which is acknowledged, release absolutely and forever discharge LEISD and its subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns, parents and each of its and their respective former, current and future trustees, officers, employees, agents and other representatives (collectively, the "LEISD Released Parties"), from any and all actual or possible claims, charges, damages, demands, debts, liabilities, losses, accounts, reckonings, obligations, suits, actions and causes of action of every kind and nature whatsoever, including but not limited to, those arising under contract, statute or common law, whether or not known or suspected at this time, which the HOA Releasing Parties have or ever had, owned

or held, or hereafter can, shall or may have against any or all of the LEISD Released Parties, based upon, arising out of, related to, or by reason of any cause, occurrence, event, act, fact, circumstance, thing, statement or omission occurring before the Effective Date and relating to, arising from or in connection with the SSA. Provided, however, the Surviving Obligations are not released.

- 5. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement and understanding of the parties hereto in respect of the subject matter contained herein and therein, and supersedes all prior agreements, promises, covenants, arrangements, communications, representations or warranties, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter hereof and thereof.
- 6. <u>Miscellaneous</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. This Agreement is to be deemed to have been prepared jointly by the parties hereto, and if any inconsistencies or ambiguities exist herein, they shall not be interpreted or construed against either party as the drafter. All paragraph and section headings are inserted for convenience only and shall not be used in any way to modify, limit, construe or otherwise affect this Agreement. Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Agreement have the meanings ascribed to them in the SSA. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which, together, shall constitute one and the same instrument. Facsimile or "pdf signatures on this Agreement shall be valid the same as originals. Whenever action must be taken under this Agreement during a certain period of time (or by a particular date) that ends (or occurs) on a non-Business Day, then such period (or date) shall be extended until the immediately following Business Day. Neither this Agreement nor a memorandum thereof shall be filed or recorded by LEISD or HOA.



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RESOLUTIONS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TRIBUTE OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.

WHEREAS, pursuant to that certain Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions for The Tribute Owners Association, Inc. (as amended, the "**Declaration**") recorded as Document Number 2007-61356 in the Real Property Records of Denton County, Texas, certain covenants and restrictions were imposed on that certain master planned development situated in Denton County, Texas, commonly known as The Tribute (the "**Community**");

WHEREAS, The Tribute Owners Association, Inc. (the "<u>Association</u>") was established and created generally to manage, maintain, operate and perform certain improvements and activities relating to the Community, as more particularly described in the Declaration and other documents related thereto;

WHEREAS, the Association is governed by those certain By-laws of The Tribute Owners Association, Inc. (the "<u>By-laws</u>") which are attached as Exhibit C to the Declaration;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article III, Section A(1) of the By-laws, the affairs of the Association are governed by the Board of Directors (the "**Board**") of the Association;

WHEREAS, the undersigned are all of the members of the Board;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article III, Section B(16) of the By-laws, any action of the Board may be taken without a meeting if a written or electronic consent setting forth the action so taken is signed or affirmed by a sufficient number of directors as would be necessary to take that action at a meeting at which all of the directors were present and voted;

WHEREAS, the undersigned do hereby unanimously adopt in writing the following actions which will have the same force and effect as if unanimously adopted at a meeting called for this purpose and hereby waive any and all requirements for calling, giving notice of and holding a meeting of the Board:

School Support Agreement – 2018 Annual Installment

WHEREAS, reference is made to that certain School Support Agreement dated June 18, 2012, as amended by that certain First Amendment to School Support Agreement dated November 3, 2014 (as amended, the "<u>SSA</u>") by and between the Association and Little Elm Independent School District ("<u>LEISD</u>");

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the SSA, as amended, the Association has made all annual installment payments due on or before August 31, 2017;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the SSA, as amended, the Association is required to pay LEISD six additional annual installments, each in an amount equal to \$250,000, with the first

of such annual installments being due on or before August 31, 2018 (such installment being referred to herein as the "2018 Annual Installment");

WHEREAS, the Board desires to approve the payment of the 2018 Annual Installment, in the amount of \$250,000.

School Support Agreement - Lump Sum Payment

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the SSA, as amended, and after the 2018 Annual Installment, the Association is required to pay LEISD five additional annual installments, each in an amount equal to \$250,000. Each of the five annual installment payments is due and payable on or before August 31, of each year from 2019-2023, inclusive.

WHEREAS, the Board desires to approve the payment in the amount equal to \$1,150,000 as a lump sum payment ("<u>Lump Sum Payment</u>") in lieu of the five remaining annual installments otherwise due through 2023, and that otherwise would be in the aggregate amount of \$1,250,000.

WHEREAS, payment of the \$1,150,000 Lump Sum Payment at this time provides a \$100,000 discount on the total amount of the five additional annual installments due through 2023.

School Support Agreement – Execution of Termination and Release Agreement

WHEREAS, reference is made to that certain Termination and Release Agreement related to the School Support Agreement to be entered into by and between the Association and LEISD (the "<u>Termination and Release Agreement</u>"); and

WHEREAS, the Termination and Release Agreement provides that, during the 2018-2019 through 2023-2024 school years, and consistent with prior performance under the SSA, the Association will provide certain landscape maintenance services ("Landscape Maintenance Services") at the LEISD school site's Lebanon Road frontage and storm water storage area.

WHEREAS, the Board deems it necessary and advisable and in the best interest of the Association that the Board approve and confirm the Termination and Release Agreement in the form presented to the Board and authorize the Association to execute and enter in the Termination and Release Agreement.

Resolutions

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby agrees and declares that the Association is authorized to pay the 2018 Annual Installment to LEISD pursuant to the terms of the SSA, as amended.

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board hereby agrees and declares that the Association is authorized to (i) pay the 2018 Annual Installment in the amount of \$250,000, (ii) pay the discounted amount of \$1,150,000 as a Lump Sum Payment in lieu of the five remaining annual installments due through 2023, and (iii) provide Landscape Maintenance Services through the 2023-2024 school year.

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board hereby approves and confirms the Termination and Release Agreement in the form presented to the Board.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Kristian T. Teleki, as President, in his capacity as an officer on behalf of the Association, is hereby authorized and directed to execute and enter into the Termination and Release Agreement in the form presented to the Board;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Kristian T. Teleki, as President, in his capacity as an officer on behalf of the Association, is hereby authorized and directed to take, or cause to be taken, any and all such action and to sign, execute, acknowledge, certify, deliver, accept, record and file such further instruments in the name and on behalf of the Association as is necessary, desirable, or appropriate in order to effect the purposes of the foregoing resolutions.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that these resolutions may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original for all purposes, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that electronic copies of these resolutions may be treated the same as originals for all purposes.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Education Code section 11.151, the Board of Trustees of the Little Elm Independent School District ("District") is authorized to acquire and hold real and personal property;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees is currently acquiring real property for the construction of facilities to meet the educational needs of the students residing in the District;

WHEREAS, the real property described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes ("Property") was donated to the District by Valencia on the Lake, L.P., a Texas limited partnership ("Grantor") on May 24, 2016, pursuant to a dedication deed recorded as Document Number 2016-60089, of the Official Records of Denton County, Texas ("Deed")

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Deed, said Property would automatically revert to Grantor if the District did not begin construction of a school on the Property within four (4) years from September 8, 2014, which construction shall be completed within two (2) years after construction begins;

WHEREAS, the District is not planning to commence construction on the Property on or before September 8, 2014;

WHEREAS, Grantor has offered to modify the deed and sell the Property to the District with no reversionary clause or deadline to build a school in exchange for certain consideration; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to into a real estate sales contract with the owner of the Property for purchase of the Property by the District with no reversion clause; therefore,

Be it resolved,

1. That the findings and recitals in the preamble of this Resolution are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby approved and adopted.

2. That the Board of Trustees of the Little Elm Independent School District authorizes and approves entering into a real estate contract for the purchase of the Property described in Exhibit "A".

3. That the Superintendent and Associate Superintendent and Chief Financial Officer are each authorized to negotiate and sign a real estate sales contract for the purchase of the Property, tender the purchase price of the Property and the amount of closing and other costs to the title

company for payment to the seller of the Property and to execute any other documents necessary to effect the purchase.

4. That it is hereby found, determined and declared that a sufficient written notice of the date, time, place and subject of the meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Little Elm Independent School at which this Resolution was adopted was posted at a place convenient and readily accessible at all times to the general public for the time required by law preceding this meeting as required by chapter 551, Texas Government Code, and that this meeting has been open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Resolution and the subject matter thereof has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. KNOW ALL BY THESE PRESENTS THAT:

THAT VALENCIA ON THE LAKE, L.P., a Texas limited partnership, ("Grantor") DEDICATES, GIFTS and CONVEYS, with full intention, the property herein described, unto the LITTLE ELM INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, whose address is 1900 Walker Lane, Little Elm, Texas 75068 ("Grantee") as a dedication of real property in fee simple. Grantor retains no reversionary right or interest in and to the property. Grantor hereby DEDICATES, GRANTS AND CONVEYS unto Grantee all of Grantor's right, title and interest in and to that certain tract of real property located in Little Elm, Denton County, Texas, as more particularly described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes, together with all improvements thereon, and all rights, benefits, privileges, tenements, hereditaments, rights of way, easements, appendages and appurtenances relating thereto (collectively referred to as the "Property") so long as Grantee begins construction of a school ("School") on the Property within four (4) years from September 8, 2014, which construction shall be completed within two (2) years after construction begins, and if Grantee fails to begin construction and complete the School as required herein, it shall automatically revert to and be owned by Grantor without the necessity of any further act on the part of Grantor, it being the intent of Grantor to convey a fee simple determinable estate to Grantee. The period for Grantee to begin construction of the School shall be tolled as described in the Donation Agreement, dated September 8, 2014 ("Donation Agreement") incorporated herein by reference. In order to be considered complete, the School must have received a certificate of occupancy. Upon completion of the School said fee simple determinable estate shall become good and indefeasible fee simple title and the Grantee may file an affidavit in the real property records of Denton County stating that the School has been completed which shall serve as conclusive evidence that the condition has been fulfilled unless Grantor files a contradictory statement within sixty (60) days thereafter. The affidavit and lack of any filing of a contradictory statement by the Grantor shall be conclusive evidence that: (i) Grantee has fulfilled the condition, (ii) Grantee holds good and indefeasible fee simple title to the Property, (iii) any reversionary interest held by Grantor has been extinguished and terminated, and (iv) any third party may rely on said conclusive evidence.

Grantor represents that as of the Effective Date of this Deed, all applicable taxes that are owed and due on the Property have been paid by Grantor to the applicable taxing authority. Upon the Effective Date of this Deed, Grantee agrees that, if required by law to do so, Grantee will timely advise the applicable taxing authority of the change in ownership of the Property to Grantee.

This conveyance is made as a gift as a charitable contribution under applicable income tax laws and regulations without any consideration by Grantee to Grantor and is made and accepted, subject to the exceptions more particularly described on <u>Exhibit "B"</u> attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Permitted Exceptions"), but only to the extent that such Permitted Exceptions are valid, subsisting, and in fact, affect the Property. This donation is subject to the restrictions and/or conditions, as described on Exhibit "B".

Grantor currently owns approximately four hundred twenty nine (429) acres of adjacent property ("Grantor's Adjacent Property"), as more particularly described in the Donation Agreement. As consideration for Grantee to accept this donation and construct a school on the Property, Grantor covenants, agrees, represents and warrants to the Grantee the following:

- 1. Improvements. Grantor, or Grantor's successors and assigns, on or before the dates listed for each item of infrastructure as shown on <u>Exhibits "C" and "D"</u>, attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes, shall complete construction of the following infrastructure improvements ("Improvements") in ample capacity, as determined by Grantee in the Grantee's sole and reasonable discretion for the operation of a school:
 - a. The following improvements shall be constructed and completed by Grantor or Grantor's successors and assigns at their sole cost and expense, no later than ninety (90) days after District gives the notice to proceed to the District's Construction Manager to begin construction of a School on the Property with a copy of said notice to proceed sent to Grantor. A rough sketch of these improvements as shown on Exhibit "D".
 - i. Three-phase electricity shall be installed and provided from the Northwest corner of the Property to the proposed location of the school to be built on the Property. In connection with the installation of electricity, Grantor, in coordination with CoServ and Grantee, shall also remove or relocate the overhead electric line and power poles currently located on the Property at Grantor's expense. Grantor shall work with Grantee, as needed, to remove, release and/or terminate the ten foot (10') and fifteen foot (15') CoServ easements currently crossing the Property.
 - ii. Water main and service shall be stubbed out to the Property that is adequate for fire protection for a public school and with stub outs for Domestic and Irrigation service adequate for a public school.
 - iii. Sanitary sewer main and sanitary sewer service, adequate for a public school, shall be installed and provided to the Property.
 - iv. All public roads providing access to the Property and school site shall be constructed by Grantor. Such public roads shall conform to specifications issued by the Town of Little Elm, if any.
 - 2. In the event Grantor, or Grantor's successors and assigns, provide natural gas to any of the residential homes within the Valencia on the Lake development, natural gas service shall be installed and provided to the Property, at Grantor's sole cost and expense. However, in the event the Grantor, or Grantor's successors and assigns, decides not to provide natural gas to any of the said residential homes, the natural gas service shall still be provided to the school site by Grantor, at Grantor's expense, the District will reimburse Grantor for fifty percent (50%) of the cost to provide the natural gas service to the Property, with a maximum

reimbursement of \$20,000.00; Grantor shall be responsible for any and all excess costs over the \$20,000.00 maximum reimbursement.

- 3. Grantor agrees to remove from the Property, at Grantor's sole cost and expense, all above ground improvements, and all water lines, lateral lines, and septic systems, if any, within ninety (90) days of the Effective Date of the Donation Agreement.
- 4. Any and all proposed roadway engineering for the public roads outlined in the "Donation Agreement," must be reviewed and approved by both the Town of Little Elm's engineer and the Grantee's engineer prior to Grantor obtaining a building permit to construct said public roads.
- 5. Grantor and Grantee agree to cooperate with each other in accomplishing the platting process to facilitate the construction of the School. Grantor shall bear all costs associated with the platting of the Property. To the extent any fees, including but not limited to impact fees, building fees, or inspection fees are assessed against the Property by the Town of Little Elm, Grantor shall be responsible for reimbursing said fees to the Grantee within thirty (30) days of receipt of a written bill or statement forwarded to Grantor from the Grantee and this provision shall survive closing
- 6. Upon completion of the public improvements, Grantor and Grantee agree to dedicate the improvements to the Town of Little Elm, where required.
- 7. Failure to Time Comply with Improvements: If Grantor or Grantor's successor or assigns, fail to timely fulfill any of the provisions as outlined above or in the Donation Agreement, and such failure continues uncured for a period of forty-five (45) days after written notice from Grantee is received (and longer, to the extent that a failure cannot be timely cured, as long as Grantor timely commences to cure such failure within said forty five (45) day period and promptly continues same to completion), the deadlines set forth for the Grantee to begin construction and complete construction of the School shall be extended for the period of time that such provisions remain unfulfilled. Grantee shall have no obligation to construct a School on the Property (and title to the Property will not revert to the Grantor, or Grantor's successors and assigns) if the Grantor, or Grantor's successors and assigns, fails to complete construction of any of the Improvements as reflected in the attached Exhibits "C" and "D." In addition, the period for Grantee to begin construction of the School shall be tolled (i) for any period during which Grantor remains in material default of this Deed or the underlying Donation Agreement between Grantor and Grantee, or (ii) during any event of force majeure (which shall mean acts of God, strikes, lockouts, material or labor restrictions by any governmental authority, civil riots, floods, and any other cause not reasonably in the control of Grantee and which by the exercise of due diligence Grantee is unable to prevent or overcome).

The covenants and conditions contained herein shall run with the land and be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of, Grantor and Grantee and their successors and assigns. Grantee may not assign its rights without the express written consent of Grantor, which consent shall be given or withheld in its sole and absolute discretion. Grantor may sell all or a portion of Grantor's Adjacent Property to third parties. In the event of such sale, the covenants and conditions contained herein and the Grantor's obligations hereunder may be assigned by Grantor (and assumed by any such third parties) by written instrument. However any such assignment shall not relieve Grantor of its

obligations hereunder unless expressly agreed to in writing by Grantee and unless the third party expressly agrees in writing to be bound by the rights and obligations contained herein. Further, the benefits contained herein shall inure to the benefit of any assignee of Grantor.

To prepare underachieving students to enter institutions of higher education

Encourage students to pursue advanced academic opportunities

Provide opportunities for students to take academically rigorous courses

Align secondary and postsecondary curriculum and expectations

Support other promising high school completion and success initiatives in Grades 6-12 approved by the Commissioner of Education.



Program Information

Provide academic support and instruction

Provide activities that promote a college going culture within the LEAs campuses to increase access to financial aid for students and support online coursework

Offer students rigorous coursework such as honor courses or A/P courses geared towards the Commissioner's college readiness and student success initiatives.

Enrollment in Advanced Courses

Goal:

Increase advanced course enrollment.

Strategies:

Use the AP Potential report from PSAT to identify students who are college ready to advise, guide, and enroll students in the best advanced academic course (Dual Credit, Pre-AP, AP, or On-Ramps).

Implement vertical teaming to increase student performance on Advanced Placement exams through continuity of instruction and readiness.

Strategies:

LEHS College Readiness Coordinator will establish strong partnerships with colleges to provide students many opportunities to explore post-secondary choices.
