## SECTION 1 INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

- 1.1. Notice of bid—Calumet Public School District 132 is seeking sealed bids for pre-plated, pre-prepared meals for the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program that meet USDA and State requirements for reimbursement. Bid packages may be obtained from the Calumet Public School District 132 Business Office located at 1440 W. Vermont, Calumet Park, IL. 60827. Contact the Business Office at (708)388-8920 extn.4810 to obtain a bid package.
- 1.2. Pre-bid meeting/facility tour information- A mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held on May 24, 2019, at 10 a.m. at the District Office, 1440 W. Vermont Calumet Park IL. 60827
- 1.3. Bid submission date Sealed bids must be received in the District Office, 1440 W. Vermont Calumet Park IL. 60827 no later than 10:00 a.m. on June 12, 2019 at which time they will be publicly opened.
- 1.4. Questions related to this invitation for bid must be submitted in writing (email is appropriate) to Dr. Reynolds or Julie Stearns at <a href="mailto:istearns@sd132.org">istearns@sd132.org</a>, prior to the bid opening and in any event no later than May 31, 2019. Oral explanations or instructions given before the award will not be binding. Any information given to a prospective bidder shall be furnished to all prospective bidders as a written amendment to the solicitation if such information is necessary to bidders in submitting bids or if the lack of such information would be prejudicial uniformed bidders. Amendments sent to all prospective bidders will be sent via email.
- 1.5. Hereinafter, school food authority (SFA) shall refer to Calumet Public School District 132.
- 1.6 Hereinafter, food service management company (FSMC) shall refer to the contractor awarded this contract.
- 1.7 If clarification of the specifications/instructions is required, the SFA will clarify the specifications/instructions in the form of an addendum issued to all prospective bidders. If the SFA issues any changes to this Invitation for Bid (IFB), acknowledgement of receipt of such changes must be made to the SFA in writing, signed by an individual authorized to legally bind the bidder, and included in the bidder's bid package. If changes to the IFB are not acknowledged, the SFA retains the right to reject the bid as non-responsive. No addenda will be issued within seven (7) working days of the time and date set for the bid opening. Should the SFA determine that clarification of the specifications/instructions is necessary within seven (7) working days of the time and date set for the bid opening, the time and date set for the bid opening will be delayed to allow issuing an addendum.
- The subject matter of this IFB is subject to legislative changes either by the federal or state government. If any such changes occur prior to contract award, then all bidders will have the opportunity to modify their bids to reflect such changes. If any such changes occur after a contract award has been made, then the SFA (i) reserves the right to negotiate modifications to the Contract reflecting such legislative changes; and (ii) shall have no obligation to provide unsuccessful bidders with the opportunity to modify their bids to reflect such legislative changes.

## SECTION 2 GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 2.1 Bids shall be submitted on the forms provided with these specifications. Bids shall be in a sealed envelope properly marked with the title of the bid, date and time of opening, and delivered to the Business Office on or before June 12, 2019 at 10a.m. All certifications contained herein must be signed and submitted with the bid.
- 2.2 Bids submitted after the date and time specified will not be considered and will be returned, unopened to the appropriate bidder. Post marks or dating of documents will be given no consideration in the case of late bids.
- 2.3 The SFA reserves the right to reject any or all bids in whole or in part when there are sound documented business reasons and to waive any and all informalities and minor irregularities not deemed material in bids received.
- 2.4 The SFA shall provide no relief for errors or omissions.
- 2.5 There shall be No deviations or exceptions from the specifications and conditions
- 2.6 The Submission of a bid indicates bidder is informed of specifications and conditions contained herein.
- 2.7 Bid withdrawal or changes will be accepted in written form up to the time of the bid opening.
- 2.8 Once the bids have been opened, no bid modification will be allowed. All bidders will be bound by any and all math calculations, misquotes or mistakes of any kind once the bids have been opened.
- 2.9 No employee of Calumet Public School District 132 or its Board of Education is to be extended any form of gratuity in connection with bid. The SFA will accept no gratuity in connection with this bid.
- 2.10 SFA reserves right to investigate each bidder's ability to fulfill terms and conditions of the contract for food services.
- 2.11 All bids shall remain valid and subject to acceptance for a period of ninety (90) days after the bid opening date. Award of the Contract shall be made to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder as determined by the SFA, based on the criteria and specifications outlined in the IFB and further set forth in the Contract.
- 2.12 The meal rates and fees bid must be calculated based on the menu(s) in Exhibit B and on the projected annual units provided on the *Bid Summary* form, both attached herein. Rates must be provided per unit with the exception of the *A la Carte Management Fee* which, if bid, must be a lump sum. All other estimated line item totals shall be computed by multiplying the projected annual units by the rate bid per unit. Estimated totals must be carried out to the second decimal place and must not be rounded. In any case of errors in the extension of the estimated total(s), the actual unit rates shall govern.

- 2.13.1 Bid bond requirement. A bid deposit in the form of a surety bond issued by a bonding company authorized to do business in Illinois, and on the US Department of Treasury list of approved sureties, shall be made payable to Calumet Public School District 132 in the amount of 5% or the total estimated cost of the annual contract. All bids without a surety bond will be disgualified and will be considered as non-responsive.
- 2.14 There is not a Performance Bond Requirement.
- **2.14.1 Bid Protests.** Any bidder who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of this contract may file a protest. Protests relating to cancellation of the invitation for bid and protests relating to the rejection of all bids are not permitted.
  - 2.14.2 Time for Filing. Any protest by a prospective bidder must be filed before bid opening time. If a protest is filed by a bidder having already submitted a bid, the protest must be filed within seven days after the protesting bidder knew or should have known of the facts giving rise to the protest EXCEPT THAT IN NO EVENT MAY A PROTEST BE FILED LATER THAN SEVEN DAYS AFTER THE DATE THE CONTRACT WAS AWARDED. Date of filing is the date of receipt of the protest. Untimely filed protests shall be disregarded by the Board of Education.
  - 2.14.3 **Form of Protest.** All protests must be in writing and filed with the Chief School Business Official in the Business Office.
  - 2.14.4 **Contents of the Written Protest.** A written protest must contain the following information: 1) Name, address, and fax and telephone numbers of the protester; (2) detailed statement of the legal and factual grounds for the protests, including a description of the prejudice resulting to the protester; (3) copies of documents ready reference to which is believed necessary to assess the factual or legal basis of the protest; (4) statement as to the form of relief requested; (5) the date the facts giving rise to the protest became known to the protester; and, (6) whether a bid has been submitted by the protester. Issues not raised by the protesting party are deemed waived and may not be raised on appeal. A protest which fails to contain the required information may be denied solely on that basis.
  - 2.14.5 Notice of Protest. If the contract has been awarded, the Chief School Business Official (CSBO) shall notify the successful bidder of the protest. If the protest is received before the award and substantial issues are raised by the protest, all bidders who appear to have a substantial and reasonable prospect of winning the award shall be notified and may file their agreement/disagreement with the CSBO within five days after receipt of notice of protest.
  - 2.14.6 Stay of Procurement. The Chief School Business Official shall promptly decide upon receipt of the protest whether or not the solicitation or award shall be stayed, or if the protest is timely received after the award, whether the performance of the contract should be suspended. The CSBO shall not proceed further with the solicitation or with the award of the contract, and shall suspend performance under the contract if awarded, unless the CSBO makes a written determination that the protest is clearly without merit or that award of the contract without delay is necessary to protect the substantial interests of the District.
  - 2.14.7 "Clearly Without Merit" determinations. If the CSBO determines, upon receipt, that the protest is clearly without merit and does not stay the procurement, the CSBO shall immediately issue the decision as stated by 2.15.8, below.
  - 2.14.8 **Settlement.** The Board of Education has the authority to settle and resolve bid protests.
  - 2.14.9 **Decision.** The CSBO shall promptly, but in no event later than 10 days from the filing of the protest issue a written decision. The decision shall: (1) state the reasons for the decision; (2) if the protest is denied, inform the protesting party of its right to file an

appeal with the Board of Education within 10 days of the mailing date of the decision. If it is determined that the solicitation or award was contrary to law, the CSBO, or the Board of Education after an appeal is filed, shall enter an appropriate decision under 2.15.9 or 2.15.10, below. The CSBO shall send a copy of the decision to the protesting party and any other person determined by the CSBO to be affected by the decision.

- 2.14.10 Remedy Before Execution of Contract. If, before execution of a contract, it is determined that a solicitation or proposed award of a contract was in violation of law, the CSBO, or the Board of Education after an appeal is filed, may do one of the following: (1) cancel the solicitation; (2) change the solicitation to comply with law; reject all bids or those parts of the bids which were affected by the violation; or (3) change or cancel the award to comply with the law.
- 2.14.11 Remedies After Execution of Contract. If, after execution of a contract, it is determined that a solicitation or award of a contract was in violation of law:
  - 2.14.11.1 If the contractor did not act fraudulently or in bad faith, the contract may be: (1) ratified and affirmed provided it is determined by the purchasing agency that doing so is in the best interest of the Board of Education; (2) modified to comply with the law with the consent of all parties; or (3) cancelled and the bidder shall be compensated for the actual expenses reasonably incurred under the contract prior to termination. Such compensation shall not include loss of anticipated profit, loss of use of money, or administrative or overhead costs.
  - 2.14.11.2 If the bidder has acted fraudulently or in bad faith, the contract may be: (1) declared void; (2) modified to comply with law with the consent of all parties; or (3) ratified and affirmed, provided it is determined by the CSBO, if that action is in the best interests of the Board of Education and without prejudice to the right of the agency to damages, as may be appropriate.
- 2.15 All prospective bidders must completely inspect the facilities and equipment prior to the bid due date and prior to submitting a bid. Failure to do so will not relieve the successful bidder from the necessity of furnishing and installing any material and equipment, performing any labor, or making any structural changes, without additional cost to the SFA, that may be required to carry out the intent of the resulting Contract
- 2.16 No bid will be accepted from, or contract awarded to, any person, firm, or corporation that is in arrears or is in default to the SFA upon any debt or contract, or is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to said SFA, or has failed to perform faithfully any previous contract with the SFA.
- 2.17 All completed bids and supporting documentation submitted shall be the property of the SFA.
- Until such time as a Contract is awarded, no bidder, prospective or otherwise, shall be 2.18 provided access to any supporting bid documents received by the SFA. All supporting bid documents shall be held strictly confidential and shall be reviewed and evaluated SFA employees. Such documents shall not be released for distribution under the Freedom of Information Act until such time as the Contract has been awarded. Violation of this clause by any bidder, prospective or otherwise, shall result in automatic disqualification of the bidder from being awarded the Contract. Violation of this clause by an SFA may result in (1) temporary withholding of cash payments pending correction of the deficiency by the SFA or other more severe enforcement action; (2) disallowing of both, use of funds and matching credit for all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance; (3) whole or partial suspension or termination of the SFA's program; (4) withholding of further awards for the program; or (5) may be legally available. Actions that result in the violation of law will be other remedies that referred to the appropriate local, State or Federal authority having jurisdiction.

2.19 Upon award of contract, the FSMC shall report to the SFA whether it is a "Minority owned business, female owned business, and business owned by a person with a disability" as those terms are defined pursuant to the Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females and Persons with Disabilities Act, 30 ILCS 575/.01 et seq. A bidder's status as a minority, female or person with a disability-owned business will not be considered as part of the Board of Education's criteria in awarding the bid.

#### SECTION 3 SCOPE

- 3.1 The food service provided shall be operated and maintained as a benefit to the SFA's students, faculty, and staff.
- 3.2 The food service shall be managed to promote maximum participation in the Child Nutrition Programs.
- 3.3 The food service management company (FSMC) shall have the exclusive right to manage the Child Nutrition Programs at the sites specified on Exhibit A.
- 3.4 The FSMC shall provide the type of food service at sites as specified on Exhibit A for approximately \_176\_\_\_ annual serving days during each Term of the Contract.
- 3.5 The SFA may at any time during the Term of the Contract add or remove sites and/or meal periods for programs covered by this contract unless the addition or removal of sites and/or meal periods creates a material or substantive Contract change.
- 3.6 The SFA reserves the right to maintain, add to, and/or remove present food and beverage vending machines in its facilities.
- 3.7 The FSMC shall be an independent contractor and not an employee of the SFA. The employees of the FSMC shall be considered solely employees of the FSMC and shall not be considered employees or agents of the SFA in any fashion.
- 3.8 The FSMC shall conduct the food service to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations of the Illinois State Board of Education and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) regarding Child Nutrition Programs.
- 3.9 The SFA shall be legally and financially responsible for the conduct of the food service and shall supervise the food service to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations of the Illinois State Board of Education and the United States Department of Agriculture regarding Child Nutrition Programs.
- 3.10 The Summer and Snack Programs currently are not utilized; however the District is seeking meal rates in case the programs are offered in the future.

## SECTION 4 SCHOOL FOOD AUTHORITY RESPONSIBILITIES

- 4.1 The SFA shall ensure the food service is in conformance with its *Permanent Agreement* and the *Policy Statement for Free Meals, Free Milk, and Reduced-Price Meals.*
- 4.2 The SFA shall retain control of the quality, extent, and general nature of its food service and the prices to be charged for meals, milk, a la carte items, adult meals, and vending machine items, as applicable.
- 4.3 The FSMC orders meals on a weekly basis for each site for each type of meal to be delivered. The SFA can increase or decrease the number of meals ordered or cancel deliveries on a twenty-four hour notice to the FSMC.
- 4.4 The SFA shall monitor the food service through periodic on-site reviews to include the inspection of meals, food preparation, storage and service areas, sanitation practices, and procedures for accurately counting and claiming meals provided that nothing in this paragraph shall be construed as to relieve the FSMC of its independent obligation to provide proper oversight and supervision of its operations or to otherwise comply with State and Federal rules and/or regulations.
- 4.5 The SFA shall approve the menus and recipes for meals and other food to be served or sold to students to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations of the Illinois State Board of Education and the United States Department of Agriculture.
- 4.6 The SFA shall inform the FSMC of any adjustments to menus and monitor implementation of adjustments.
- 4.7 The SFA shall approve all a la carte items and the prices charged for those items in advance of sale by the FSMC.
- 4.8 The SFA shall retain signatory authority on the Illinois State Board of Education Annual School Application for Participation in Child Nutrition, Illinois Free Breakfast and Lunch, and Food Distribution Programs; the Policy Statement for Free Meals, Free Milk, and Reduced-Price Meals; the Permanent Agreement; and the Child Nutrition Program Monthly Claim for Reimbursement.
- 4.9 The SFA shall establish internal controls which ensure the accuracy of meal counts prior to the submission of each *Monthly Claim for Reimbursement* including:
  - · On-site reviews of the meal counting and claiming system,
  - · Reviews of meal count data for each site, and
  - Edit checks of meal count data against the product of the eligibility data times an attendance factor.
- 4.10 The SFA shall ensure USDA Foods received for use by the SFA and made available to the FSMC are utilized within the specified Term of this Contract in the SFA's food service operation for the preparation and service of meals and for other allowable uses in accordance with the Code of Federal Regulations, 7 C.F.R. Part 250.
- 4.11 The SFA shall maintain and post, in a publicly visible location, all reports on the most recent food safety inspection, and provide a copy of the food safety inspection reports to a member of the public upon request.

- 4.12 The SFA shall establish and maintain an advisory board composed of parents, teachers, and students to assist in menu planning.
- 4.13 The SFA shall be responsible for receiving medical statements regarding students' disabilities/special dietary needs and shall ensure the FSMC complies with all special dietary accommodation requirements. Substitutions are made on a case-by-case basis and must be supported by a statement of the need for substitutes that includes the recommended alternate foods, unless otherwise exempted by the Food and Nutrition Service, USDA. In the case of a student with disabilities, the statement must be signed by a medical doctor. For students without disabilities, the statement must be signed by a recognized medical authority.
- 4.14 The SFA shall distribute and collect the letter and household applications for free and reduced-price meals or milk and determine eligibility of students for meal benefits.
- 4.15 The SFA shall verify applications for free and reduced-price meals and conduct any appeals or hearings for eligibility determinations.
- 4.16 The SFA shall be responsible for resolution of program review and audit findings.
- 4.17 The FSMC director must ensure that the FSMC employees providing services for the school meal programs have the required annual Professional Standards Regulations training.

  Therefore, the SFA must require the FSMC to provide documentation showing the training hours and topics completed by the employees.

## SECTION 5 FOOD SERVICE MANAGEMENT COMPANY RESPONSIBILITIES

- 5.1 The FSMC shall provide its services hereunder at all times in accordance with generally accepted standards of care and best practices in the industry.
- 5.2 The FSMC shall deliver meals as requested by the SFA to sites at the specified locations at the times listed on Exhibit A or as designated by the SFA.
- 5.3 The FSMC shall serve, on such days and at such times as requested by the SFA:
  - 5.2.1 Breakfasts, priced as a unit, which meet USDA requirements
  - 5.2.2 Lunches, priced as a unit, which meet USDA requirements
  - 5.2.3 After-school snacks, priced as a unit, pursuant to the After-School Care Program
- 5.2.4 Other foods as agreed upon by the FSMC and SFA, pursuant to applicable regulatory requirements
- 5.4 The FSMC shall serve free, reduced-price, and paid meals and/or free milk to those children designated by the SFA.
- 5.5 The FSMC shall implement the collection procedures as specified by the SFA and approved by the Illinois State Board of Education.
- 5.6 The FSMC shall implement the *Offer versus Serve* provision at the food service sites specified by the SFA on Exhibit A.
- 5.7 The FSMC shall adhere to the 21-day cycle menu(s) and portion sizes specified by the SFA on Exhibit B for the first 21 days of meal service. Thereafter, changes in the menu(s) may be made with prior approval of the SFA who shall ensure all foods and beverages are of equivalent or better quality and variety as the foods and beverages required for the first 21 days of meal service. The meals must meet the Food-Based Meal Pattern as designated herein by the SFA for each Term of the Contract, if applicable. Meals must adhere to all calorie ranges and meet the nutrition standards for National School Lunch, School Breakfast, and/or summer meals programs for the age/grade groups of school children as listed in Exhibit C.
- The serving sizes provided by the SFA on the 21-day cycle menu(s) in Exhibit B are, in most cases based on the required minimum serving sizes stated in Exhibit C. If the serving sizes for the food items indicated on the menu(s) do not meet the required average daily calorie ranges per five-day week and the nutrient standards as stated in Exhibit C, the FSMC must adjust the serving sizes and/or provide additional food items as necessary to meet the required calorie ranges and nutrient standards while meeting all Food-Based Meal Pattern requirements and without significantly altering the 21-day cycle menu(s).
- 5.9 The FSMC shall be responsible for providing meals and menus appropriate for the age of the students served and acceptable to students evidenced by a minimum of plate waste and participation levels in the National School Lunch, School Breakfast, and/or summer meals programs, as applicable.
- 5.10 The FSMC shall participate in the parent, teacher, and student advisory board.
- 5.11 The FSMC shall adhere to and assist in the implementation, enforcement, and evaluation of all nutrition-related requirements in the SFA's Local Wellness Policy. The FSMC shall remain

- informed of increasing industry standards and assist the SFA in modifying its Local Wellness Policy to reflect the highest current nutrition-related standards. Refer to Exhibit H.
- 5.12 The FSMC shall cooperate with the SFA in promoting nutrition education and coordinating the SFA's food service with classroom instruction.
- 5.13 The FSMC shall use SFA facilities for preparation of food to be served as specified on Exhibit A.
- 5.14 The FSMC is required to substitute food components of the meal pattern for students with disabilities in accordance with 7 C.F.R. § 15b when the disability restricts their diet and is permitted to make substitutions for students without disabilities when they are unable to eat regular meals because of a medical or special dietary need. Refer to the requirements outlined in Section 4.
- 5.15 The FSMC shall deposit daily all monies in the SFA's nonprofit food service account.
- 5.16 The FSMC shall comply with all local and state sanitation requirements.

It will be the joint responsibility of the SFA and the FSMC to protect the anonymity of all children receiving free or reduced-price meals, and methods for ensuring anonymity shall be jointly agreed upon; provided that nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to relieve the FSMC of its independent obligation to protect the anonymity of all children receiving free or reduced-price meals and to provide the required quality and extent of goods and services hereunder. FSMC acknowledges that SFA is a public school district that provides educational services to minor students. FSMC acknowledges that in the course of servicing the agreement as a third-party service provider maintaining an administrative interest in the SFA's students, it will encounter confidential student records pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the Illinois School Student Records Act (ISSRA), 105 ILCS 10/1 et seq., among other confidentiality statutes. FSMC warrants that it will not misuse, misappropriate, or voluntarily disclose any stored information or records on the Equipment to any third party.

- 5.17 At the SFA's discretion, the SFA may conduct performance reviews of the FSMC's performance under the Contract. Any services performed under this Contract shall be subject to a performance review. The FSMC shall cooperate with the SFA in these reviews, which may require the FSMC to provide records of its performance. Performance reviews may be used by the SFA to determine whether to enter into future contractual relationships with the FSMC, including subsequent Contract renewal Terms, as applicable. Performance reviews may include, but are not limited to:
  - Completion and performance of contractual services rendered;
  - Adherence to the meal pattern and food specification requirements, including quality and variety:
  - Performance on SFA On-Site Reviews and status of required corrective action, if any;
  - Performance on State and/or Federal reviews and status of required corrective action, if any;
  - Participation trends, including program participation compared to a la carte sales;
  - Responsiveness of local staff and management to the SFA's needs, including the Advisory Board and Local Wellness Committee, as applicable; and
  - Responsiveness of regional management to the SFA and local staff/management.

#### SECTION 6 USDA FOODS

- 6.1 Any USDA Foods received for use by the SFA and made available to the FSMC shall be utilized within the specified Term of this Contract in the SFA's food service operation for the preparation and service of meals and for other allowable uses in accordance with the Code of Federal Regulations, 7 C.F.R. Part 250.
- The FSMC shall accept and use USDA Foods in as large a quantity as may be efficiently utilized in the nonprofit food service subject to approval of the SFA. The SFA and FSMC must order USDA Foods on the Illinois Commodity System (ICS) in quantities sufficient to receive and credit the SFA for USDA Foods totaling at least 85% of the SFA's annual USDA Foods entitlement amount. The SFA's USDA Foods entitlement amount for the current school year is stated in Exhibit D.
- 6.3 The FSMC shall manage all USDA Foods to ensure the USDA Foods are utilized in the SFA's food service.
- 6.4 The FSMC shall utilize all USDA ground beef, ground pork, and processed end products received in the SFA's food service. Commercially-purchased foods shall not be substituted for these foods.
- 6.5 The FSMC shall utilize all other USDA Foods, or substitute commercially-purchased foods of the same generic identity, of U.S. origin, and of equal or better quality than the USDA Foods as determined by the SFA, in the SFA's food service.
- The FSMC shall credit the SFA's monthly bill/invoice the current market value as issued by the Illinois State Board of Education of all USDA Foods received during each Contract Term. The FSMC must credit the SFA for all USDA Foods received for use in the SFA's food service each Contract Term whether the USDA Foods have been used or not. Such credit shall be issued in full prior to the expiration of each Contract Term.
- 6.7 Credit issued by the FSMC to the SFA for USDA Foods received during each Contract Term and used in the SFA's food service shall be recorded on the monthly bill/invoice as a separate line item entry and shall be clearly identified and labeled. Attached to the invoice shall be a detailed list identifying each received USDA Foods item used in the SFA's food service and each USDA Foods item credit issued for unused USDA Foods, along with the current market value as issued by the Illinois State Board of Education.
- The current market value of USDA Foods is based on the prices issued by the Illinois State Board of Education in compliance with 7 C.F.R. § 250.58(e).
- 6.9 The SFA shall ensure the method and timing of crediting does not cause its cash resources to exceed limits established in 7 C.F.R. § 210.9(b)(2).
- 6.10 At the end of each Contract Term and upon expiration or termination of the Contract, a reconciliation shall be conducted by the SFA to ensure and verify correct and proper credit has been received for the full value of all USDA Foods received by the FSMC during each Contract Term for use in the SFA's food service.
- 6.11 The SFA shall verify receipt of USDA Foods shipments through its electronic records or by contacting the Illinois State Board of Education or processor as applicable.

- 6.12 The SFA reserves the right to conduct USDA Foods credit audits throughout each Contract Term to ensure compliance with federal regulations 7 C.F.R. Part 210 and Part 250.
- 6.13 The FSMC may store and inventory USDA Foods together with commercial foods purchased for use in the SFA's food service. The FSMC must meet all storage and inventory management requirements outlined in 7 C.F.R. Part 250. USDA ground beef, ground pork, and processed end products shall be stored in a manner that ensures usage in the SFA's food service.
- 6.14 The FSMC must accept liability for any negligence on their part that results in any loss, damage, out of condition, or improper use of USDA Foods not yet credited to the SFA, and shall credit the SFA either monthly or through a fiscal year-end reconciliation.
- 6.15 The SFA and FSMC shall consult and agree on end products to be produced from USDA Foods during each Contract Term. If the SFA and FSMC cannot agree on end products, the FSMC shall utilize the USDA Foods in the form furnished by the USDA.
- 6.16 The SFA shall have processing contracts in place when a commercial facility processes or repackages USDA Foods. The FSMC shall pay all related processing fees and costs. The SFA shall not be responsible for any costs associated with processing USDA Foods. The National Processing Contract must be used as the basis for the processing agreement as determined by the Illinois State Board of Education. The terms and conditions of the processing contract must comply with 7 C.F.R. Part 250. In accordance with 7 CFR 250.51(a), the FSMC must credit the SFA for the full value of all USDA Foods received for use in the SFA's meal service in a school year or fiscal year (including both entitlement and bonus foods). This includes crediting for the value of USDA Foods contained in processed end products (per 6.19 below).
- 6.17 The FSMC shall not enter into subcontracts for further processing of USDA Foods.
- 6.18 The FSMC shall be responsible for all delivery, freight/handling, storage, and warehousing costs associated with USDA Foods. The SFA shall be responsible for all storage and warehousing costs associated with USDA Foods. Approximate annual delivery, freight/handling costs are \$6,000.
- 6.19 If the FSMC acts as an intermediary between a processor and the SFA, the FSMC shall credit the SFA for the value of USDA Foods contained in the processed end products at the USDA Foods processing agreement value unless the processor is providing such credit directly to the SFA. Such credit shall be issued to the SFA on the monthly bill/invoice as a separate line item entry and shall be clearly identified and labeled.
- 6.20 The FSMC shall have records maintained and available to substantiate the receipt, use, storage, and inventory of USDA Foods. The FSMC must submit to the SFA monthly inventory reports showing all transactions for processed and/or non-processed USDA Foods.
- 6.21 The SFA, Illinois State Board of Education, Comptroller General, and U.S. Department of Agriculture, or their duly authorized representatives, may perform on-site reviews of the FSMC's food service operation, including the review of records, to ensure compliance with the requirements of this Contract and federal regulations 7 C.F.R. Part 210 and Part 250.
- 6.22 The FSMC must return all unused USDA ground beef products, ground pork products, and processed end products to the SFA upon termination, expiration, or non-renewal of the Contract.

- 6.23 At the discretion of the SFA, the FSMC may be required to return other unused USDA Foods to the SFA upon termination, expiration, or non-renewal of the Contract.
- 6.24 The SFA shall retain title to all USDA Foods provided to the FSMC for use in the SFA's food service.
- 6.25 The bid rate per meal must be calculated as if no USDA Foods were available.

## SECTION 7 PURCHASES/BUY AMERICAN

- 7.1 The FSMC shall retain title of all purchased food and nonfood items.
- 7.2 The FSMC shall purchase, to the maximum extent practicable, domestic commodities or products which are either an agricultural commodity produced in the United States or a food product processed in the United States substantially using agricultural commodities produced in the United States (U.S.).
- 7.3 The FSMC shall not substitute commercially-purchased foods for USDA ground beef, ground pork, and processed end products received.
- 7.4 The FSMC may substitute commercially-purchased foods for all other USDA Foods received. All commercially-purchased food substitutes must be of the same generic identity as the USDA Foods received, of U.S. origin, and of equal or better quality than the USDA Foods as determined by the SFA.
- 7.5 The SFA shall ensure commercially-purchased foods used in place of USDA Foods received are of the same generic identity as the USDA Foods received, of U.S. origin, and of equal or better quality than the USDA Foods as determined by the SFA.
- 7.6 The FSMC shall certify the percentage of U.S. content in the products supplied to the SFA.
- 7.7 The SFA reserves the right to review FSMC purchase records to ensure compliance with the *Buy American* provision in 7 C.F.R. Part 250.
- 7.8 The FSMC shall provide Nutrition Facts labels and any other documentation requested by the SFA to ensure compliance with U.S. content requirements.
- 7.9 For the duration of the Contract and all subsequent renewal Terms, as applicable, the FSMC shall purchase foods and beverages that are equivalent or better in quality and variety as those items required in the 21-day cycle menu, per the requirements outlined above, Exhibit B, and the food specifications contained herein.

## SECTION 8 USE OF FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT

- 8.1 The SFA shall make available without any cost or charge to the FSMC, the areas and premises agreeable to both parties in which the FSMC shall render its services.
- 8.2 The SFA shall make any structural changes needed to comply with federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations.
- 8.3 The equipment owned by the current contractor is an attachment, Exhibit 1, to this contract. The FSMC awarded the Contract shall be responsible for providing and installing, as applicable, all equipment as designated in Exhibit 1, if necessary for the provision of the contractual services required by this Contract.
- The FSMC shall not use the SFA's facilities to produce food, meals, or services for other organizations or otherwise use the facilities of the SFA for any reason other than those specifically provided for in this Contract without the express written consent of the SFA.
- 8.5 The FSMC and SFA shall inventory the equipment and supplies owned by the SFA at the beginning of the school year and the end of the school year, including but not limited to flatware, trays, chinaware, glassware, and kitchen utensils. The FSMC will be responsible for correcting any discrepancies that are not the result of normal wear and tear within 30 days of the end-of-the-school-year inventory.
- The SFA shall repair and service SFA-owned equipment except when damages result from the use of less-than-reasonable care by the FSMC employees or agents as determined by the SFA. When damage results from less-than-reasonable care on the part of any FSMC employees or agents, it will be the FSMCs responsibility to repair and service the damaged equipment, incurring all applicable fees and costs, within a reasonable timeframe to ensure no disruption in service.
- 8.7 The FSMC shall provide, at no cost to the SFA, complete maintenance, repair, and replacement services for all FSMC-owned property and equipment.
- 8.8 The SFA reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to use its facilities to sell or dispense any food or beverage before or after regularly scheduled lunch or breakfast periods provided such use does not interfere with the operation of the Child Nutrition Programs.
- 8.9 The SFA shall return facilities and equipment to the FSMC in the same condition as received when the SFA uses the facilities for extra-curricular activities.
- 8.10 The FSMC shall maintain the inventory of expendable equipment necessary for the food service and at the inventory level as specified by the SFA.
- 8.11 The SFA shall be legally responsible for any losses of USDA Foods which may arise due to equipment malfunction or loss of electrical power not within the control of the FSMC.
- 8.12 The FSMC and/or its employees or agents shall not remove equipment or property of the SFA from the SFA's premises including, but not limited to, food preparation and/or serving equipment.
- 8.13 The FSMC shall provide written notification to the SFA of any equipment belonging to the FSMC within ten days of its placement on SFA premises.

- 8.14 The SFA shall not be legally responsible for loss or damage to equipment and/or vehicles owned by the FSMC and located on SFA premises.
- 8.15 The SFA shall provide sanitary toilet facilities for the FSMC employees.
- 8.16 The SFA shall have access, with or without notice to the FSMC, to all SFA facilities used by the FSMC for inspection and audit purposes.
- 8.17 The FSMC shall surrender all SFA-owned equipment and furnishings in good repair and condition to the SFA upon termination of the Contract, reasonable wear and tear excepted.
- 8.18 The SFA must give prior approval and have final authority for the purchase of equipment used for storage, preparation, serving, or delivery of school meals.
- 8.19 The FSMC shall retain title to all FSMC-owned property and equipment when placed in service.
- 8.20 Upon expiration or termination of the Contract, it shall be the FSMC's responsibility to remove all FSMC-owned property and equipment within a timely manner and without damage to SFA facilities.
- 8.21 The SFA shall retain title to all SFA-owned property and equipment when placed in service. If the property and/or equipment is amortized through the FSMC and the Contract expires or is terminated, the SFA can return the property to the FSMC for full release of the unpaid balance or continue to make payments in accordance with amortization schedules
- 8.22: The successful vendor will provide one delivery van to be used for the delivery of food and supplies to the schools. All vehicles must have inspections in accordance with legal requirements. Any vehicle that is not in compliance with inspection requirements shall not be used. The vehicle provided is not required to be solely dedicated to the SFA nor will be parked there overnight, weekends, holidays, etc.

## SECTION 9 SANITATION

- 9.1 The FSMC shall place garbage and trash in containers as specified by the SFA and place them in designated areas.
- 9.2 The SFA shall remove all garbage and trash from the designated areas.
- 9.3 The FSMC shall clean the kitchen area including, but not limited to, sinks, counters, grease traps, tables, chairs, flatware, utensils, walls floors, light fixtures, and window coverings.
- 9.4 The FSMC shall operate and care for all equipment and food service areas in a clean, safe, and healthy condition in accordance with standards acceptable to the SFA and comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, and rules of federal, state, and local authorities.
- 9.5 The SFA shall clean ducts and hoods above the filter line.
- 9.6 The SFA shall provide extermination services as needed.
- 9.7 The SFA shall clean the dining/cafeteria area, including tables, chairs, and floors after the meal service.

## SECTION 10 INSPECTION OF FACILITY

- 10.1 The SFA, the Illinois State Board of Education, and the U.S. Department of Agriculture reserve the right to inspect the FSMC's preparation and storage facilities, and transporting vehicles prior to award of Contract and without notice at any time during each Contract Term, including the right to be present during preparation and delivery of meals.
- 10.2 The FSMC must provide meals when requested for periodic inspection by the local or state health department or an independent agency to determine the bacterial levels in the meals served.

## SECTION 11 DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS AND NONCOMPLIANCE

- 11.1 Meals must be delivered in accordance with the approved menu cycle.
- 11.2 The FSMC shall provide a delivery slip with the date and the number of meals delivered. The SFA authorized representative or his/her designee must sign the delivery slip and verify the condition of the meals received.
- 11.3 Meals must be delivered in closed-topped, sanitary vehicles.
- 11.4 Meals must be delivered in clean, sanitary transporting containers that maintain the proper temperatures of food and are food-grade containers approved by the local or state health departments.
- 11.5 When an emergency prevents the FSMC from delivering meals, the FSMC shall notify the SFA-authorized representative or his/her designee immediately by phone indicating the reasons for the need for substitution.
- 11.6 The SFA reserves the right to inspect and determine the quality of food delivered. The SFA may reject and not pay for any meals or components of meals that are unwholesome, judged as poor quality, damaged, incomplete either due to inadequate portion sizes or missing number of meal components, or delivered in unsanitary conditions such as incorrect temperatures.
- 11.7 The SFA will obtain meals from other sources if meals are rejected or if an insufficient number of meals is delivered. The SFA will contact the FSMC immediately regarding the reasons for rejected meals or if an inadequate number of meals delivered. If the FSMC cannot replace meals in time for meal service, then the SFA can obtain meals from another source and deduct the actual cost of such meals from the monthly bill of the FSMC. The FSMC is responsible for the cost of replacement meals.
- 11.8 The SFA will not pay for deliveries made later than the regularly scheduled lunch or breakfast periods as listed on Exhibit A, or as otherwise stated in this Contract.

## SECTION 12 PACKAGING REQUIREMENTS

- 12.1 Hot meal unit—Packaging suitable for maintaining components at temperatures in accordance with state and local health standards. Container and overlay should have an airtight closure, be of non-toxic material, and be capable of withstanding temperatures of 350°F (204°C) or higher.
- 12.2 Cold meal unit or unnecessary to heat—Container and overlay to be plastic or paper and non-toxic. Hot bulk meals must be in stainless steel containers with lids with a depth of no more than four inches.
- 12.3 Cold meals must be in white or brown paper bags or in boxes with enough strength to hold meals without tearing or ripping.
- 12.4 Cartons—Each carton shall be labeled to meet state or local requirements. Label should include
  - Processor's name, address, and zip code (plant)
  - Food items and meal type
  - Date of production
  - Quantity of individual units per carton
- 12.5 Meals shall be delivered with the following items: condiments, straws for milk, napkins, single service ware, and serving utensils. FSMC shall insert non-food items that are necessary for the meal to be eaten.
- 12.6 All refrigerated food shall be delivered at an internal temperature of 40°F or below.
- 12.7 All frozen food shall be delivered at 0°F or below. Frozen products should show no evidence of thawing and re-freezing, freezer burn, or any off color or odors.
- 12.8 All hot food shall be delivered with an internal temperature of 135°F or above.

#### SECTION 13 EMPLOYEES

- 13.1 The FSMC shall comply with all wage and hours of employment regulations of federal and state law.
- 13.2 The FSMC shall pay all FSMC employees in accordance with the Fair Labor Standards Act and any other applicable statutes.
- 13.3 The FSMC and SFA recognize that one of the most important elements of a successful food service program is the staff employed to administer the food service program. The FSMC shall be responsible for the employment of the staff necessary for the safe, timely, and efficient distribution of meals to students and members of the SFA staff in accordance with Exhibit G . The District/SFA employs 3 food staff members that report to the SFA.
- 13.4 The FSMC shall instruct its employees to abide by the policies, rules, and regulations, with respect to use of SFA premises, as established by the SFA and furnished in writing to the FSMC.
- 13.5 The FSMC shall provide the SFA with a list of its personnel policies and employee handbook.
- 13.6 The FSMC shall ensure, at its own expense, required fingerprint-based criminal history records checks are conducted on all FSMC employees assigned to the SFA and results are provided to the SFA per *The School Code of Illinois*, 105 ILCS 5/10-21.9. Furthermore, the FSMC is not permitted to employ on the premises of the SFA any employee who has been convicted of an offense as described in 105 ILCS 5/21–23a.
- 13.7 For each FSMC employee, the FSMC shall perform periodic checks of the Statewide Sex Offender Database, as authorized by the Sex Offender Community Notification Law (730 ILCS § 152/101 et seq.), and the Statewide Child Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Database, as authorized by the Child Murderer and Violent Offender Against Youth Community Notification Law (730 ILCS § 154/75–105). All results must be provided to the SFA.
- 13.8 The SFA shall submit to the FSMC a current schedule of employees, positions, assigned locations, hours of work, wages and benefits (if applicable) on Exhibit G which must be used for bid calculation purposes at a minimum initial Contract Term cost to the FSMC.
- 13.9 The FSMC shall maintain the same minimum level of employee positions, hours, wages, and benefits as stipulated on Exhibit G throughout the entire Contract Term, and each subsequent Contract Term, as applicable, unless a reduction in the required levels is authorized by the SFA. The FSMC shall provide the SFA with written notice of any increases in employee positions, hours, wages, and benefits.
- 13.10 In the event a reduction in employee positions, hours, wages, and/or benefits occurs and such reduction is authorized by the SFA, the FSMC shall credit the SFA's monthly bill/invoice for the exact dollar amount related to the cost of the labor reduction as indicated on Exhibit G for the remainder of the Contract Term and all subsequent Contract Terms, as applicable, including the value of any subsequent and future increases in employee wages and benefits. Such credits shall be termed a Labor Reduction Fee.
- 13.11 The FSMC must ensure the employees' hours listed on Exhibit G are not used for catering or special functions.

- 13.12 The FSMC shall ensure that all individuals performing services on the FSMC's behalf in or for schools shall be free from communicable diseases, including tuberculosis, and administered a tuberculosis screening test if they have a <u>documented positive tuberculosis screening test result or otherwise meet the requirements for tuberculosis screening as set forth in the Illinois Department of Public Health's rules (77 Ill. Adm. Code 696.140), prior to performing any such services in or for schools, and shall ensure that all such individuals comply with all requirements established by the Illinois Department of Public Health.</u>
- 13.13 Upon written request of the SFA, the FSMC will remove any FSMC employee who violates health requirements or conducts himself/herself in a manner which is detrimental to the physical, mental, or moral well-being of students or staff, or otherwise violates SFA policies, procedures, and practices.
- 13.14 In the event of the removal or suspension of any employee, the FSMC shall immediately restructure its staff without disruption in service.
- 13.15 All food service personnel assigned to each school shall be instructed on the use of all emergency valves, switches, and fire and safety devices in the kitchen and cafeteria areas.
- 13.16 The FSMC shall provide daily, on-site supervisory personnel dedicated solely to the SFA for the overall food service.
- 13.17 The FSMC shall conduct civil rights training for all food service employees, including front-line staff, on an annual basis. Civil rights training must include:
  - Collection and use of data,
  - Effective public notification systems,
  - Complaint procedures,
  - Compliance review techniques,
  - Resolution of noncompliance,
  - Requirements for reasonable accommodation of persons with disabilities,
  - Requirements for language assistance,
  - Conflict resolution, and
  - Customer service.
- 13.18 FSMC employees providing services for the school meal programs have the required annual Professional Standards Regulations training. Therefore, the FSMC is required to provide documentation showing the training hours and topics completed by the employees.

## SECTION 14 DESIGNATION OF PROGRAM EXPENSE

- 14.1 The FSMC guarantees to the SFA that the bid meal rates and fees for each reimbursable school meal and a la carte equivalent shall include the expenses designated under Column I. The FSMC shall be responsible for negotiating/paying all employees' fringe benefits, employee expenses, and accrued vacation and sick pay for staff on their payroll, including delivery drivers.
- 14.2 The SFA shall pay those expenses designated under Column II.

#### SECTION 15 FEES

- 15.1 All bids must be calculated based on the menu(s) in Exhibit B and on the projected annual units provided on the *Bid Summary* form, both attached herein. Milk will be supplied by the FSMC. All bids shall be submitted using the *Bid Summary* form. All rates must be written in ink or typed in the blank space(s) provided and the estimated totals must be carried out to the second decimal place and must not be rounded.
- 15.2 The bid rate(s) must include the meal including milk, condiments applicable to the menu, serving utensils if applicable, packaging and containers needed to transport food in a sanitary manner, and transportation to and from the SFA.
- 15.3 The bid rate(s) must be calculated net of applicable discounts, rebates, and credits received by the FSMC and <u>must not</u> include the use USDA Foods, alternate pricing structures such as guaranteed commodity credits, or Offer versus Serve credits unless otherwise stated herein.
- 15.4 The SFA is not obligated to purchase any minimum number or dollar amount of meals under this Contract.
- 15.5 The FSMC shall receive a fixed meal rate for each reimbursable school breakfast served.
- 15.6 The FSMC shall receive a fixed meal rate for each reimbursable school lunch and a la carte equivalent served.
- 15.7 The FSMC shall receive a fixed management fee for each reimbursable school meal served.
- 15.8 The FSMC shall receive a fixed management fee for the operation of the a la carte program to be payable to the FSMC in equal monthly installments throughout each Contract Term.
- 15.9 The FSMC shall receive a fixed per-unit rate for each one-half pint of milk served in the Special Milk Program.
- 15.10 The FSMC shall receive a fixed per-unit rate for each reimbursable after-school snack served in the After-School Care Program.
- 15.11 The FSMC shall provide the SFA with *Offer versus Serve* credits for food components as follows. The SFA shall ensure a complete reimbursable meal is available to all children in accordance with 7 C.F.R. 210. The following amounts are to be credited: Fresh Vegetables \$0.15
  - Frozen Vegetables \$0.15
  - Canned Vegetables \$0.15
  - · Fresh Fruit \$0.15
  - · Frozen Fruit \$0.15
  - · Canned Fruit \$0.15
  - All Grains \$0.15
- 15.11 The SFA shall pay the FSMC the fixed meal rate(s) and fixed management fee(s) within 30 days of submission of an invoice and for each monthly period of program operation.

- 15.12 The FSMC shall receive no payment for meals that are spoiled or unwholesome at the time of serving, that do not meet the detailed specifications for each food component or menu item in accordance with 7 C.F.R. Part 210, or that do not otherwise meet the requirements of the Contract.
- 15.13 For the purposes of this Contract, a la carte shall be inclusive of all foods and beverages sold to students that do not constitute a component of a reimbursable meal plus all foods and beverages sold to adults during any and all meal services provided within the scope of this Contract. The FSMC and SFA shall determine a la carte meal equivalents by dividing all a la carte revenue 1) by a factor ten percent (10%) greater than the reimbursable lunch per meal rate, or 2) by the a la carte equivalency factor which is determined by taking the sum of the Federal and State free lunch reimbursement rates plus the value of USDA entitlement and bonus donated foods, Planned Assistance Level (PAL), established in July 2017, whichever factor is higher. For 2), the a la carte equivalency factor to be utilized for the initial 2019–2020 Contract Term is 3.7525. If 2) is the calculation method, in Contract renewal Terms, the a la carte equivalency factor will be changed annually to reflect the change in the sum of the reimbursement rates and PAL as stated above. The rates used will be those established in July of the preceding calendar year and will remain in effect until the subsequent Contract renewal Term, if applicable.
- 15.14 The FSMC cannot provide guaranteed USDA Foods credits. The FSMC shall credit the SFA's monthly bill/invoice the current market value of all USDA Foods as designated herein. Credit issued by the FSMC to the SFA for USDA Foods received during each Contract Term and used in the SFA's food service shall be recorded on the monthly bill/invoice as a separate line item entry and shall be clearly identified and labeled. Attached to the invoice shall be a detailed list identifying each received USDA Foods item used in the SFA's food service and each USDA Foods item credit issued for unused USDA Foods, along with the current market value as issued by the Illinois State Board of Education. Prior to the expiration of each Contract Term, the SFA shall be credited in full for all USDA Foods received.
- 15.15 The SFA shall ensure the method and timing of crediting does not cause its cash resources to exceed the limits established in 7 C.F.R. § 210.9(b)(2).
- 15.16 The FSMC must submit all invoices pertaining to the SFA nonprofit food service within 30 days of the last day of each month or the final day of the program.
- 15.17 The FSMC shall submit separate billing for special functions conducted outside of the nonprofit school food service account.
- 15.18 The fixed meal rate for meals must be calculated as if no USDA Foods were available.

#### SECTION 16 REVENUE

- 16.1 The SFA shall receive all revenue from the food service.
- 16.2 The food service revenue shall be used only for the SFA's nonprofit food service.
- 16.3 The food service revenue shall flow through the SFA's chart of accounts.
- 16.4 All goods, services, or monies received as the result of any equipment or USDA Foods rebate shall be credited to the SFA's nonprofit food service account.
- 16.5 If reimbursement is denied as a direct result of the failure of the FSMC to comply with the provisions of this Contract, the FSMC shall assume responsibility for the amount denied.

#### SECTION 17 LICENSES, CERTIFICATIONS, AND TAXES

- 17.1 Throughout the Term of the Contract and each renewal Term, the FSMC shall obtain and maintain all applicable licenses, permits, and health certifications required by federal, state, and local law. The estimate prior annual cost for licenses/permits was \$\_500.00.
- 17.2 The FSMC shall have state or local health certification for any facility outside the SFA in which it proposes to prepare meals, if applicable, and must maintain this health certification for each Contract Term.
- 17.3 The FSMC and all affiliates shall collect and remit Illinois Use Tax on all sales of tangible personal property in the State of Illinois in accordance with Section 10-20.21(b) of the School Code (105 ILCS 5/10-20.21 [b]) and the Illinois Use Tax Act (35 ILCS 105/1 et seq.). The FSMC certifies that it is not barred from bidding or entering into this contract under Section 10-20.21(b) of the School Code and that the SFA may declare this Contract void if this certification is false.

#### SECTION 18 RECORD KEEPING

- 18.1 The FSMC shall maintain such records as the SFA will need to meet monthly reporting responsibilities and will report claim information, including daily meal counts, to the SFA promptly at the end of each month.
- 18.2 The FSMC shall have records maintained and available to demonstrate compliance with the requirements relating to USDA Foods. Such records shall include the following.
  - 18.2.1 The receipt, use, storage, and inventory of USDA Foods;
  - 18.2.2 Monthly inventory reports showing all transactions for processed and non-processed USDA Foods; and
  - 18.2.3 Documentation of credits issued to the SFA for USDA Foods received.
- All records relating to the Contract, including subsequent renewal Terms, if applicable, are property of the SFA and shall be maintained in original form on SFA premises for the duration of the Contract. At any time during the Contract, the SFA reserves the right to require the FSMC to surrender all records relating to the Contract to the SFA within 30 days of such request. Such records shall include, but are not limited to:
  - All data, materials, and products created by the FSMC on behalf of the SFA and in furtherance of the Services;
  - Production records, including quantities and amounts of food used in preparation of each meal and food component of menus;
  - Standardized recipes and yield from recipes as deemed necessary per the requirements of paragraph 18.6;
  - Processed product nutritional analysis;
  - Dates of preparation of meals;
  - Number of meals and locations where meals were delivered;
  - Signed delivery slips;
  - Nutritional content of individual food items and meals as delivered;
  - Bills charged to SFA for meals delivered under this contract including the credit of USDA Foods where applicable;
  - Inventory records:
  - Food and bid specifications; and
  - All documents and records as noted in this Invitation for Bid and Contract
- 18.4 Upon expiration or termination of the Contract, the FSMC shall surrender all records as noted above, relating to the initial Contract and all subsequent renewal Terms, if applicable, to the SFA within 30 days of the Contract expiration or termination.
- The SFA shall retain all records relating to the initial Contract and all subsequent renewal Terms for a period of three years either from the date the final Contract renewal Term has expired, receipt of final payment under the contract is recorded, or after the SFA submits the final *Monthly Claim for Reimbursement* for the final fiscal year of the Contract, whichever occurs last.

All records must be available for the period of time specified above for the purpose of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions by representatives of the SFA, the Illinois State Board of Education, the United States Department of Agriculture, and the Auditor General, and other governmental entities with monitoring authority at any reasonable time and place. If audit findings have not been resolved, the records shall be retained beyond the specified period as long as required for the resolution of the issues raised by the audit.

#### SECTION 19 TERMS AND TERMINATION

- 19.1 This Contract is effective for a one-year period commencing July 1, 2019 or upon written acceptance of the Contract, whichever occurs last, through \_June 30, 2020\_\_, (the "Term") with options to renew yearly not to exceed four additional years (each a renewal "Term").
- 19.2 Renewal of this Contract is contingent upon the fulfillment of all Contract provisions relating to USDA Foods.
- 19.3 Either the SFA or FSMC can terminate this Contract for cause or for convenience with a sixty-(60) day written notification. Following sixty-(60) day written notification, the SFA can terminate this Contract in whole or in part without the payment of any penalty or incurring any further obligation to the FSMC.
- 19.4 Following any termination for convenience, the FSMC shall be entitled to compensation for services completed upon submission of invoices and proof of claim for services provided under this Contract up to and including the date of termination. The SFA shall have the right to receive services from the Contractor through the effective date of the notice of termination, and may, at its election, procure such work from other contractors as may be necessary to complete the services.
- 19.5 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in this Contract, obligations of the SFA will cease immediately without penalty of further payment being required if sufficient funds for this Agreement are not appropriated by the Illinois General Assembly or a federal funding source, or such funds are otherwise not made available to the SFA for payments in accordance with this Contract.
- 19.6 Notwithstanding the notice period in paragraph 19.3, the SFA may immediately terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, upon notice to the FSMC if the SFA determines that the actions, or failure to act, of the FSMC, its agents, employees or subcontractors have caused, or reasonably could cause jeopardy to health, safety, or property; or if the SFA determines that the FSMC lacks the financial resources to perform under the Contract.
- 19.7 If the FSMC fails to perform to the SFA's satisfaction any material requirement of this Contract or is in violation of a material provision of this Contract, the SFA shall provide written notice to the FSMC requesting that the breach of noncompliance be remedied within sixty- (60) days. If the breach or noncompliance is not remedied by the specified period of time, the SFA may either: (a) immediately terminate the Contract without additional written notice or, (b) enforce the terms and conditions of the Contract, and in either event seek any available legal or equitable remedies and damages. The SFA may finish the services by whatever method the SFA may deem expedient. Any damages incurred by the SFA as a result of any Contractor default shall be borne by the Contractor at its sole cost and expense, shall not be payable as part of the Contract amount, and shall be reimbursed to the SFA by the Contractor upon demand.
- 19.8 Neither the FSMC nor SFA shall be responsible for any losses resulting if the fulfillment of the terms of the Contract is delayed or prevented by wars, acts of public enemies, strikes, fires, floods, acts of God, or any other acts which could not have been prevented by the exercise of due diligence ("Act of God"). The SFA may cancel the Contract without penalty if the FSMC's performance does not resume within 30 days of the FSMC's interruption of services due to an Act of God.
- 19.9 The only rates and fees that may be adjusted in subsequent Contract Terms are the fixed rates and fixed fees contained herein. Before any fixed rate or fee adjustments can be

implemented as part of a Contract renewal agreement, the FSMC shall document to the SFA, through a written financial analysis, the need for such adjustments. Adjustment of all individual per meal fixed rates and applicable fees in subsequent Contract Terms must not exceed \_ The Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers—Food annual rate for December of the current school year. Percentage increases cannot be applied to any previous Contract Term's total estimated or actual Contract cost. The calculation method regarding the determination of a la carte equivalents is outlined in the Fees section of this Contract.

#### SECTION 20 GENERAL CONTRACT TERMS

- 20.1 No provision of this Contract shall be assigned or subcontracted without prior written consent of the SFA.
- 20.2 This solicitation/Contract, exhibits, and attachments constitute the entire agreement between the SFA and FSMC and may not be changed, extended orally, or altered by course of conduct. No other contracts will be signed by the SFA.
- 20.3 Each party to this Contract represents and warrants to the other that: (a) it has the right, power and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under this Contract and (b) it has taken all requisite action (corporate, statutory or otherwise) to approve execution, delivery and performance of this Contract, and (c) this Contract constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation upon itself in accordance with its terms.
- 20.4 Any silence, absence, or omission from the Contract specifications concerning any point shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail, and all materials, workmanship, and services rendered shall be of a quality that would normally be specified by the SFA.
- 20.5 No course of dealing or failure of the SFA to enforce strictly any term, right, or condition of this Contract shall be construed as a waiver of such term, right, or condition. No express waiver of any term, right, or condition of this Contract shall operate as a waiver of any other term, right, or condition.
- 20.6 Payments on any claim shall not prevent the SFA from making claim for adjustment on any item found not to have been in accordance with the provisions of this Contract.
- 20.7 It is further agreed between the SFA and FSMC that the exhibits, attachments, and clauses attached and designated are hereby in all respects made a part of this Contract.
- 20.8 The FSMC shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; USDA regulations implementing Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; Age Discrimination Act of 1975; 7 C.F.R. Parts 15, 15a, and 15b; and FNS Instruction 113-1, Civil Rights Compliance and Enforcement—Nutrition Programs and Activities, and any additions or amendments.
- 20.9 If this Contract is in excess of \$100,000, the SFA and FSMC shall comply with all applicable standards, orders, and regulations, including but not limited to:
  - The Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq.), the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. § 1311–1330, § 1368), Executive Order 11738, and Environmental Protection Agency regulations (40 C.F.R. § 1.1 et seq.);
  - Certificate Regarding Lobbying pursuant to 31 U.S.C. 1352 (Appendix A: 7 C.F.R. Part 3018); and
  - Disclosure of Lobbying Activities pursuant to 31 U.S.C. 1352 (Appendix A: 7 C.F.R. Part 3018).

- 20.10 The FSMC certifies compliance with:
  - Energy Policy and Conservation Act (Pub. L. 94-163, 89 Stat. 871);
  - The Department of Labor regulations (29 C.F.R. Part 5); and
  - Executive Order 11246, entitled *Equal Employment Opportunity*, as amended by Executive Order 11375 and Department of Labor Regulation (41 C.F.R. Chapter 60).
- 20.11 The FSMC is subject to the provisions of the Stevens Amendment Section 2209d of Title 7 of the United States Code due to the use of federal funds for the food service program. All announcements and other materials publicizing this program must include statements as to the amount and proportion of federal funding involved.
- 20.12 The Illinois State Board of Education and the United States Department of Agriculture are not parties to this Contract and are not obligated, liable, or responsible for any action or inaction by the SFA or the FSMC. The SFA has full responsibility for ensuring the terms of the Contract are fulfilled.
- 20.13 To the fullest extent permitted by law, the FSMC agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the SFA and its respective agents, officers and employees from and against any and all claims, demands, suits, liabilities, injuries (personal or bodily), property damage, causes of action, losses, costs, expenses, damages, or penalties, including, without limitation, reasonable defense costs, and reasonable legal fees, arising or resulting from, or occasioned by or in connection with (i) any bodily injury or property damage resulting or arising from any act or omission to act (whether negligent, willful, wrongful, or otherwise) by the FSMC, its subcontractors, anyone directly or indirectly employed by them or anyone for whose acts they may be liable; (ii) failure by the FSMC or its subcontractors to comply with any Laws applicable to the performance of the Services; (iii) any breach of this Contract, including, without limitation, any representation or warranty provided by the FSMC herein; (iv) any employment actions of any nature or kind including but not limited to, workers compensation, or labor action brought by the FSMC's employees; or (v) any identity breach or infringement of any copyright, trademark, patent, or other intellectual property right.
- 20.14 In order for the SFA to respond timely and appropriately to the requirements of the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) [5 ILCS 140], the FSMC must review all documents required to be provided under this Contract and the exemptions for release under FOIA and, if exemptions are allowed, provide the SFA a redacted copy for release under FOIA, along with the original. The redacted copy shall be marked as "REDACTED", and the FSMC shall reference the specific grounds under FOIA or other law or rule supporting the specific redaction request to exempt certain information. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the SFA may not necessarily be allowed to release *just* the redacted versions. Redactions based on personal privacy and preliminary drafts, by law, must be sent to the State of Illinois Public Access Counselor before a denial to a FOIA request can be made. The SFA will abide by the decisions of the Public Access Counselor.

- 20.15 Each Party, including its agents and subcontractors, to this Contract may have or gain access to confidential and proprietary data or information of the other Party including, without limitation, other technical information (including functional and technical specifications, designs, drawings, analysis, research, processes, computer programs, methods, ideas, "know how," and the like), business information (sales and marketing research, materials, plans, accounting and financial information, personnel records, and the like), all student data and information, and other information designated as confidential expressly or by the circumstances in which it is provided ("Confidential Information"). No Confidential Information collected, maintained, or used in the course of performance of the Contract shall be disseminated except as authorized by law and with the written consent of the disclosing Party, either during the Term of the Contract or thereafter. The recipient must return any and all Confidential Information used in the course of the performance of the Contract, in whatever form it is maintained, promptly upon termination of the Contract, or earlier at the request of the disclosing Party, or notify the disclosing Party in writing of its destruction, if destruction is permitted by the disclosing Party. Confidential Information does not include data or information lawfully in the recipient's possession prior to its acquisition from the disclosing Party; received by the recipient from a third party who was free to disclose it; publicly known through no breach of confidentiality obligation by the recipient; or independently developed by the recipient without the use or benefit of the disclosing Party's Confidential Information.
- 20.16 Student Records. The Contractor will comply with the relevant requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. 1232g) and the Illinois School Student Records Act (ISSRA) (105 ILCS 10/1 et seq.) regarding the confidentiality of student "education records" as defined in FERPA and "school student records" as defined in ISSRA. Any use of information contained in student education records to be released must be approved by the SFA. To protect the confidentiality of student education records, the Contractor will limit access to student education records to those employees who reasonably need access to them in order to perform their responsibilities under this Contract. Any student records in the Contractor's possession shall be returned to the SFA when no longer needed for the purposes for which they were provided, or at the SFA's written request, they shall be permanently destroyed and the Contractor shall provide written confirmation to the SFA upon the destruction of student records.

### SECTION 21 FOOD SPECIFICATIONS

21.1 All USDA Foods offered to the SFA and made available to the FSMC are acceptable and should be utilized in as large a quantity as may be efficiently utilized.

For all other food components, specifications shall be as follows:

- 21.2 All breads, bread alternates, and grains must be whole-grain rich. All breads and grains must be fresh (or frozen, if applicable) and must meet the minimum weight per serving as listed on Exhibit C. If applicable, product should be in moisture-proof wrapping and pack-code date provided.
- 21.3 All meat and poultry must have been inspected by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and must be free from off color or odor.
  - 21.3.1 Beef must be at least 70:30 lean to fat, preferably 80:20 lean to fat.
  - 21.3.2 Poultry should be U.S. Grade A when applicable and should meet the recommendations outlined in *Specifications for Poultry Products, A Guide for Food Service Operators* from the USDA.
  - 21.3.3 For breaded and battered items, all flours must be enriched for breads/grains credit and breading/batter must not exceed 30 percent of the weight of the finished product.
  - 21.3.4 For sausage patties, the maximum fat allowed is 50 percent by weight; industry standard of 38 to 42 percent fat preferred.
- 21.4 All cured processed meats (bologna, frankfurters, luncheon meat, salami, others) shall be made from beef and/or poultry. No variety meats, fillers, extenders, non-fat milk solids, or cereal will be allowed. Meats must not show evidence of greening, streaking, or other discoloration.
- 21.5 All cheese should be firm, compact and free from gas holes; free of mold; free of undesirable flavor and odors; pasteurized when applicable; and preferably reduced or low-fat. All cheese should also have a bright, uniform, and attractive appearance; have a pleasing flavor; demonstrate satisfactory meltability; and contain proper moisture and salt content.
- 21.6 All fish must have been inspected by the United States Department of Commerce (USDC) and meet minimum flesh and batter/breading requirements for USDC Grade A product or a product packed under federal inspection (PUFI) by the USDC.
- 21.7 All fresh fruits must be ripe and in good condition when delivered and must be ready for consumption per the USDA *Food Buying Guide*. At a minimum, fruits must meet the food distributors' second-quality level. Fruits should have characteristic color and good flavor and be well shaped and free from scars and bruises. Size must produce a yield equal to or greater than the attached 21-day cycle menu requirements.
- 21.8 All fresh vegetables must be ripe and in good condition when delivered and must be ready for consumption per the USDA *Food Buying Guide*. At a minimum, vegetables must meet the food distributors' second quality level. Vegetables should have characteristic color and good flavor, be well-shaped, and be free from discoloration, blemishes, and decay. Size must produce a yield equal to or greater than the attached 21-day cycle menu requirements.
- 21.9 All canned vegetables must meet the food distributors' first-quality level (extra fancy and fancy) and canned fruits (standard) must meet the second-quality level. Vegetables should

- have characteristic color and good fresh flavor and be free from discoloration, blemishes, and decay.
- 21.10 Eggs must be inspected and passed by the state or federal Department of Agriculture and used within 30 days of date on carton. Eggs should be grade A, uniform in size, clean, sound-shelled, and free of foreign odors or flavors.
- 21.11 Sauces, such as gravy, spaghetti sauce, pizza sauce, etc., must be smooth and uniform in color with no foreign substance, flavor, odor, or off color.
- 21.12 If applicable, the food production facility, manufacturing plant, and products must meet all sanitary and other requirements of the Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act and other regulations that support the wholesomeness of products.
- 21.13 Meals and food items must be stored and prepared under properly controlled temperatures and in accordance with all applicable health and sanitation regulations.
- 21.14 All fruit juices must be 100 percent fruit juice.
- 21.15 When the specification calls for "Brand Name or Equivalent", the brand name product is acceptable. Other products may be considered with proof that such products meet stated specifications and are deemed equivalent to the brand products in terms of quality, performance, and desired characteristics, as determined by the SFA.
- 21.16 All food items must adhere to the sodium target levels in subsequent Contract Terms, if applicable, as required by the USDA *Nutrition Standards in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs, Implementation Timeline for Final Rule* and/or other subsequent guidance issued by the USDA.
- 21.17 Nutrition labels or manufacturer specifications must indicate zero grams of trans fat per serving for all foods.
- 21.18 Fluid milk must be low-fat (1 percent milk fat or less, unflavored only) or fat-free (unflavored or flavored). Two choices must be offered daily as required by the SFA.


