Courses That Lead to College Credit... Advanced Placement (AP)





College-level courses that are more challenging and faster paced than traditional on-level high school courses



Taught by FHS teachers who have received training and are using curriculum created by the College Board



Must take and pass the AP exam to earn college credit






Courses That Lead to College Credit...

Advanced Placement (AP)



- Widely recognized by colleges & universities
- Strong test-takers tend to do well
- Very rigorous, face-to-face classes taught by FHS teachers
- Students who take AP courses are more prepared for college regardless of their performance on the AP exams



Considerations...

- College credit is dependent on a single exam score
- Some private/out-of-state institutions will accept the credit
- Credit may be granted for a college elective rather than core courses


In 2023:

FHS gave 233 AP exams to 149 students.


FHS students earned 456 hours worth of college credit from AP exams.

FHS had a passing rate of 65%, which was 14% higher than the state of Texas average (51%).







Students are enrolled in BOTH a high school course at FHS and an online college course at UT or Tarleton.



Separate grade for each course--the high school grade goes on the high school transcript and the college grade may go on the college transcript (if the student accepts the credit).

Option at the end of the course to accept or decline the college credit. If not satisfied with their college grade, students can decline the credit so it does not go on their college transcript.





Courses That Lead to College Credit... Dual Enrollment

Advantages...

- Successful performance generates a UT and/or Tarleton transcript which is accepted almost anywhere
- Students do not have to meet TSI standard prior to enrollment
- Students may decline the college credit if they want, while still getting high school credit
- Students have access to an FHS teacher for help
- FHS teachers are trained and supported by UT/Tarleton staff to provide guidance & engaging lessons for students.

Considerations...

 The self-directed learning format and level of rigor of the college portion may not be a good fit for all students



The average cost of a college credit at UT is \$2,968.

FISD covers the cost of the course.

Courses That Lead to College Credit... Dual Credit

Considerations...

- Advantages...
- Students receive credit on their college transcripts as soon as they pass the course
- Final grades are based on multiple assignments & assessments spread across the semester
- Credit will transfer just about anywhere
- Students who are organized, disciplined, independent learners tend to do very well

- Not receiving credit (due to drop or failure) impacts SAP (Satisfactory Academic Progress) which could impact financial aid
- FERPA --Parents will not be able to engage with professors about their students
- Only 4 DC per year count towards high school GPA
- Must be classified as Sophomore or higher
- Most courses require TSI Testing
- Must have 3.0+ High School GPA



FHS students took a total of

404 college courses and earned 1,212 hours of college credit!

At FHS,


GPA is calculated on a weighted 5.0 scale. This weighted GPA is used to determine class rank.

Tier I courses are Weighted MORE than Tier 2 courses.

A student's semester grades are converted from a 100 point scale to the 5.0 scale.

For example: Let's say Alter Stolz makes a 92 in regular Algebra for the fall semester.

His **92** would be converted to **3.2**, because Algebra is an on-level **Tier 2** course.



But, if Alter Stolz makes a 92 in AP Calculus for the fall semester...


