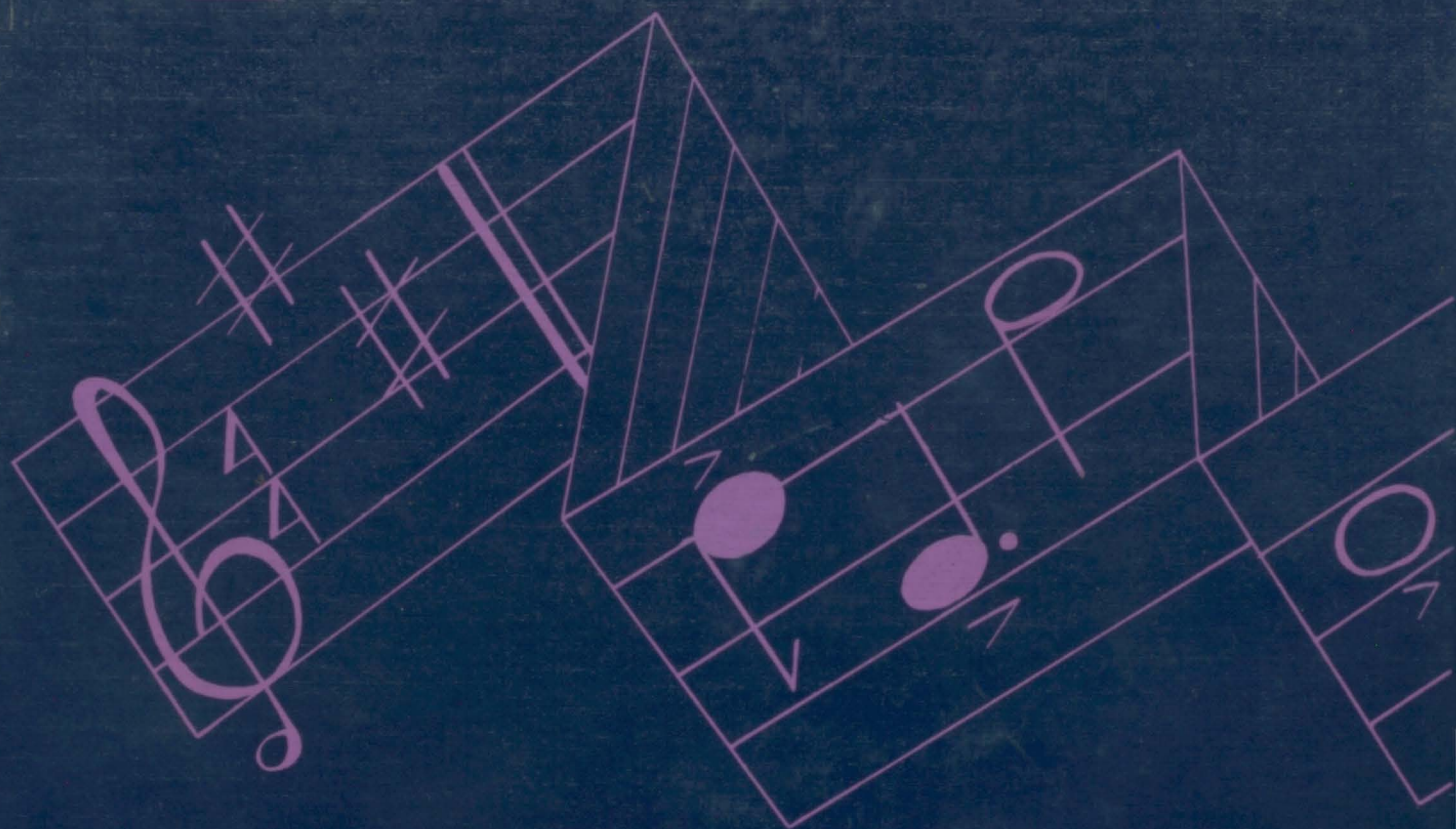
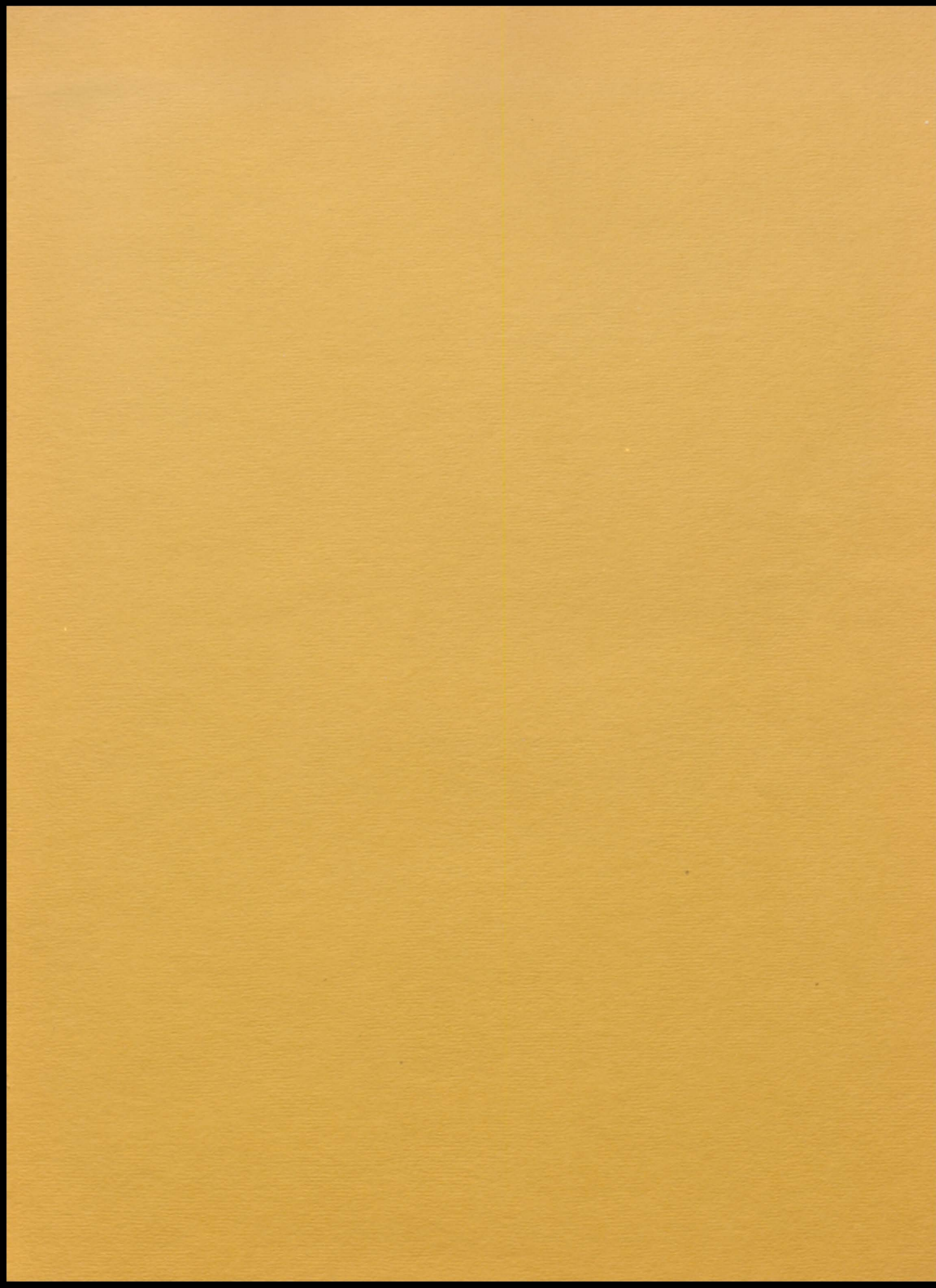

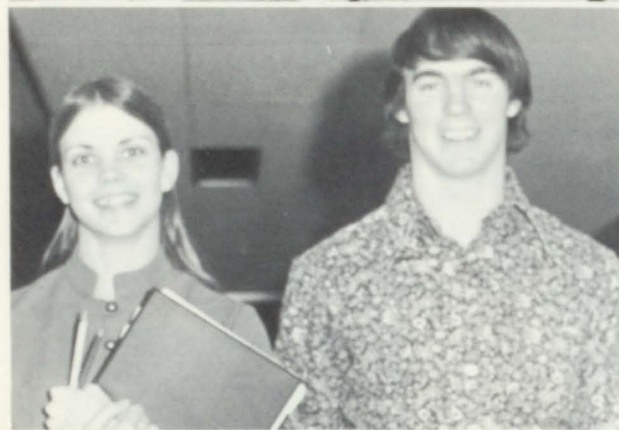
Foreward

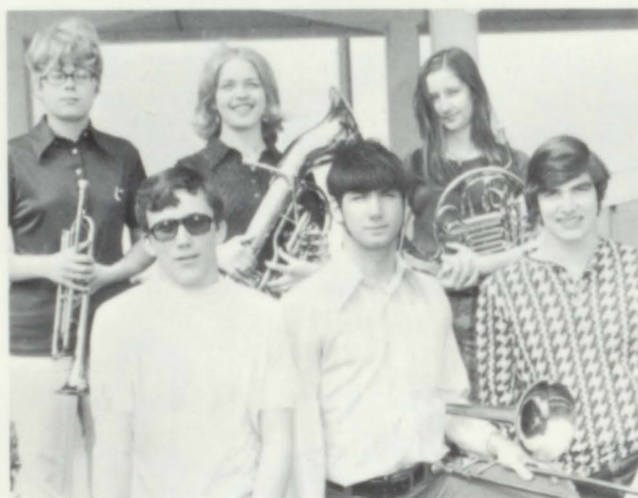

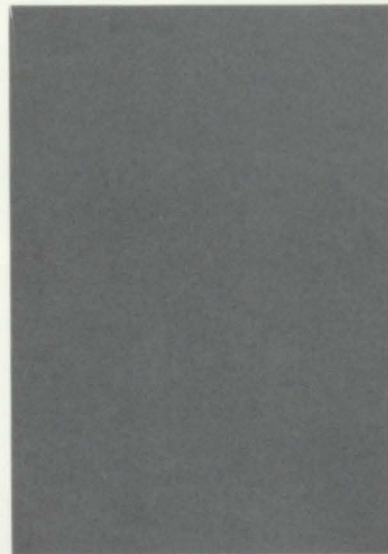

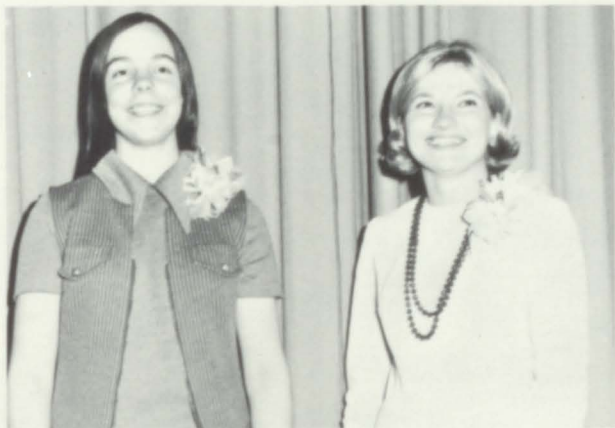




Utopia Inc.

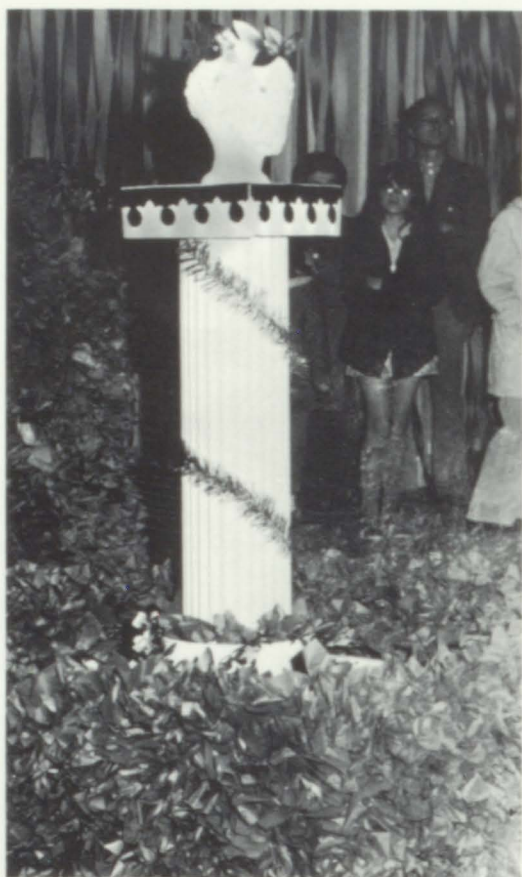


This Magic

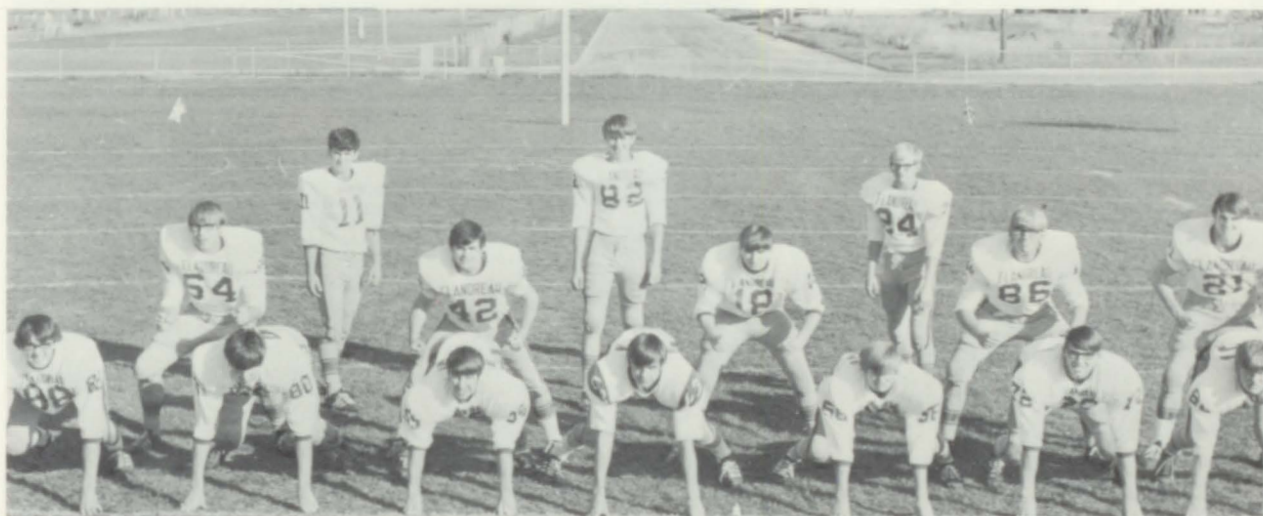
In conference action, only one team was able to score on the Flier defense. This enabled the Fliers to win the conference trophy with a 5-0 record.

The seniors led the scoring this year as follows: Bob Keck, seventy points; Devere Headrick, fifty-five; and Steve Ramsdell, forty-four.

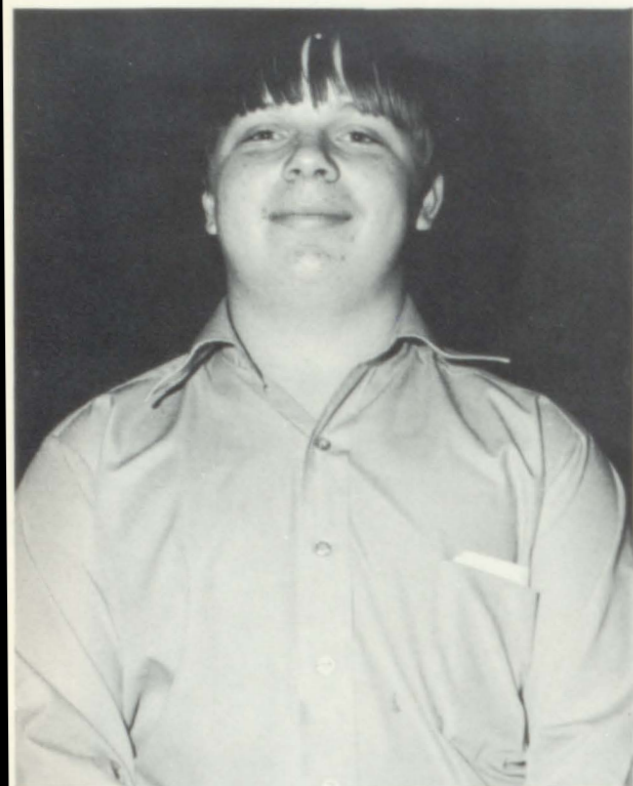

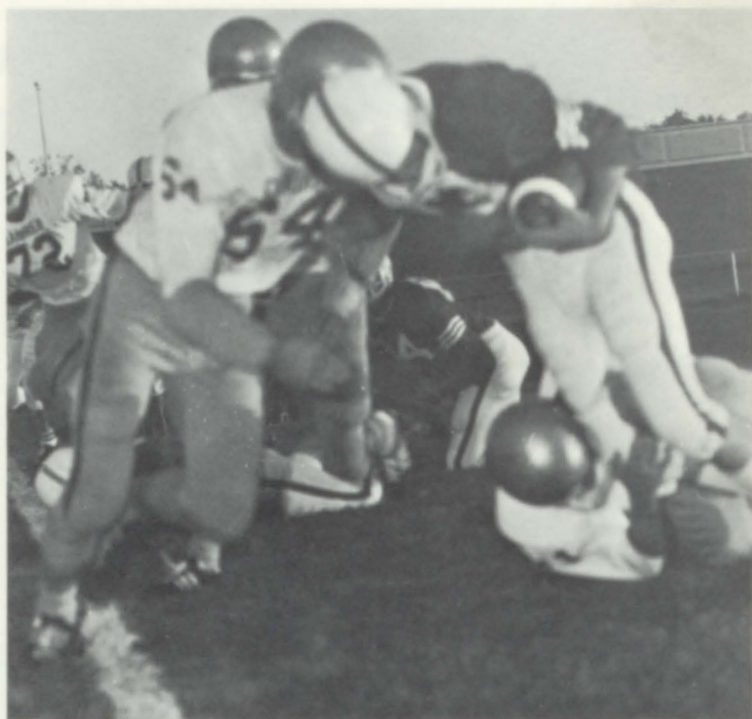

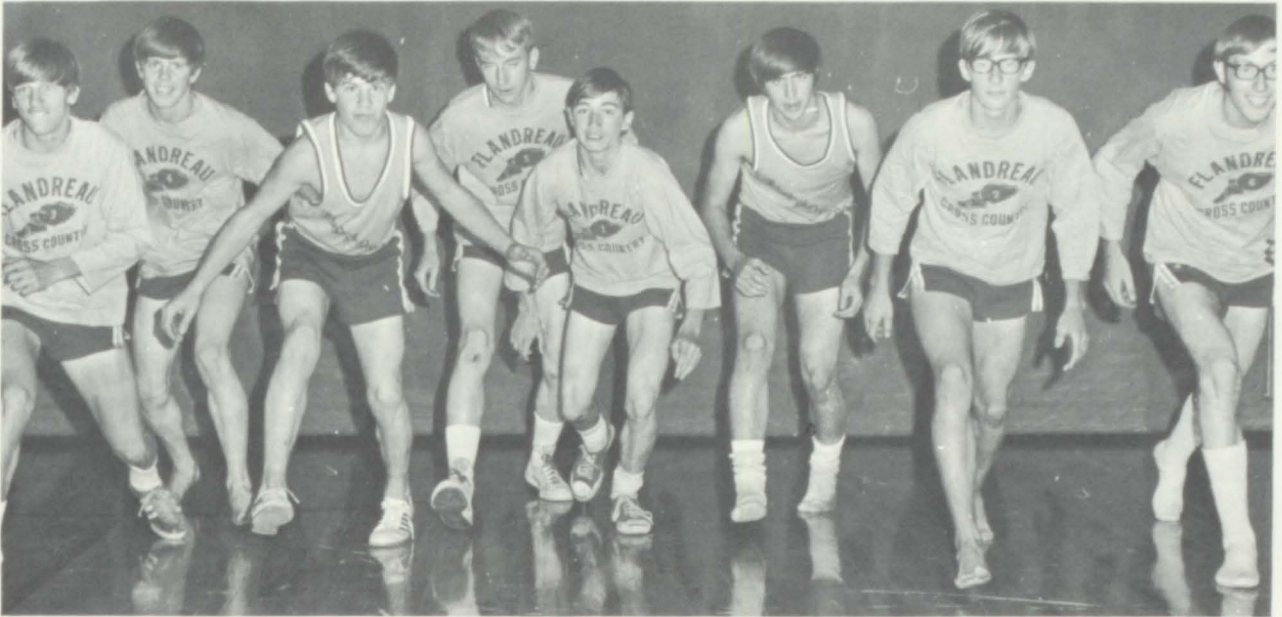
