All the joyous activities ended Friday night. The Fliers lost the game to Brandon Valley, 33-14. After the game the students danced to the music of Little Henry.

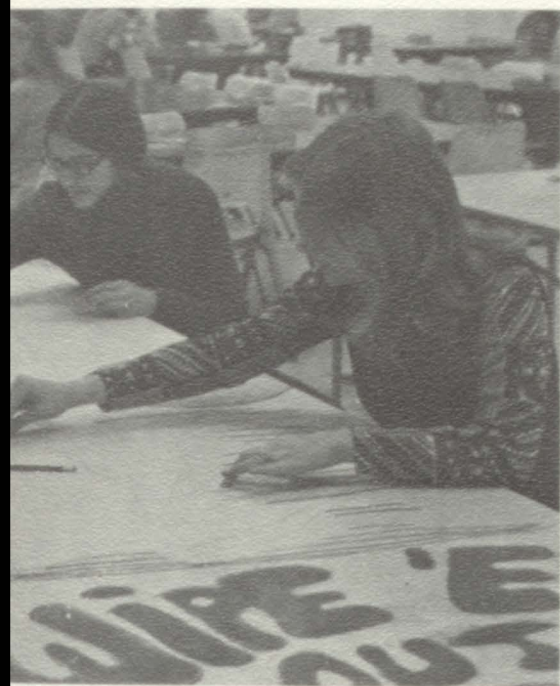

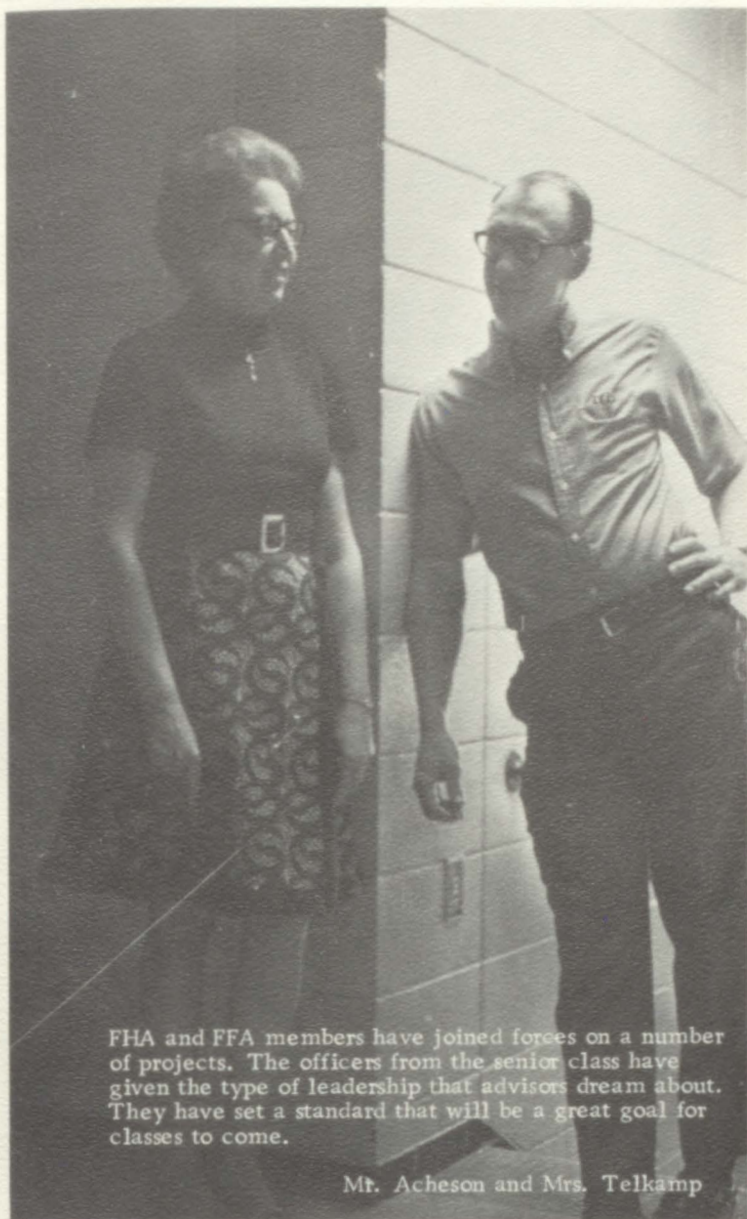

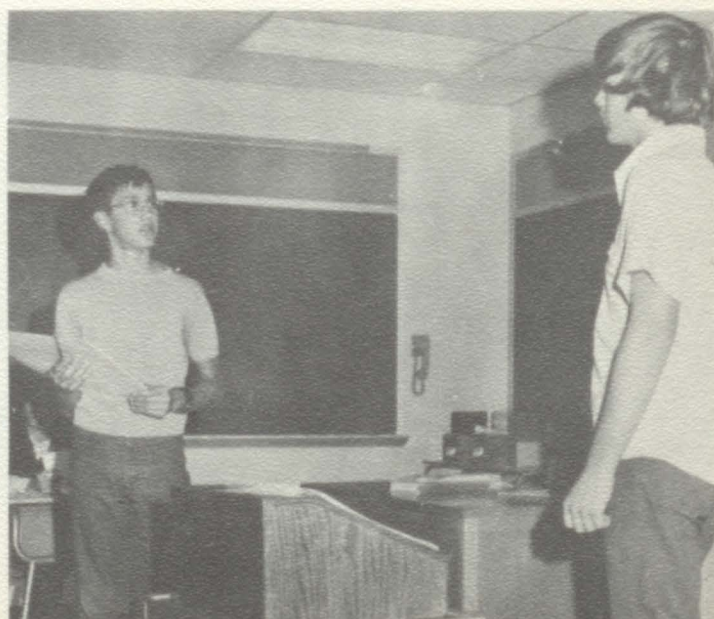
# Talking It Over

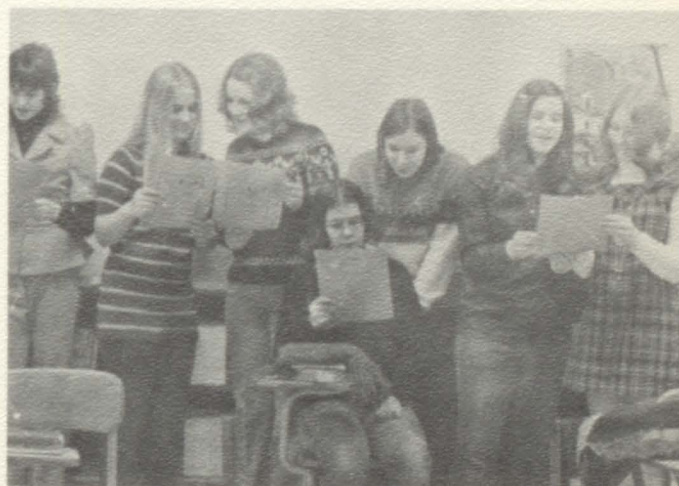
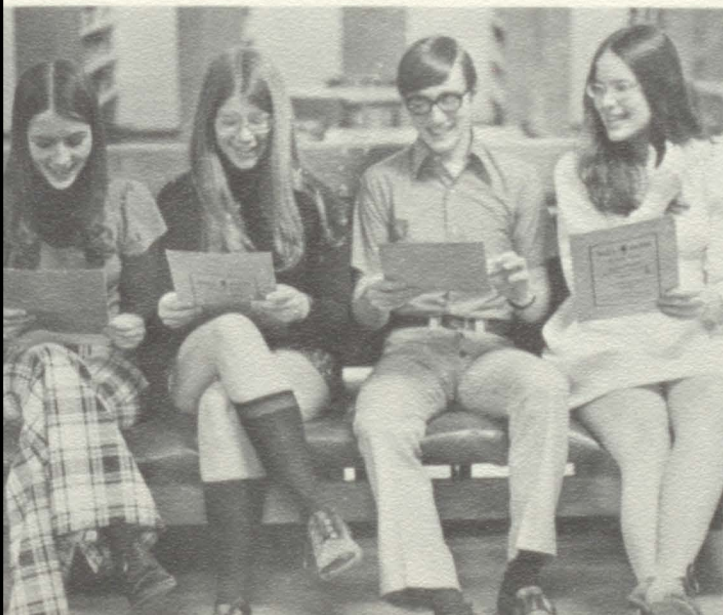


## WORDS - *Laughing, Sad Written, Spoken*

The Flier Cross-Country team, being bridesmaids for three years in a row, had another successful season capturing ten championships throughout the season.

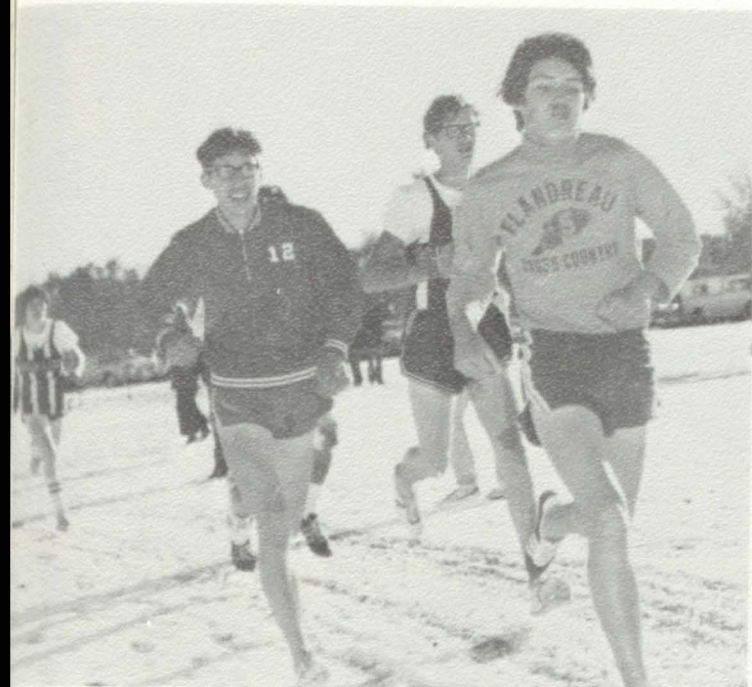

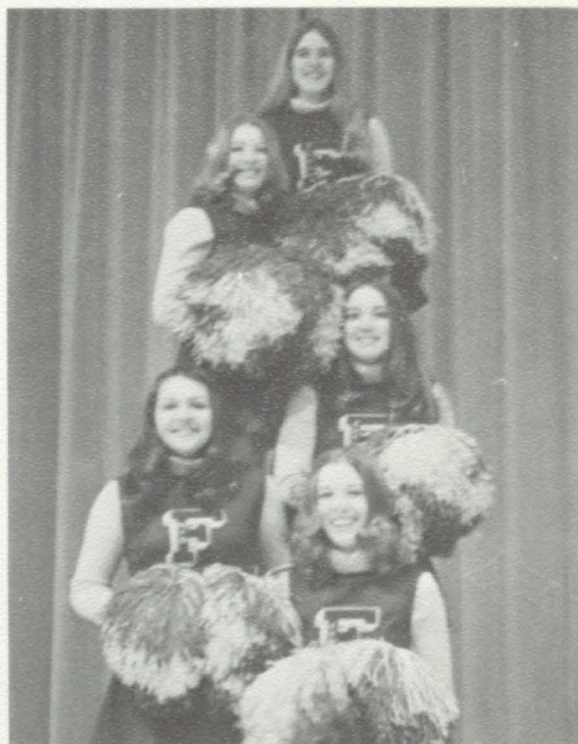

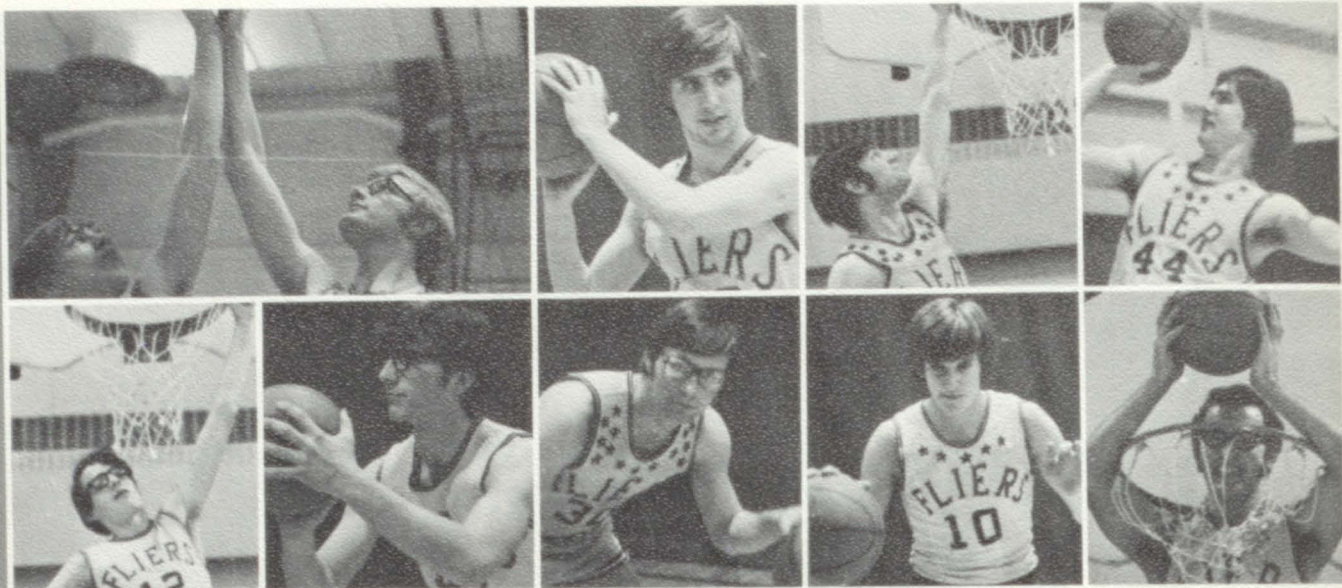
