


## Welcome to FHS











## Fliers Cope Pointers for Successful Homecoming





The week was climaxed as the Fliers downed the Elk Point Pointers, 30-0. After the game students danced to the music of Cracker at the Spafford gym.











## "In the Shadows" Wins Title As Best Play







## "SHOWBOAT" Theme of '74 Prom.














## Running Right on by

The students in these classes are taught the basic principles of math through trigonometry, log rhythms, and the difference between assets, liabilities, and capital.










