






Making It up



Mr. Dale Johnson, Pictured at the Lower Right, is the school's librarian. He is also in charge of all Audio Visual Equipment for the school system.




Mrs. Lora Johnson teaches Geometry and Physical Science. She also supervises the Sophomore class.








Argue Problems, Events






Enchanted Evening




The Prom dance was again held at the Spafford gym, which was decorated in the senior's colors of burgandy and silver.

Head football coach, Jim McGlone, was aided by assistant coaches—Dann Cecil, John Evans, and Stanley Meyers. (Pictured Right)





Fliers Capture Third in State "B" Action




The Junior Class begins raising money for the Prom by selling concessions at all home football, basketball, and wrestling events. Every member works at least once throughout the year.
