



There is more to high school then just going to school. After hours kids meet up town at Courts Corner to play pinball, foosball, and pool.



Dirty tricks like setting and wiring lockers are done. Dates are lined up for the weekend.















Soph. Show Promis







Our Fliers attended three tournaments during the regular season. These tournaments were hosted by FHS, Rock Rapids, and Elk Point.






Track is often considered a individual sport, but it still takes a team to win the Meet trophy. Our team depth allowed our girls to place second in four meets, while taking third in three.



Needed to Graduate

The business and vocational courses offered here at our school are Bookkeeping, Typing, Shorthand, Home Economics, Agriculture, Industrial Arts, and Art.








Communications, Important to Us






Math and Science Create Figures




Career Occupations


Vocations, Our Area

We have an engineer who keeps the air-conditioning/heating plant running smoothly. He, also, is responsible for taking care of two other buildings and their plants.








Band Tries Field Marching














