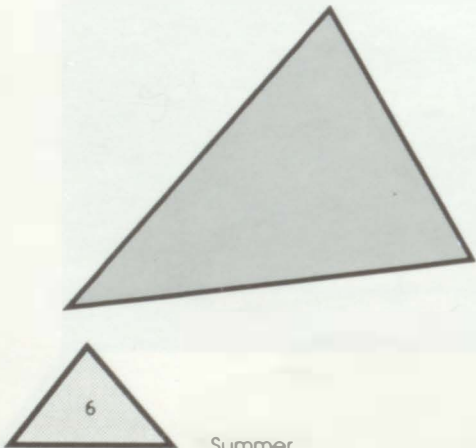
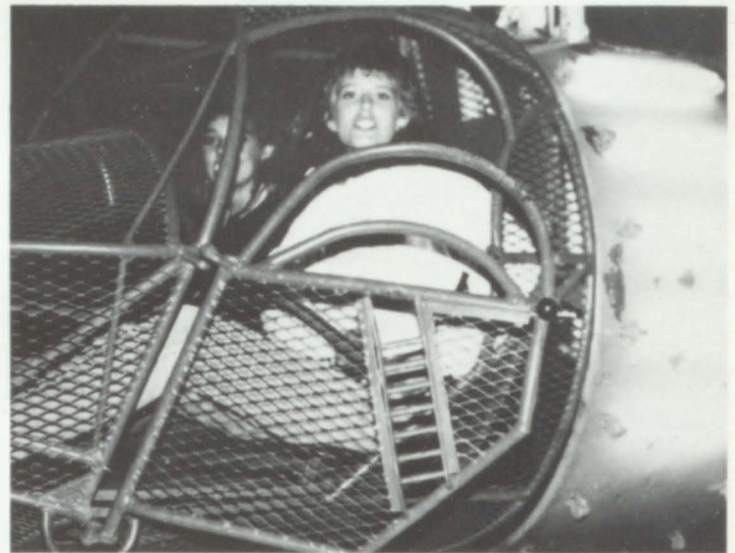
# Kickin' Back

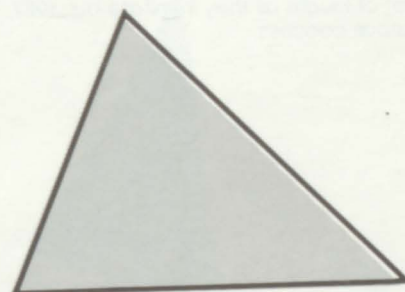

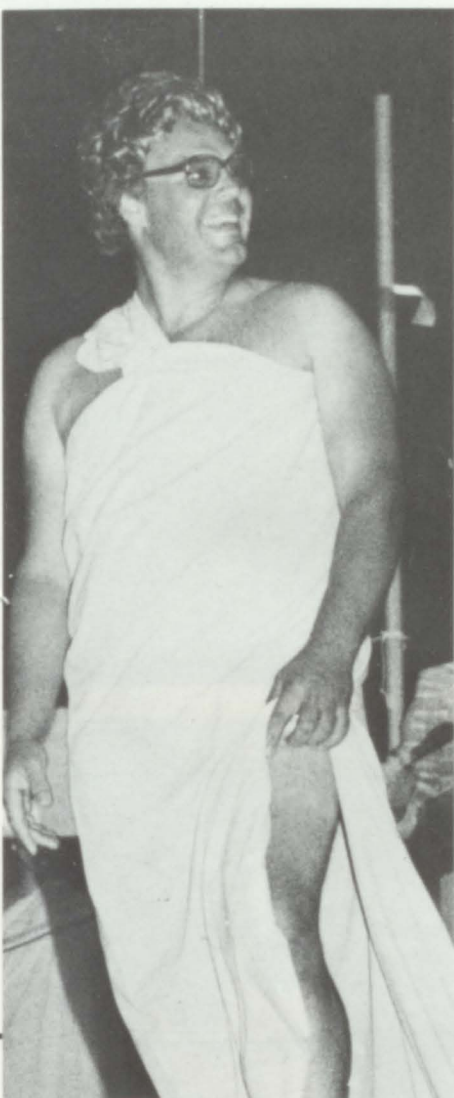

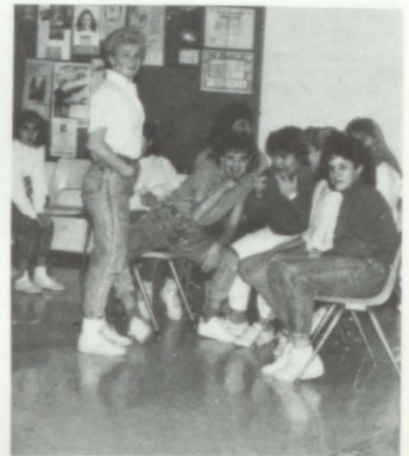

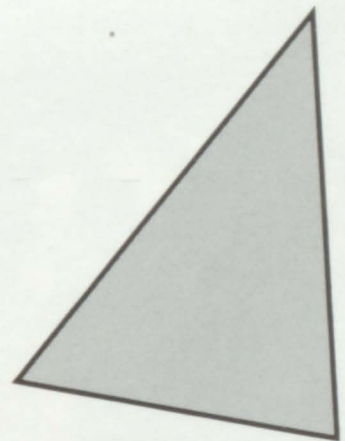

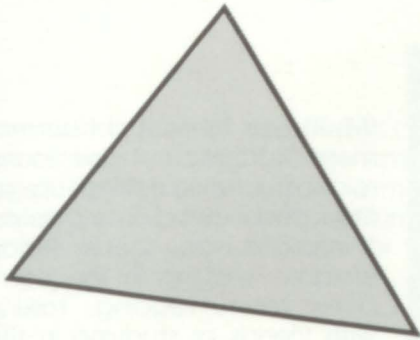

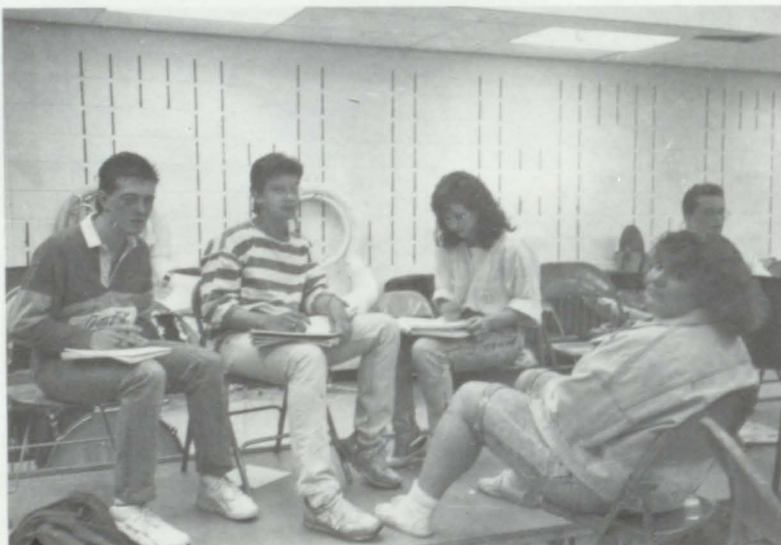

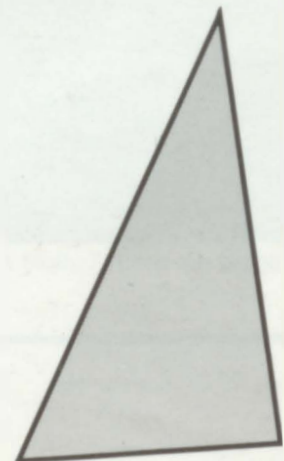

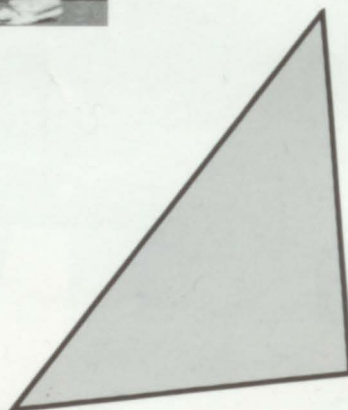

arations for marching in Trojan Days in Madison and Hobo Day at Brookings.

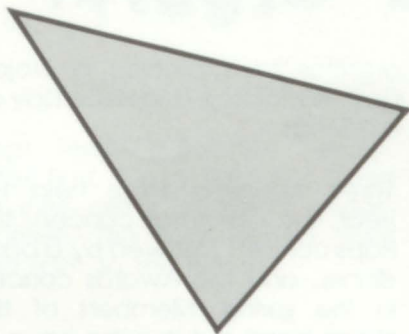

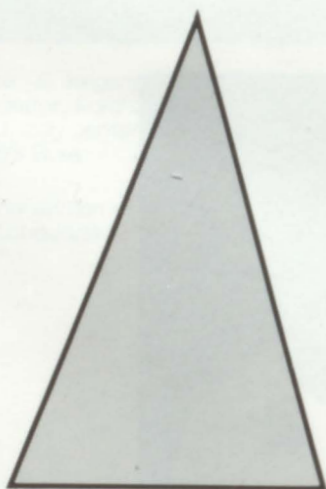
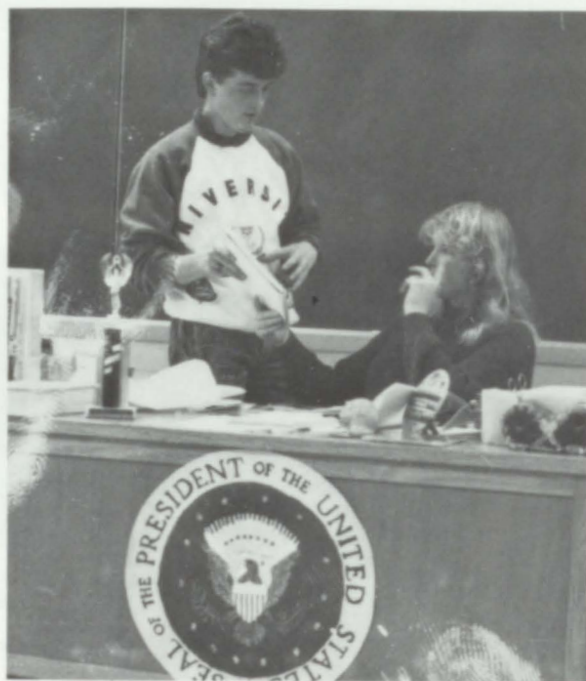
# One Act Goes To State

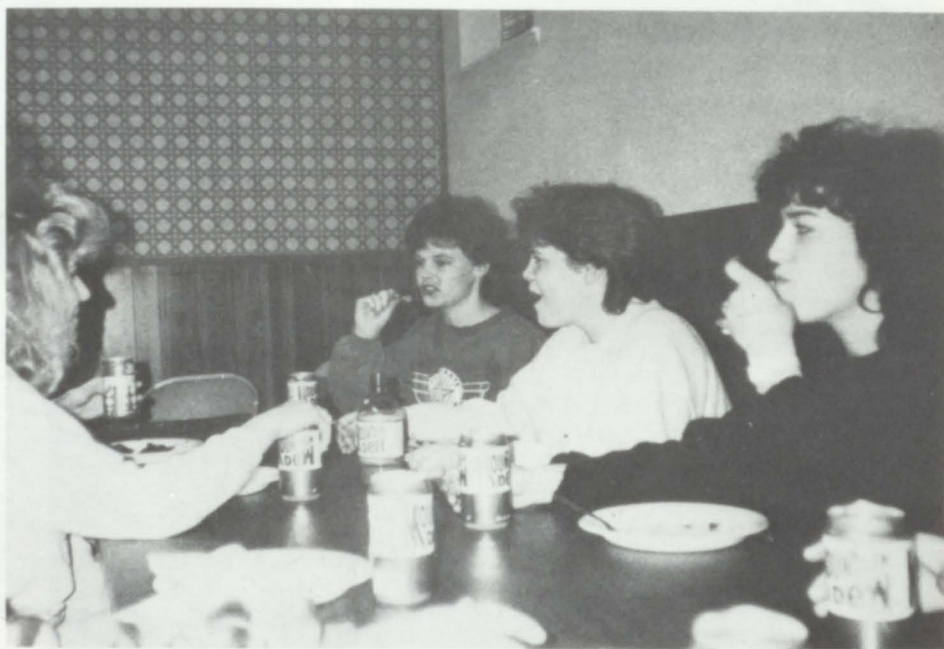
# Wednesdays Are For Church

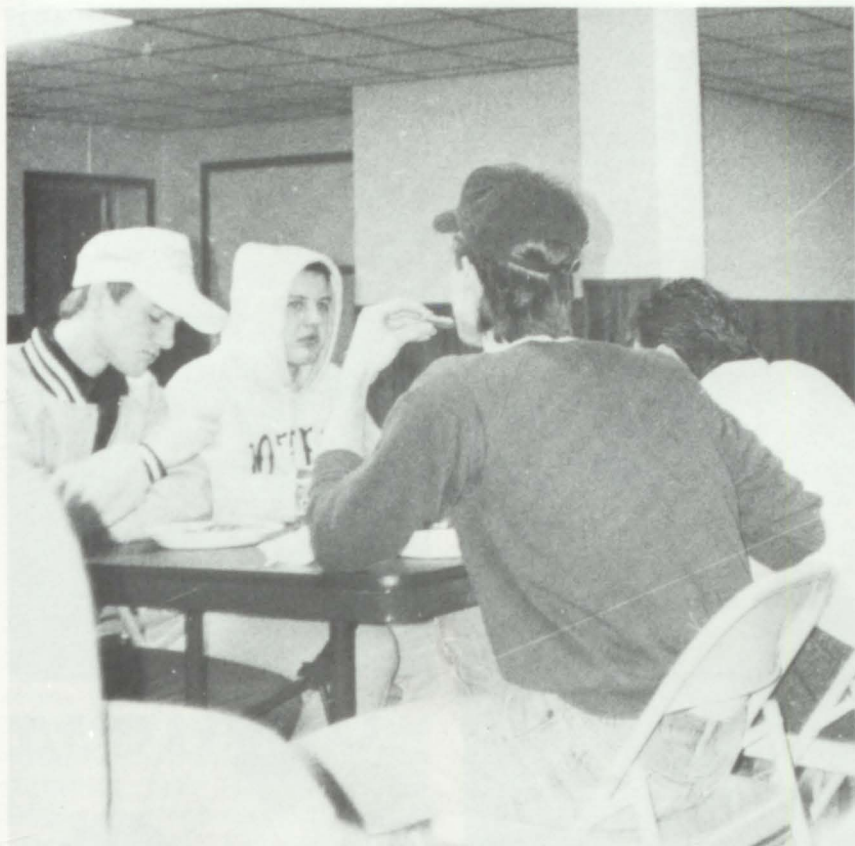

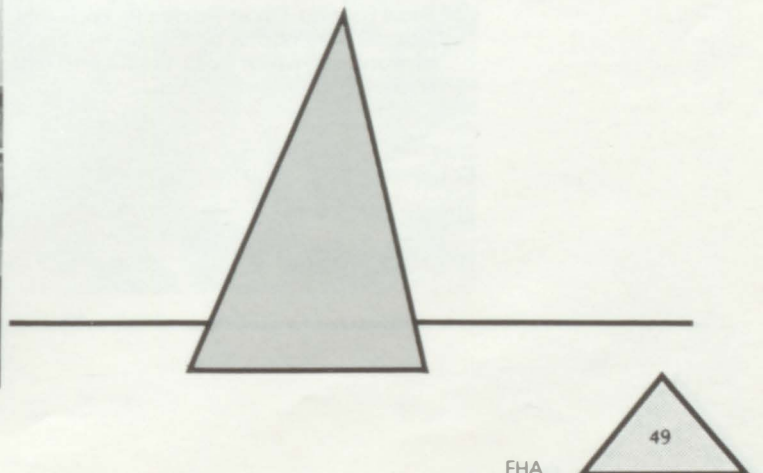

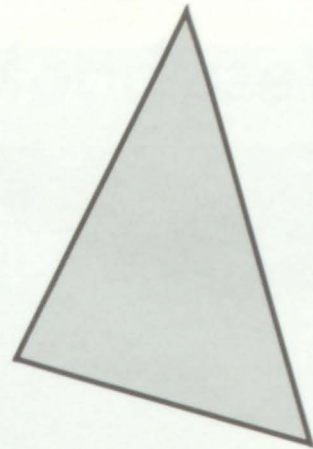

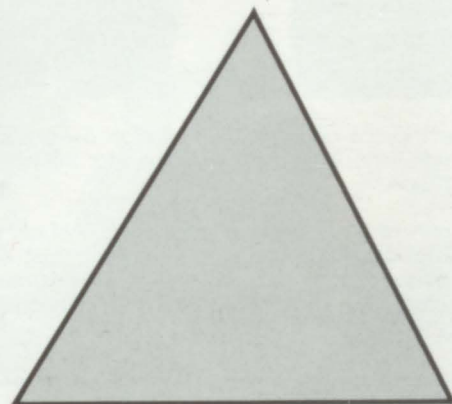

The girl's team consisted of 3 first year runners. These girls show promise for further years.

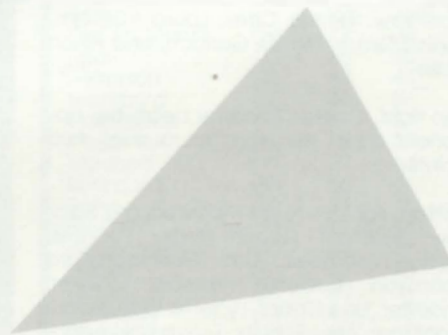

son where they lost to Tri-Valley by 2 points.

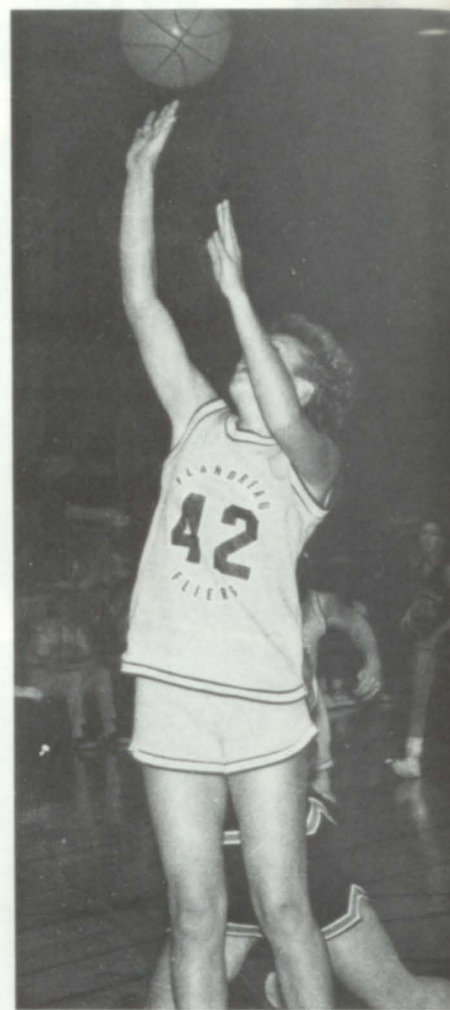

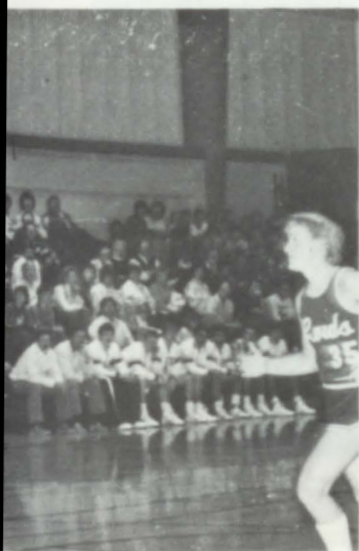

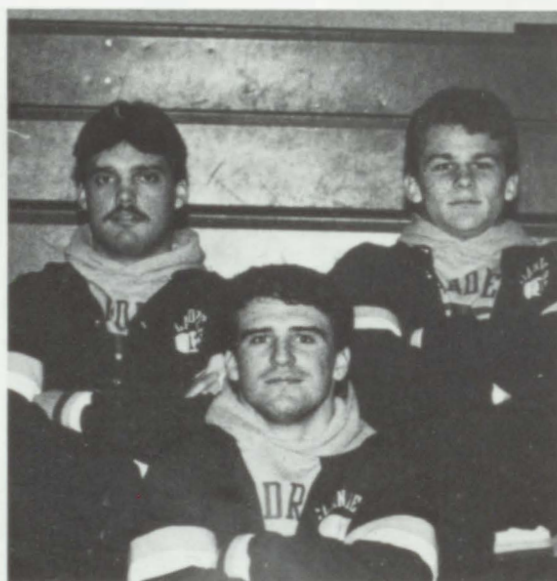

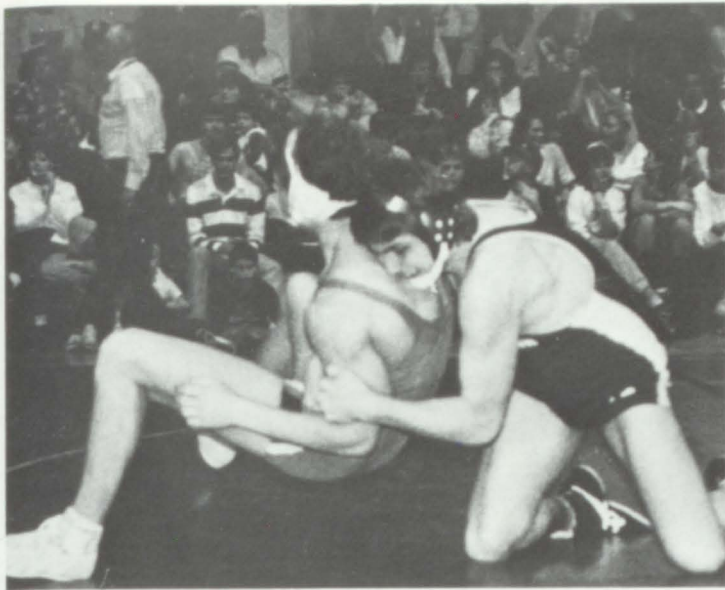

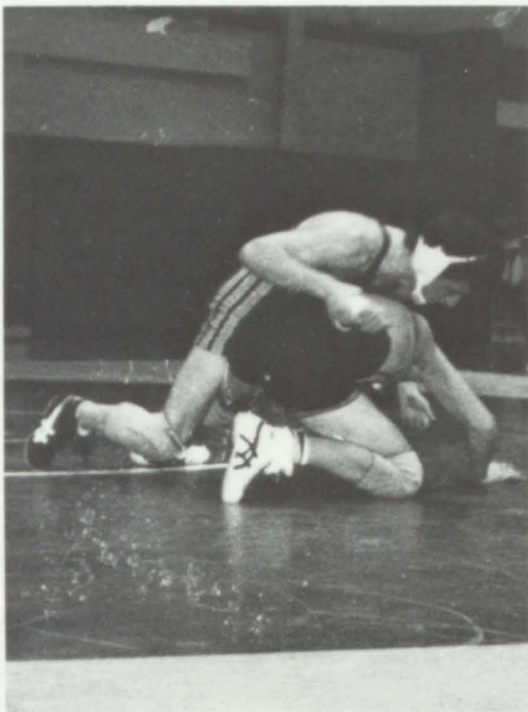

# Girls Triumph!

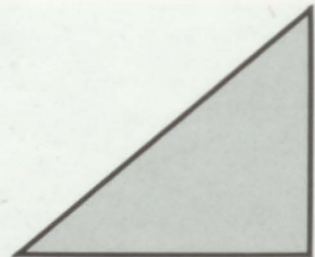

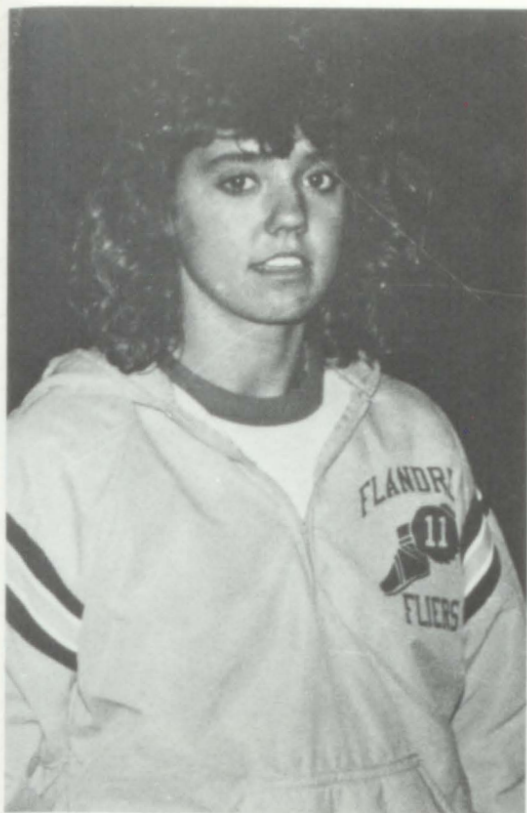

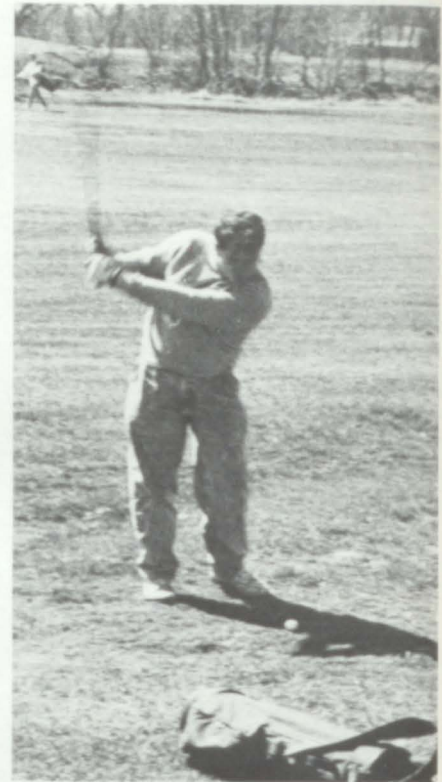
# Swinging to Success
