# Doing Fine In 89

Even though the record shows 5 wins and 4 losses, the Flier football team led in most of the statistics. They outscored their opponents 157-95. They were also on top for first downs, rushing, passing total, and per game average yards. Travis Benson led in rushing with 671 yards and Travis Peper received the most passes for 365 yards. Quarterback Kevin Zwart tossed the ball 153 times for 890 yards with 63 of his passes being caught. Zwart also grabbed six interceptions and did the punting and kickoffs for the Fliers. Kickoff returns leader was Brian Drapeau with 9 for 123 yards. The punts were mainly returned by Dave Leraas having 7 for 50.1 yards. The majority of the tackling was done by Rob Delaney, having 90 tackles. Travis Benson also led the individual scoring with 42 points.








For the first time ever, the Flandreau girls basketball team put its name in the State A program. After winning the district title by beating Sioux Valley and 5th rated DeSmet, the girls went on to take the Region 2A title from the Tri Valley Mustangs. At State, the girls lost first-round action to Pine Ridge, who later finished 1st place in the tournament. After the loss, the girls went 2-0 by beating Wessington Springs and Lead, finishing as Consolation Champs. The team was proud of the 18-7 season, the best record in school history. Leading the team with the most points was J.P. Schuchard and Karisa Voorhees scoring 342 and 325 points, respectively. The coleaders in rebounding were Teresa Groos and Schuchard with a total of 189 each. Schuchard and Voorhees were both named to the All-tournament team. All-Conference honors went to all of the starting five players, and Voorhees made the All State 3rd team selection.















Finishing with a 14-7 win-loss record, the Flier boys had their ups and downs throughout the season. The 1989-90 schedule provided the Fliers with many tough, top-ranked opponents. The team won the Big Sioux Conference tournament for the fourth straight year, by winning an exciting, overtime game against Harrisburg. For the season, Mike Jewett led in all statistics. He scored broke the school record for the 447 points, grabbed 177 rebounds, had 88 assists, and 71 school career. He finished with steals. Travis Benson was the sec-


ond leading scorer with 293 points. Kevin Zwart followed Jewett in rebounding with 130 for the season. 




























# A Night To Remember












The Final Step




