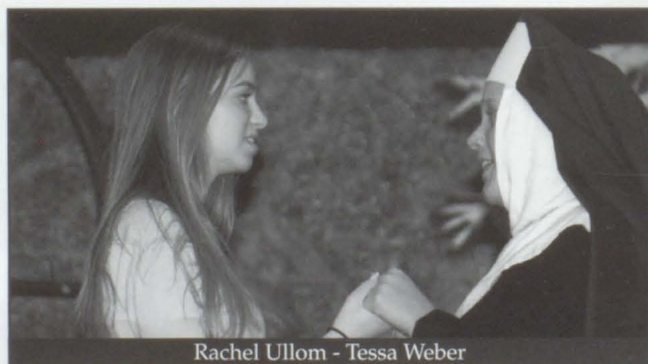
All School Play

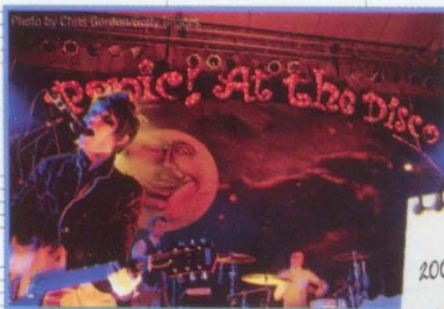

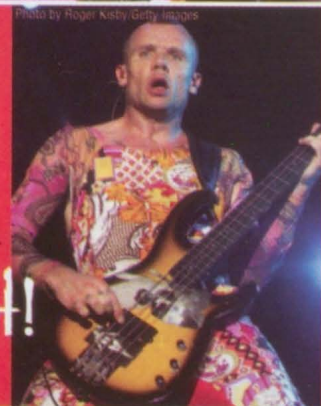

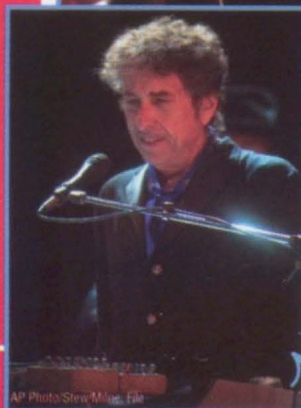

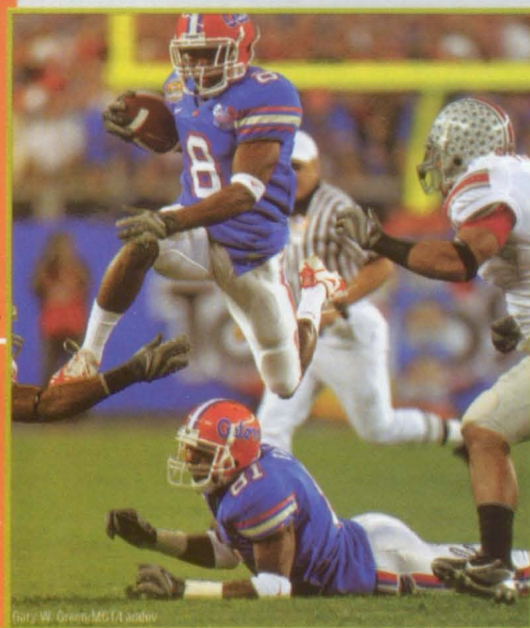

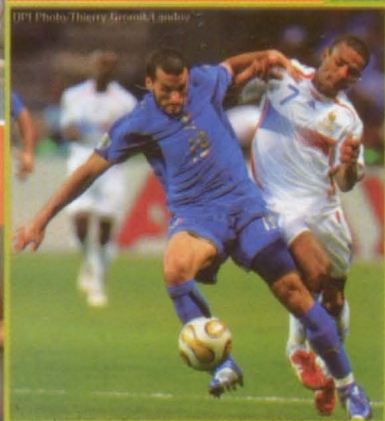
