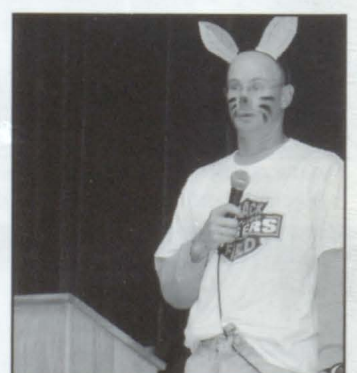
AP Government and World History ...

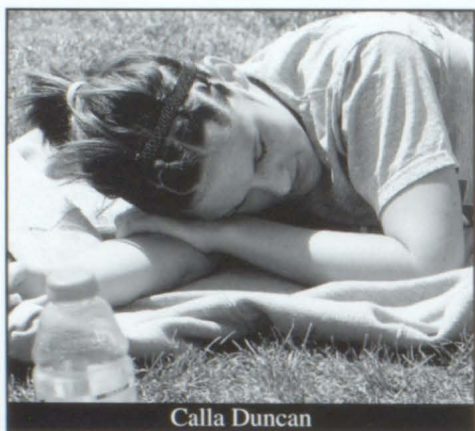


Defining Ourselves

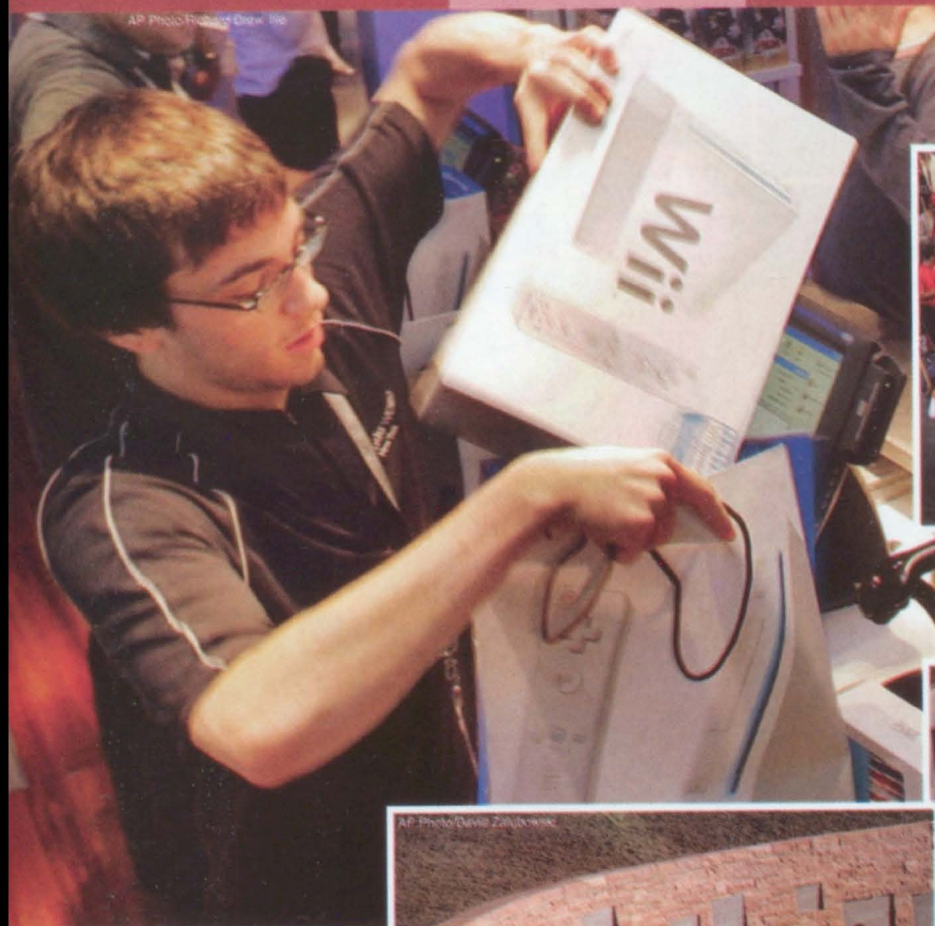

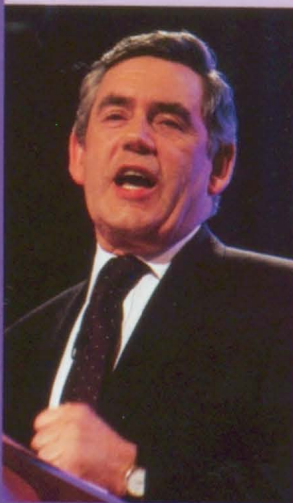

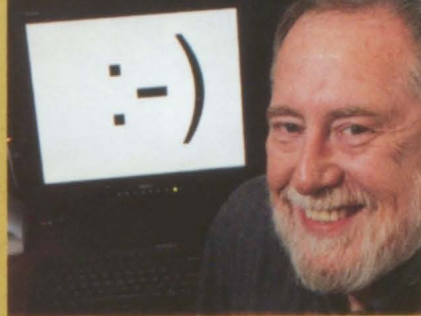

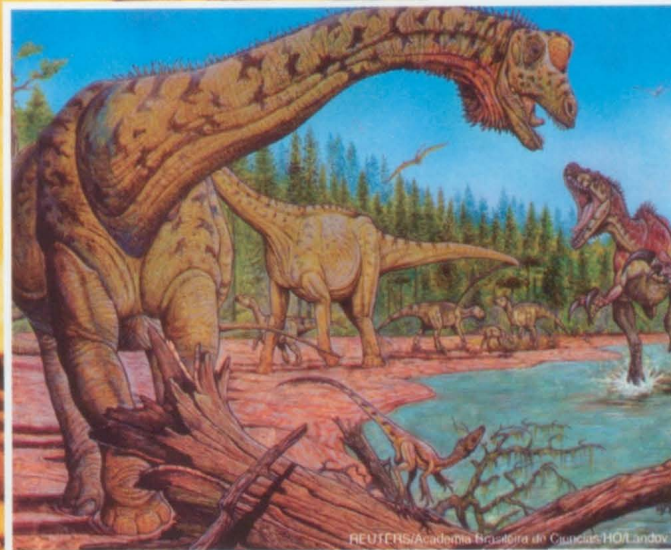

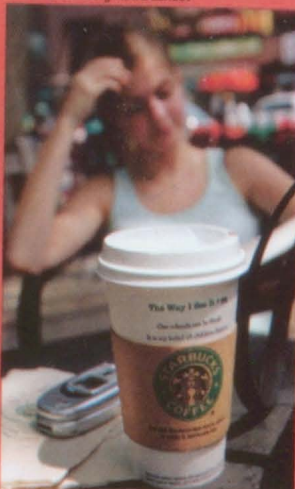

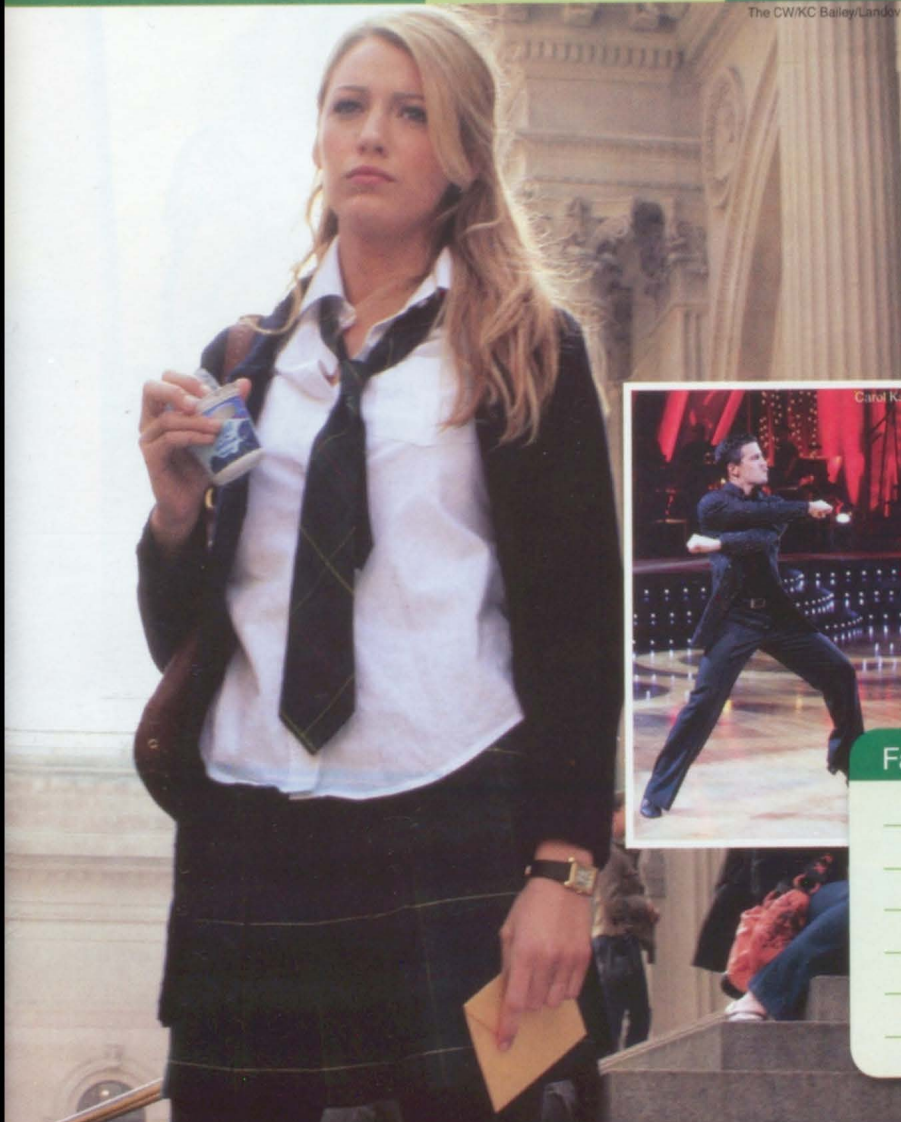

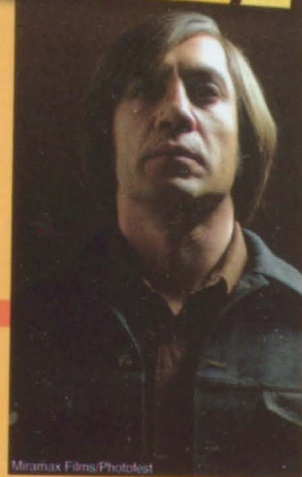

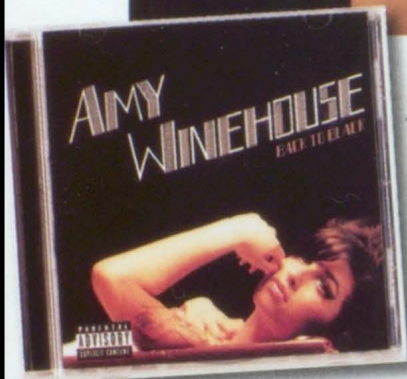

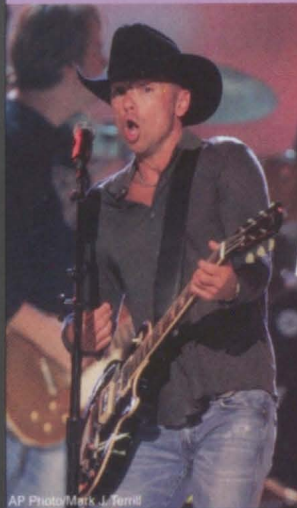

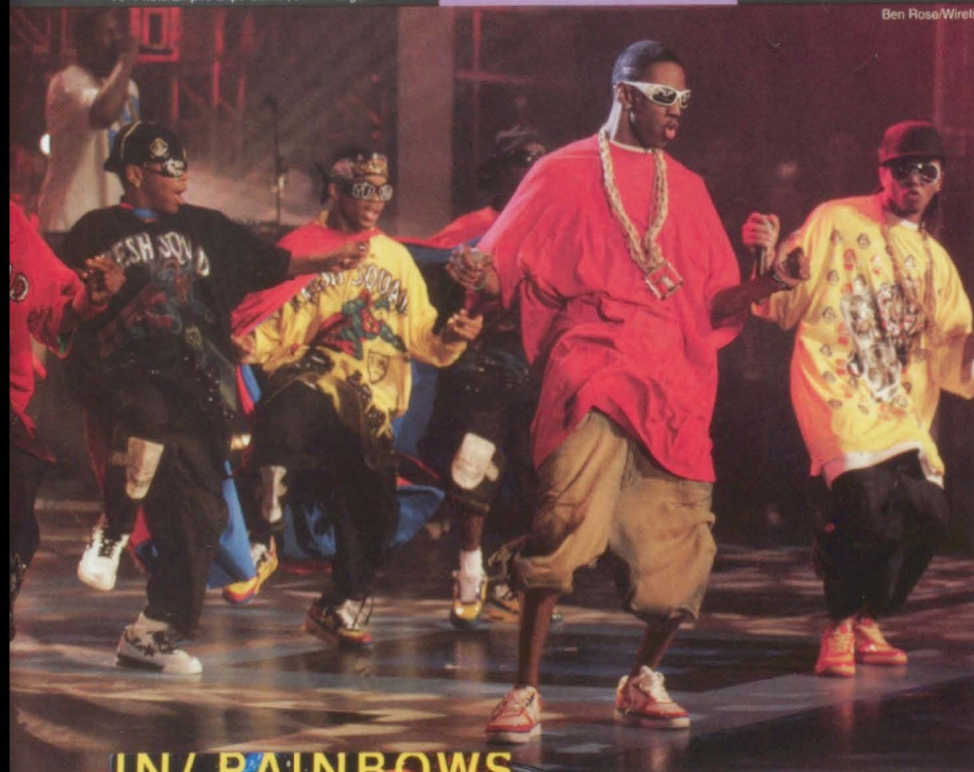

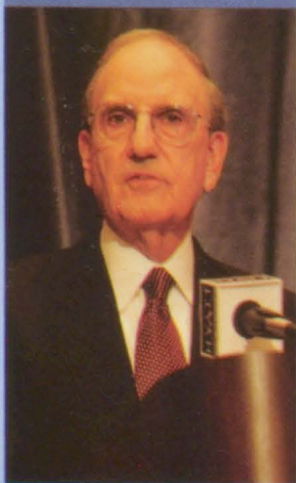

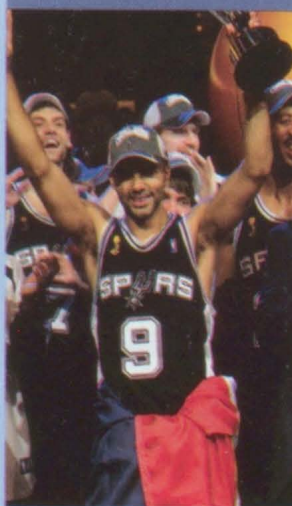

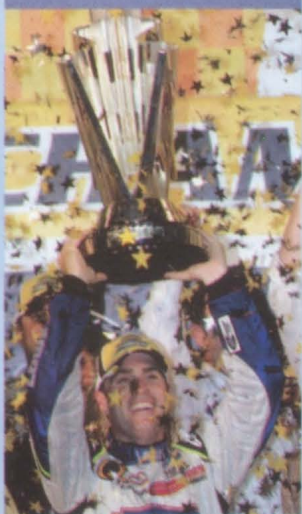

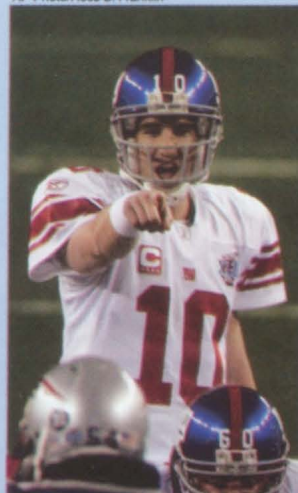
