
## **FCCLA**



#### Flandreau FFA 2009-2010

The Flandreau FFA had a very busy year in 2009-10! Starting off the year with Land/Soil Judging at the district and state level, Flandreau FFA members ranked higher this year than in the past ten. After land judging, the time comes for Leadership Career Development Events (CDEs). Flandreau had a strong showing at the SDSU Jackrabbit Leadership Event in November. This was a great warm-up for Districts that occurred the following week. Fourteen students advanced to state competition in Pierre after competing in the district competition! At the state event, all members were successful at building their leadership skills. Some individuals and teams even brought home awards!

The chapter sent out a holiday card sharing their successes with the public and helping to build public relations. In January, students were working on Supervised Agriculture Experience applications. Besides attending monthly chapter meetings, members were also busy serving concessions at basketball games and wrestling matches throughout the winter months. When February rolled around, it was time to start preparing for the spring production CDEs. Flandreau again hosted a regional CDE which brought in 968 FFA members from 40 schools; our largest event yet!

Members also competed in three practice contests before attending the State Convention in Brookings. Some members were quite successful placing as high as second in the district and receiving several silver and bronze awards at state.

The year was wrapped up at our end of the year awards banquet. Famous Dave's BarBQ catered the event that boasted the largest crowd in several years; over 110 FFA members and guests. At the banquet, the FFA presented three recognition banners that are now hung in the high school gym. The banners salute those members who have achieved the top honors in FFA such as American Degree, Star State Degree and State Officers.
