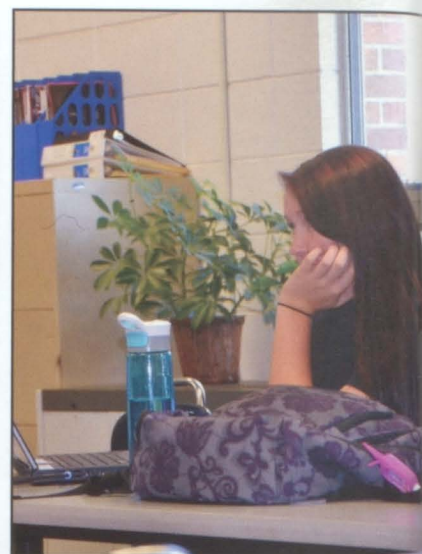
Welcome Freshman!

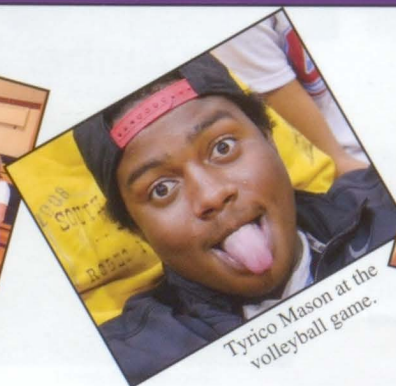
In September, the week-long celebration of Homecoming came. Throughout the week, tacky

Runners Up! Martin came back and said I got next, but as for 2013, they are the best, That's the story of

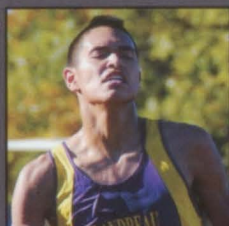
