Important Safety Reminder on Motorized, Electric, and Toy Vehicles


As we continue to prioritize the safety of our community, I want to remind you of the Village of Norridge's ordinances regarding motor-driven, electric, and toy vehicles. These rules help ensure the safety of our children and residents.

Motorized & Electric Cycles (Sec. 94-155)


 **Prohibited Areas** – Motor scooters, electric scooters, motorized skateboards, and similar vehicles with less than 150cc displacement **cannot** be operated on public or private streets, sidewalks, parking lots, bike paths, or parks.

 **Enforcement & Impoundment** – If someone is cited for violating this ordinance, their vehicle may be impounded for a minimum of 24 hours, with fees required for retrieval.

 **Legal Process** – If charges are dismissed or the individual is acquitted, the impound fee will be refunded.

 **Exemptions** – This ordinance does not apply to emergency and government vehicles performing official duties or motorized wheelchairs.

Toy Vehicles (Sec. 94-145)

 **Prohibited on Roadways** – It is unlawful for anyone using skates, coasters, sleds, or other toy vehicles to be on any roadway except at a crosswalk.

Important Note on Enforcement

To ensure voluntary compliance, the Norridge Police Department will begin with **warnings** when appropriate. However, **repeat violators will be issued citations**, and vehicles may be subject to impoundment. Safety is our priority, and these steps are necessary to prevent injuries and keep our streets safe for everyone.

We ask all parents to speak with their children about these safety rules and help reinforce them at home. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated, and it plays a critical role in keeping Norridge a safe and welcoming community for all.
