Introduction

SummerYou provides a full summer of camp opportunities for Age 3 - Grade 12. Our camps are designed to foster academic growth, stimulate imagination, pique curiosity, and encourage creativity. SummerYou is open to campers of all faiths and schools.

Frequently Asked Questions:

- ★ How do I know if my child should be in an Age 3 or Age 4-5 camp?
 - The Age 3 camps are designed for campers who will be 3 years old by September 1, 2025.
 - The Age 4-5 camps are designed for campers who will be 4 or 5 years old by September 1, 2025, and **not enrolled in kindergarten.**
- ★ Does my child have to be potty trained to attend camp?
 - Yes, campers must be completely potty trained to attend camp. This means:
 - They no longer wear training pants/pull-ups while awake or asleep (except a medical condition documented by a physician).
 - They can use the toilet for urination and bowel movements.
 - They can wipe themselves after using the toilet.
 - They can tell the teacher they need to use the restroom beforehand or with encouragement and reminders.
 - Campers who are not fully potty trained may be required to leave camp without a refund.

- ★ Are the camp grades the grade my child just completed or the grade my child will enter in fall of 2025?
 - Camp grade levels are the grade your child will enter in the fall.
- ★ What are the available camp times?
 - Ages 3-5 have day and specialty camps that are at the following times:
 - Morning Camps – 9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m.
 - Day Camp – 9:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. (Age 3 will have a midday quiet/nap time at day camp)
 - Kindergarten - Grade 12 have morning and afternoon camps that are at the following times (unless otherwise noted):
 - Morning Camps: 9:00 a.m.- 12:00 p.m.
 - Afternoon Camps: 12:30 - 3:30 p.m.
 - Note: we offer a two-week summer musical camp for Grade 3-6.
- ★ Do you offer morning and/or afternoon care?
 - Yes, we offer morning care from 7:30 - 9:00 a.m. for campers Age 3 - Grade 6 for \$25 extra per week (\$20 for June 16-20 and June 30-July 3). Cost is not prorated on days used. Campers are fed a light breakfast which includes their choice of cereal, fruit, milk and juice.
 - Yes, we offer aftercare from 3:30-6:00 p.m. for campers Age 3 - Grade 6 for \$75 extra per week (\$60 for June 16-20 and June 30-July 3). Cost is not prorated on days used. Campers are provided with a light snack at the beginning of aftercare and then they will engage in a variety of activities such as outdoor recess, games and free play centers.
- ★ What happens if I'm late picking my child up from camp or aftercare?
 - Campers must be picked up at respective camp dismissal times. Morning campers who are not picked up by 12:05 p.m. will be supervised near the registration table until they are picked up. Afternoon campers who are not picked up by 3:35 p.m. will automatically be enrolled in aftercare, and parents will be charged the full \$75 weekly aftercare fee. Parents who do not pick up their children by 6:00 p.m. from aftercare will be charged \$1 every minute late. All late fees will be charged to the card on file.
- ★ Who can pick my child up from camp, and what procedures do you have in place to monitor authorized pickups?
 - Any parent, family member, or friend listed on the child's profile has authorization to pick up the camper. This can be added during online registration and can be modified on your SummerYou online account throughout the summer. Authorized individuals picking your child up should be prepared to show a government issued picture ID (i.e., driver's license, passport, US military ID card, state id card).
- ★ How many campers are in a class?

- A minimum of four campers is required for a camp to be held *unless otherwise indicated*.
- Full-day and morning camps for Ages 3-5 have a maximum of 12 registrants.
- Most half-day specialty camps have a maximum of 16 registrants *unless noted otherwise*.
- ★ Do you require a deposit for registration?
 - Yes, a one-time, non-refundable deposit of \$25 will be collected at the time of registration for each camper.
- ★ Do you issue refunds?
 - Camp cancellation or refund requests must be emailed to [SummerYou](#). If a camp is canceled by SummerYou, you will receive a refund for the camp fee, minus the non-refundable deposit. Cancellations on the part of the camper made prior to 14 days of the camp's start date will receive a refund for the price of the camp less a \$50 cancellation fee per camp canceled. Please note, that the credit resulting from these cancellations will not be carried forward to next summer and non-transferable to another camper. The amount will be credited back to the credit card on file. Refunds will not be issued for cancellations made within two weeks of a camp's start date or after a camp has begun.
 - Fees for morning and aftercare are nonrefundable, and class fees are not prorated on the number of days attending.
 - The Saints L.I.V.E. cancellations must be in writing and received by the Business Office by 3:00 p.m. on Friday, May 30, 2025. A refund of \$700 will be given at that time. No refunds will be issued if a student withdraws after 3:00 p.m. on May 30, 2025.
- ★ Do you offer scholarships, discounts, or financial aid?
 - We do not offer scholarships, discounts, or financial aid for SummerYou as our priority is to offer an enriching and quality program.
- ★ Do you offer payment plans?
 - If your family needs additional time to pay camp fees, it is possible to work with you to establish a payment plan. Please email [SummerYou](#) at the time of registration to set up a plan that meets your family's needs. Please note, full payment is due by June 1, 2025. Payment plans must be established prior to April 1, 2025.
- ★ Where are camps located?
 - Camps are located at All Saints' Episcopal School, 9700 Saints Circle, Fort Worth, TX, 76108 (unless otherwise noted). [This map](#) can help you navigate our campus and our Life Safety Team at the Guard House can direct you to the appropriate place once you arrive on campus.
- ★ Do you have a code of conduct for campers?
 - Yes, campers are expected to be kind, considerate, and respectful of both their peers and teachers. Disruptive behavior will be handled first by the teacher and

then by the Associate Director of Extracurricular Programs if needed. Continued disruptive behavior may cause a camper to be permanently removed from the camp without a refund.

- ★ If my child stays for an all-day camp or a morning and afternoon camp, do you provide lunch?
 - No. If your child will be attending a morning and afternoon camp or the all-day camp, please be sure bring lunch. Campers will have a 30-minute supervised lunch. **All Saints' Episcopal School is a nut-free campus. Please avoid sending your child to camp with a lunch or snack that contains any type of tree nuts or peanuts.**
- ★ When does your registration open?
 - Registration is open online from February 5, 2025 at 6:00 p.m. - Thursday at 5:00 p.m. before each camp week. After Thursday at 5:00 p.m., registration for the following camp week will close. This allows teachers time to properly prepare for their camp.
- ★ Is there a place to list food allergies and dietary restrictions when registering?
 - Yes. When completing the registration online, please be extremely specific when it comes to food allergies, dietary restrictions, and medical conditions, especially if signing up for a camp which involves cooking. The health and safety of our campers is our utmost concern.
- ★ What is your policy regarding documentation for severe allergies and medical conditions?
 - If your child may need medical attention at camp, you must submit a medical action plan signed by a physician prior to starting camp. Examples of conditions include, but are not limited to, allergies that could cause anaphylactic reactions, diabetes, seizures, cardiac conditions, asthma, and any other condition that may require medical management at camp. All campers requiring an EpiPen must turn in a medical action plan. - ★ What special precautions do you take to protect campers?
 - All Saints' Episcopal School is a gated campus staffed by our Life Safety Officers. Visitors must receive a special pass to enter campus. We also have a uniformed Fort Worth Police Officer on campus during SummerYou hours.
 - Temperature, heat index, and ozone levels are monitored daily. Adjustments to outside activities are made according to All Saints' Episcopal School's heat policy. In addition, we have a licensed nurse onsite from 8:30 a.m.- 4:00 p.m.
- ★ Will I receive confirmation of my child's registration(s)?
 - Yes, a confirmation email will be sent once registration is completed and payment is submitted. Any cancellations on the part of SummerYou will also be notified by email.
- ★ How will I know what my child should bring to camp and where to drop off and pick up?

- You will receive an email by 12:00 p.m. on the Friday before camp begins with drop-off, pick-up, and other camp specific information. If you are registered for multiple weeks, please be sure to read weekly email as some information changes from week to week.

We'll evaluate why authors choose to use ancient stories to address current issues, how historically accurate their new perspectives are, and why the distant past remains so relevant to readers today. As a final project, students will create a proposal for a book based on ancient Greece or Rome. <i>*This class is open to all Upper School students. It provides one of the three elective credits required for students completing the Honors Classics Diploma.</i>
Ethics	\$995	Grade 12	What does it mean to live a moral life? How might we create a more just and equitable society? Our study of ethics consists of two parts, both designed to help students think critically and academically about how one lives a moral life and advocates for justice. In the first part of the course, students will learn about major moral theories and judge their merits as they apply to issues in the modern world. In the second part of the course, students will examine the history of inequality and its modern impact and ask how we might be advocates for justice today. The entire course is both philosophical and practical, requiring academic engagement and its application in the world the student encounter. Ethics is designed to advance critical reading, logical argumentation, and intellectual empathy; skills that are crucial for success in college and the workplace.
