

Reading: Fiction, Drama, & Poetry

- Key Ideas & Details: Use textual evidence to support analysis, inferences, themes, and summaries, and to determine relationships, propel action, or reveal character.
- Craft & Structure: Analyze diction, structure, and differences in point of view in one or more texts.
- Integration of Knowledge & Ideas: Analyze the extent to which a modern fiction or multimedia version stays faithful to a text; compare and contrasts texts.
- Range of Reading & Level of Text Complexity: Read and comprehend novels, stories, drama, and poems.

Reading: Informational Text

- Key Ideas & Details: Analyze textual evidence in non-fiction texts to support analysis, inferences, central ideas, relationships, and summaries.
- Craft & Structure: Examine sections of a text to determine the contributions of diction, structure, and purpose.
- Integration of Knowledge & Ideas: Evaluate the reasoning in and the presentation of a text.
- Range of Reading & Level of Text Complexity: Read and comprehend nonfiction.

Writing

- Argument: Write arguments to support claims with clear reasons and relevant evidence.
- Informative/Explanatory: Write informative/explanatory texts to examine a topic and convey ideas, concepts, and information.
- Narrative: Write narratives to develop real or imagined experiences or events.
- Production and Distribution of Writing: Develop, strengthen, produce, and publish coherent, purposeful writing.
- Research to Build & Present Knowledge: Conduct short research projects that allow for multiple avenues of exploration.
- Range of Writing: Write routinely over extended and shorter time frames.

Speaking & Listening

- Collaboration: Engage in collaborative discussions, building on others' ideas and expressing their own clearly.
- Comprehension: Analyze the purpose of information presented in diverse formats.
- Presentation of Knowledge & Ideas: Present claims and findings in a coherent, appropriate manner, using multimedia components.

Language

- Conventions of Standard English: Demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English.
- Knowledge of Language: Use verbs in the active and passive voice and in the conditional and subjunctive moods.
- Vocabulary Acquisition & Use: Accurately use and interpret words and phrases; gather vocabulary knowledge for words or phrases important to comprehension.
