DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCESS



Area: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Introduction: The "Notice of Procedural Safeguards" provides parents of children with disabilities, surrogate parents, and adult students a full explanation of their educational rights. The IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act) is a federal, special education law that requires school districts to provide a free appropriate public education (FAPE) to eligible children with disabilities.

Mediation services are available, at no cost to the family or the school district, to help resolve problems involving the identification, evaluation, educational placement, and provision of FAPE to eligible students. Mediation is available whenever a due process hearing is requested. Mediation services are provided through the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI), who currently uses Sound Options Mediation and Training Group, LLC.

The school district or the parent may initiate a due process hearing regarding any action the district proposes or refuses related to the identification, evaluation, or educational placement of a student with disabilities, or the provision of special education and related services. OSPI is responsible for conducting due process hearings.
