CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Ann Segan at 7:04pm

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion to approve the minutes from January 18, 2018 was made by Michelle Wahlmark and seconded by Jennifer Jones. The motion passed unanimously.

PRESENTATION: "College and Career" was the topic of Mr. Eric Roberts' presentation. Mr. Roberts, a PHS Counselor, spoke about what the PHS has to offer regarding career services, what college admissions committees are looking for and he asked the student representatives to speak about their PHS experiences.

Mr. Roberts brought handouts on the following: SAT vs ACT comparison, NCAA eligibility center quick reference guide, a common college application, Pitt admissions review process, sample PHS transcript, PHS senior registration form, PHS grading system, Postsecondary Planning Presentation, and a college timeline for sophomores.

Career services are as follows:

- 9th and 10th grades- there is a career speaker series where students can come with questions.
- 11th and 12th grades- March 1st will be the first PHS held job fair. Seniors will bring their resumes

College admissions committees evaluate applicants via (in this order):

- 1- Curriculum/course choice
- 2- Grades in courses/GPA
- 3- SAT and/or ACT scores/testing
 - a. PSATs for sophomores and juniors in fall
 - b. SATs and ACTs for juniors
 - i. SAT more questions
 - ii. ACT more science based
- 4- Student activities and leadership
 - a. 2-3 letters of recommendation from teachers and supplemental

Other interesting tidbits:

- It's never too early to get ready for college admissions!
- Schools keep track of visits to their website/virtual tours so they know you are actually interested
 - College websites contain a wealth of knowledge for what is expected for each school
 - E.g.- ave SAT scores, what courses they would like to see you take, profile of previous year's admitted class
- College essays are big!
- August 1st college applications go live
 - Great to apply early because the colleges are looking at 9th, 10th and 11th year grades/classes
- About 450 college admission reps come to PHS each year
- Dual enrollment/AP classes are wonderful in getting college credits before stepping foot on campus!
- For NCAA eligibility, there is a minimum GPA and core course requirement
 - Look to see what courses are NCAA approved
 - The 1st thing a recruiter/coach looks at is your transcript to determine eligibility!
- Mr. Roberts is at PHS every Wednesday from 3pm to 7pm. If anyone wants to come in a discuss anything his door is open!
 - Remember, he is in contact with colleges on a daily basis so he encourages everyone to use him as a resource (free of charge!)

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT:

- The school board last met on Tuesday, Jan 23rd
- Student Recognition
 - Five Parkland students were recognized for winning five out of six awards in the PPL/Geisinger Healthcare System Poster Contest that asked students to depict how health and wellness relate to energy efficiency
 - Each winner won money for themselves and money to be put towards energy savings initiatives in their schools. Parkland School District was presented a check for \$2000.
- 2018-19 General Fund Budget Presentation and Approval of ACT 1 Index
 - The board unanimously approved the resolution not to raise school district taxes for the 2018-2019 fiscal year by more than 2.4% in order to balance the budget
- The board heard reports from board committees and liaisons.

- The governor's budget was unveiled on Feb 7th. There was nothing in the budget expected to significantly help PSD.
