## **Acronyms in Education**

Education, particularly special education, incorporates a number of terms specific to the field. Because these terms are so frequently used, they are often known only in their abbreviated form. Below is a list of commonly used acronyms; some are specific to Spring Branch ISD.

AB	Adaptive Behavior – a specialized support program for students with significant behavior
	problems. Most students have an eligibility of Emotional Disturbance.
ADA	Americans with Disabilities Act is a federal law enacted in 1990 and amended in 2008.
ADHD	Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder
ADHF	Adapted Health Fitness
AIM	Autism Intervention and Management – a specialized support program for students with mild to
	moderate Autism
AI	Auditory Impairment
APPLE	Autism Program Preparing Learners for Excellence – a specialized support program for
	students with moderate to severe Autism.
APT	Achieving Positive Transition – a transition program for 18-21 year old students who have
	earned their high school credits. It is located at the West Support Center.
ARD	Admission, Review, and Dismissal – a committee made up of the parent, at least one special
	education teacher, at least one general education teacher, a representative from the school, a
	person who can interpret the implications of an evaluation and others who may have special
	expertise about the student. The ARD Committee determines eligibility, determines goals and
	objectives and makes decisions about placement and other special education services for a
	student. An ARD Committee must meet at least annually but may meet more often.

FBP	Functional Behavior Plan – includes a Functional Behavior Assessment and a Behavior

FIE	Full and Individual Evaluation
Homebound	Services provided to students in the home because the student is too ill to attend school.
ICS	In-Class Support – services provided by a special education teacher in a general education
	classroom in conjunction with the general education teacher.
