

Your child will start school READY TO LEARN when you work on these skills:

Motor Development

- Can hold a pencil and use scissors
- Has energy for class activities
- Moves with balance and control

Self-Care Skills

- Asks for help when needed
- Uses the toilet and washes hands independently
- Uses zippers
- Feeds self: opens containers and milk cartons independently
- Manages personal belongings

Cognitive Development and General Knowledge

- Recognizes and sequences numbers (1-10)
- · Identifies letters in their name
- Recites pieces of information from memory
- Recognizes simple patterns
- Recites first and last name upon request

Social and Emotional Development

- Works and plays cooperatively with peers, taking turns and sharing
- Follows two-step directions
- Expresses emotions in an appropriate manner
- Able to deal with feelings at ageappropriate level
- Has empathic response to others' feelings
- Negotiates with peers to resolve conflicts

Communication and Language Skills

- Communicates wants and needs
- Looks at pictures, then tells stories
- Uses words and drawings to express an experience
