JOB SUMMARY

Under the general supervision of the Paint/Glass Foreman, the Painter paints and maintains facilities and fixtures throughout the district.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- Prepares and paints walls (interior and exterior) and ceilings in district buildings.
- Paints floors as required, including safety zones in shop areas.
- Removes graffiti from district buildings.
- Paints school lockers, chalkboards, and other items used in the schools.
- Stripes parking lots, drivers' training ranges, high school tracks, crosswalks, playgrounds and curbs.
- Paints basketball poles and boards, tracks, soccer goals, and playgrounds.
- Finishes or refinishes cabinets, doors, furniture, and wooden bleachers (indoors and outdoors).
- Matches and tints various paints and stains.
- Patches sheetrock, cinder block and other surfaces.
- Applies body putty to casings and other metal surfaces.
- Assembles and disassembles scaffolding.
- Fabricates metal.
- Assists the glazier with glass replacement and other jobs.
- Coordinates work activities of part-time workers.
- May assist with snow removal, roof repairs, asbestos removal, sandbagging, and other maintenance tasks as assigned.
- Checks that paints and other chemicals have material safety data sheets.
- May request bids for materials and jobs.
- Completes necessary paperwork.
- Installs window coverings (blinds, drapes, curtains) and screens.
- Cuts glass and repairs glass and windows.
- Meets with administrators, vendors and contractors for planning.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- High School diploma or equivalent.
- Completion of formal apprenticeship preferred.
- Four (4) years of experience related to the above tasks, knowledge, skills and abilities or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
- Driver's license.
- Journeyman certificate preferred.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Ability to read and write and perform basic mathematical calculations.
- Knowledge of all types of paints and stains.
- Knowledge of painting and staining methods and applications.
- Ability to tint and match paints and stains.
- Knowledge of asbestos removal procedures.
- Knowledge of general safety procedures (including use of air-supplied respirator).
- Knowledge of material safety data sheets (MSDS) preferred.
- Ability to use small office equipment and computers.
- Ability to use small, medium and heavy equipment and machinery.
- Ability to maintain inventory and property.
- Ability to make budget recommendations.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Very heavy work: Exerting in excess of 100 pounds of force occasionally and/or in excess of 50 pounds of force frequently, and/or in excess of 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects. The work also requires the following physical abilities in order to perform the essential job functions: balancing, climbing, crawling, crouching, feeling, fingering, grasping, handling, hearing, kneeling, lifting, mental acuity, pulling, pushing, reaching, repetitive motion, speaking, standing, stooping, talking, visual acuity and walking.

WORKING CONDITIONS

Employees in this position work in an environment with heavy equipment and machinery that could result in bodily harm to co-workers or others.
