JOB SUMMARY

Under the general supervision of the Plumbing Foreman, the Plumber maintains building water supply and drainage systems; installs and repairs all related piping, fixtures, and appliances.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- Installs plumbing for new construction and remodels.
- Installs, repairs, and replaces building drains, sewer lines, and vents.
- Installs and repairs public restroom fixtures (sinks, toilets, showers, urinals, faucets, washbasins, etc.).
- Installs, trouble shoots and repairs commercial and residential kitchen fixtures and appliances.
- Installs and repairs gas piping and hot water heaters.
- Installs and repairs refrigerated drinking fountains.
- Repairs district plumbing systems--cutting and threading pipe, soldering copper pipe and fittings, and installing pipe repair clamps.
- Augers, cleans, and maintains drainage systems.
- Installs, adjusts, troubleshoots and repairs the following: timers, pressure regulators, valves (pneumatic, solenoid, and flushometer), and backflow preventers.
- Installs maintains and repairs interceptors/separators and grease traps.
- Maintains a repair truck and shop with material and tool inventory.
- Installs, repairs, and maintains safety fixtures and appliances.
- Inspects and conducts tests on new plumbing installations.
- Repairs domestic hot water pumps.
- May be required to assist with after-hours emergencies.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- High School diploma and four (4) or more years of trade school.
- Completion of formal apprenticeship preferred.

- Four (4) years of experience related to the above tasks, knowledge, skills and abilities or an equivalent combination of education and experience.
- Plumbing license preferred.
- Driver's license.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Ability to read, write and perform basic mathematical calculations.
- Knowledge of service, repair, remodel and new construction plumbing.
- Knowledge of plumbing code and safety procedures.
- Basic knowledge of electrical systems and electronics repair.
- Ability to install and repair piping, fixtures, and appliances.
- Ability to program temperature and timing systems.
- Ability to read blueprints.
- Knowledge of material safety data sheets (MSDS) preferred.
- Ability to use or repair small, medium and heavy equipment and machinery.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Very heavy work: Exerting in excess of 100 pounds of force occasionally and/or in excess of 50 pounds of force frequently, and/or in excess of 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects. The work also requires the following physical abilities in order to perform the essential job functions: balancing, climbing, crawling, crouching, feeling, fingering, grasping, handling, hearing, kneeling, lifting, mental acuity, pulling, pushing, reaching, repetitive motion, speaking, standing, stooping, talking, visual acuity and walking.

WORKING CONDITIONS
