TESTING START TIME(S)

- All tests will start with pre-administration promptly at the appointed hour of **7:30 a.m.** or **11:30 a.m.** unless otherwise stated on the testing schedule below.
- **STUDENTS MUST NOT BE LATE FOR THE START OF THE TEST.**
 - Please plan accordingly, as students will be required to check in with the proctor before being allowed inside the testing area.
- See AP EXAM SCHEDULE & TESTING LOCATIONS below for specific test start dates and times.

LOCATION OF EXAM(S)

- The majority of WHS AP tests will take place in the **WHS Auxiliary Gym.**
- **World Language exams** (except for Spanish Language), **Human Geography**, and **testing for students with approved accommodations** will be proctored by NSD and will be facilitated at the **Northshore District Administrative Center** unless otherwise communicated (3330 Monte Villa Parkway, Bothell, WA 98021).
- The **AP Spanish Language and Culture** and **Microeconomics** test will take place at Bothell Methodist Church (18515 92nd Ave NE, Bothell, WA 98011)
- Students approved and registered to test during the late testing window will test at the **Northshore District Office.**
- **Signs will be posted** to direct students to the testing area.

AP EXAM WINDOW ATTENDANCE POLICY

- Parents/guardians **do not need to contact the Attendance Office** to excuse their student for their student's AP Exam testing date(s).
- Parents/guardians should only call or email the Attendance Office if they receive a 6PM AutoDialer phone call/email absence notification regarding their testing student's attendance.

Students will receive an all-day school-related absence on their exam day(s). The Attendance Office has been provided with a list of students to excuse for AP Testing.

Students should talk to their teachers regarding the work missed on the day of their exam, and are welcome to attend all classes that are outside of their testing window. If they are unable to return to classes after their exam or do not attend classes prior to their exam, the absence will be marked as school-related. This will allow students the flexibility to prepare and recover from the exam, and attend the classes that cannot be missed. **Testing students who do choose to attend classes on their testing day must sign in and out at the Attendance Office.**

STRICT COLLEGE BOARD AP TESTING REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL EXAMS

1. Arrive on time for testing.
 - a. *Students who are late will not be admitted into the testing area.*
2. At your first AP exam this year, an AP Student Packet will be issued to you at the testing location. Each year students are given an AP Student Packet that includes a new, random AP Testing ID # and labels to adhere to their exam(s).
 - a. After you have received your AP Student Packet at your first test, **you will be required to bring the AP Student Packet to each subsequent test you take. Do not lose it.** You must have the AP Student Packet and AP Testing ID # labels with you for testing purposes.
 - b. *Students who do not have their AP Student Packet that includes their AP Testing ID # labels with them will not be allowed to test.*
3. You are required to bring photo ID in order to be checked into the testing area.
 - a. Students who do not have photo ID at the time of check in will not be allowed into the testing area.
4. Remain quiet during all times of testing and keep voices low during breaks.

STRICTLY PROHIBITED ITEMS - DO NOT BRING ANY OF THESE ITEMS TO TESTING

1. No caps, hats, or hoods may be worn during a test.
2. **No cell phones, Smartphones, personal digital assistants (PDAs), BlackBerry Smartphones, Bluetooth devices, MP3 players, or any other electronic or communication devices.**
3. No portable listening or recording devices.
4. No headphones, digital cameras, or any other photographic equipment.
5. No watches that beep or have an alarm.
6. No books, compasses, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes, or colored pencils.
7. No scratch paper.
8. No computers or calculators (unless otherwise accepted for Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics).
9. No reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
10. No beverages or snacks.
11. No backpacks.

ALL STUDENTS MUST BRING THE FOLLOWING TO TESTING

1. Two #2 pencils
2. Two pens (Black or Blue)
3. A photo identification card (Driver's License or WHS ASB/ID card)
4. AP Student Packet with your AP Testing ID # (provided at your first test)
5. Calculator, if needed for specific testing
6. Physics exam: Ruler or straightedge

CALCULUS AB & BC, CHEMISTRY, PHYSICS B & C, AND/OR STATISTICS EQUIPMENT NEEDED

 - Extra calculators or batteries are NOT provided by the testing proctors.
- A ruler or straightedge is required for the Physics test.
