ODYSSEY OLYMPICS:

Goal: \$20,000 +\$5,000 match

- 100% of proceeds from wristbands will go to the school.
- Money will be used for iPads (\$15,500) and Keyboards (\$2000 per cart)

DATA:

SRI TEST: Not all tested since no i-pads available or teachers trained to use the program. BOY struggle with comprehending text. Teachers worked on comprehension with students as a class and individually with a 12% increase. Huge growth. Small groups effective with the aids. Kindergarten & first grade don't always do the test due to difficulty level.

Continue to focus on concept of Math. Good at memorizing. Need more focus on the "why".

Below proficient students targeted 80/20 model receive 1:1 aides support.

Dibles: Recall testing. Not deep comprehension. Most grades 70% proficient. Speed not increase as much since teachers encouraged to work on comprehension. 4, 5, 6 grades did not get tested at BOY since program not available. Program was purchased from community counsel early this year.

CBM MATH: Not all skills addressed so scores not as well as wanted. But still shows teachers what they taught students is being comprehended. Working on comprehension of Math. Why does the problem work the way it does. Addressing Math in applicable stories. Math model will be put in place, for next year to address these areas. District is writing new programs for a portion of the grades each year available in an iPad.
